



J-1 EXCHANGE VISITOR PROGRAM GENERAL SUMMARY OF FEES AND OTHER COSTS

Estimated Program Costs

The International School of Boston (the School) will reimburse all visa fees, including the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) fee, for our J-1 visa holders. J1 exchange visitors will be required to pay for the following fees, whenever applicable:

Exchange participants will not be required to obtain local teaching certification or pass any teaching equivalency exam. The School is a union-free workplace; union dues will not apply. The School will cover costs associated with translating transcripts and/or degrees, as applicable. The following onboarding costs may apply: Summary of criminal record from home country or last country of residence: \$0 - \$100.

The School does not work with or is associated with any domestic or foreign third parties.

Payroll Deductions

Salary in the United States of America is subject to Federal and State income taxes and withholdings, and Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) Deductions. Based on the country of citizenship of the J-1 visa holder, one may be eligible for certain tax treaty benefits.

If exempt of taxes due to certain tax treaty benefits (such as French Citizens on first visa J1 – exceptions may apply), withholding rates will be as follows:

Massachusetts Paid Family Medical Leave is a mandatory insurance that provides eligible individuals with up to 26 weeks of combined family and medical leave per benefit year. This is insurance that is funded through payroll deductions. In 2024, the employee contribution will be 0.46% of an employee's gross wages each pay period.

In addition, exchange participants may voluntarily decide to participate in the School's retirement plan. The School will match contributions dollar for dollar up to 5% of gross income after one year of employment with the School.

Monthly Expenses

The following monthly expenses are estimates of monthly costs a J-1 Visa Holder can expect to pay while in the Cambridge/Arlington and surrounding areas; these estimates are based on one person (no family member) and may vary based on lifestyle choices:

Childcare & schooling	Daycare centers: \$2,000 and up per month. Private nannies rate starts from \$22 per hour. Children of full-time School’s employees, including J1 visa holders, who wish to have their J-2 dependent child to attend our school, are eligible for need-based financial aid. Additionally, J2-dependent children can be enrolled for free in the local K-12 public school systems

Cross-Cultural Activity Component

Exchange teachers must have a letter from the head of a school in another country, preferably that teacher’s home country, which states that school’s willingness to work with the exchange teacher on the cross-cultural activity component.

Exchange teachers will be required to complete, within the United States, and during each academic year of program participation, at least one cross-cultural activity from each of the following two categories:

- (i) An activity for the teacher's classroom, larger host school or host school district population, or the community at large designed to give an overview of the history, traditions, heritage, culture, economy, educational system and/or other attributes of his or her home country.;
and
- (ii) An activity that involves U.S. student dialogue with schools or students in another country, preferably in the exchange teacher's home school, through virtual exchange or other means, in order to supplement the goals of the in-person exchange.
