MINUTES OF THE REGULAR PUBLIC MEETING HELD JUNE 23, 2021

The regular public meeting of the Board of Education of the Vocational Schools in the County of Middlesex was held 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 23, 2021 at the East Brunswick School.

Mr. Jones presided and made the following announcement regarding the "Sunshine Law."


