Dear Parent/Guardian,

Dentzler Elementary is a Title I school. To promote shared responsibility for student performance, Title I schools must develop a **School-Parent Compact**. PARMA CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT GOALS

- By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 100% of our educators will implement our "Elevating the Essentials" instructional playbook to teach board-adopted curriculum resources which are aligned with Ohio Department of Education and Workforce standards. This focus will produce a 5% increase in OST data, 5% increase in benchmark data (Fall 2024 to Spring 2025), and a 3% increase in graduation rates.
- By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 100% of our educators will incorporate daily read, write, and discuss prompts connected to authentic literacy strategies to producer a 5% increase in OST data, 5% increase in benchmark data (Fall 2024 to Spring 2025), and a 5% increase in graduation rate.
- By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 100% of our educators will utilize assessments (and whenever possible, common assessments) connected to ODEW standards and will adjust instruction to meet the needs of diverse learners as measured by a 5% increase in OST data, 5% increase in benchmark data (Fall 2023 to Spring 2024), and a 3% increase in graduation rate.
