MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

December 4, 2017

The Montgomery County Board of Education convened in its regular monthly meeting on Monday, December 4, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. Board members present were Steven W. DeBerry – Chair, Tommy Blake – Vice Chair, Jesse Hill, Bryan Dozier, Ann Long, Tommy Blake, Sandra Miller and Shirley Threadgill.

Chairman DeBerry called the meeting to order and moved to adopt the agenda as shown. Ann Long made the motion with Tommy Blake seconding. The agenda was accepted with unanimous approval from the board.

Chairman DeBerry opened by reading a devotional on the Christmas season. He reminded us to think about giving and not receiving, to appreciate your friends and family, to be kind and gentle and to apologize when you are wrong.

Page Street students Georgia Dennis and Elaina Goforth led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Chairman DeBerry turned the meeting over to board attorney, Max Garner to elect officers for the year ending 2018. Mr. Garner asked for nominees for board chair for the upcoming year. Bryan Dozier nominated Steve DeBerry, while Shirley Threadgill seconded. All board members agreed. Ann Long nominated Tommy Blake as Co-chair. Bryan Dozier seconded the nomination with unanimous approval from the board.

Dr. Ellis and Principal Teresa Dunn recognized Page Street Elementary Employees of the Month. Christy Shepherd, Media Specialist, is the classified employee while Allison Vanness, Teacher, is the certified employee. Mrs. Dunn described both as wonderful employees and as team players, adding she is blessed to have them both at Page Street.

Dr. Ellis presented Chief Finance Officer Mitch Taylor and finance employees Lisa Ritter and Donna Morris with three awards. They include the NCDPI Excellence in Management of the Public School Fund award, the Government Finance Officers Association Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting and the Association of School Business Officials International CAFR for 2017-18. Superintendent Ellis stated that out of one hundred and fifteen school systems in North Carolina, only twelve get all three awards. This is the seventh year in a row the finance office has received these awards. Finance employees Michelle Brady and Cheryl Kime were not able to attend.

Next, Superintendent Ellis presented retirement certificates to Beth Lancaster and Tim Addis, who retired last month. Dr. Ellis thanked them for their many years of service to Montgomery County Schools and our students.

Dr. Ellis called on Dr. Pokie Noland to present the 2017 Exceptional Children Educator of the Year award to Stephanie Ross. Ms. Ross was voted on by her peers and represented MCS at the Exceptional Children Conference in Greensboro. She is a teacher at East Middle School.

Dr. Ellis and April Britt (standing in for Linda Annundson), presented West Montgomery Beta Club students certificates. Angelina Soulasinh won the John W. Harris Leadership award and was one of five students nationwide to attend the Leadership Conference in Washington, DC. Samantha Cranford and Teal Rose placed third nationally in the Trading Pin competition. Allison Weaver, Maggie Pipkin, Liz Loflin and Caitlin Singleton placed fourth in the Website Design category.

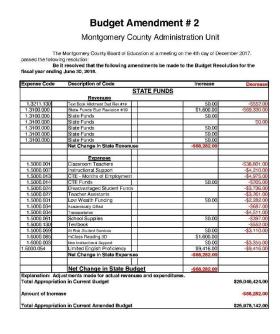

Page Street teachers Julie Davis, Lane Prince, Jennifer Nance and Allison Vanness presented a power point on the Third Grade Biography Breakfast. Students chose a historical figure to research. Students then used graphic organizers to plan their presentation. Students made "Fakebook" pages and power points of their character. At the Biography Breakfast, students dressed as their historical figure. Teachers said the breakfast was a success with around one hundred parents attending. Teachers selected a few students to attend the board meeting to read their presentations dressed as the character they chose to research.

Dr. Ellis presented for approval the Class Size Reduction Resolution, requesting that the General Assembly phase in the K-3 class size reductions over multiple years. Although smaller class sizes are a good thing for students, it creates issues for schools systems who have no space to add classrooms and with the teacher shortage, the probability of finding certified teachers to

fill them could also pose a problem. Superintendent Ellis stated that the resolution might not help; however, the school system has to try. Sandra Miller made the motion to approve the resolution with Ann Long seconding the motion. The board approved the resolution unanimously.

Next, Dr. Ellis asked the board to approve a Class Size Waiver form to be submitted to NCDPI. The waiver requests class size restrictions for Visual Arts in the kindergarten class for the remainder of the school year. Ann Long approved the request with Sandra Miller seconding.

Superintendent Ellis requested that the Career and Technical Center be named after Joseph Reese Blair. Dr. Ellis said, "Mr. Blair donated the land for the project, so it is only fitting that we name it after him." Sandra Miller made the motion to approve the request, while Ann Long seconded the motion.

Dr. Lancaster presented policies for approval. These policies were presented for review at the December board meeting. Policies numbers are 1310, 1510, 4002, 4200, 7270, 1800, 2310, 2400, 2670, 3000, 3100, 3110, 3220, 3203, 7330, 3300, 3460, 3530, 3540, 3620, 4040, 7310, 4155, 4240, 7312, 4600, 6321, 6340, 6420, 6430, 6440, 6442, 6450, 6520, 6560, 7130, 7240, 7510, 7530, 7810, 7900, 7930, 7940, 8210, 8510, 9110, 9115, 9120 and 9440. Tommy Blake approved the policy changes and Ann Long seconded.

During *Superintendent Remarks*, Dr. Ellis reminded the board of the wonderful presentation from the kids at Page Street. He stated that he hears complaints about the technology fees and the One to One Initiative, but those kids will remember their projects because they did the research on a computer. What worked for the parents, will not work for our kids. Dr. Ellis said, "I get questions about the facility projects, including "why build?" and "why put two schools together?". The answer to both questions is to give students the very best opportunities our county can offer, and with the help of MCC and the Commissioners, we are on the right track". Dr. Ellis said he appreciates the joint effort of all parties involved. "There will be struggles and issues, but we will keep the project moving forward for our students".

Chairman DeBerry then asked for a motion to go into closed session to discuss personnel. Bryan Dozier asked for the motion, with Jesse Hill seconding. The board approved entering into closed session unanimously.

After returning from closed session, Chairman DeBerry asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. With a motion by Bryan Dozier and a second by Shirley Threadgill, the meeting was duly adjourned.
