MINUTES OF THE REGULAR PUBLIC MEETING HELD FEBRUARY 12, 2020

The regular public meeting of the Board of Education of the Vocational Schools in the County of Middlesex was held 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 12, 2020 at the East Brunswick School.

GOVERNOR PHIL MURPHY VISITS THE EAST BRUNSWICK CAMPUS

The East Brunswick Campus hosted Governor Phil Murphy, Freeholder Director Rios and members of the Governor's Cabinet on January 15<sup>th</sup>. The Governor toured the Pre-engineering and Advanced Manufacturing Classroom, and participated in a lesson, where teacher Stephen Mercadante and his students demonstrated an array of projects and equipment.

The Governor and students used a ShopBot CNC machine to engrave a plaque with "Jobs NJ," the name of a new initiative the Governor announced at a standing-room-only press conference, where he was introduced by MCVTS Superintendent of Schools Dianne Veilleux. The Governor placed the plaque on the podium as he spoke.

MCVTS OUTSTANDING ACTIVITIES – HIGHLIGHTS

The Superintendent is reporting highlights of recent district-wide school/student activities that have occurred this month. These activities involve career, college, community, and business collaboration with various partners to enhance the students' educational programs.

Academy of Allied Health and Biomedical Sciences

- CTE Director Sean McDonald and sophomores Pratham Bhatt and Divit Endal traveled to Anaheim, CA on January 31<sup>st</sup> for the Project Lead the Way Summit. The students won the National Design Championship last spring and were asked to present their Artificial Photosynthesis system design to the entire conference. The students and teacher Kathleen Wilhelmy and administrators met in virtual conference call meetings in the fall to prepare the presentation with PLTW staff. The students surprised the sponsors from Chevron and PLTW during the conference calls with a new virtual model of their design that vastly improved their concept and PowerPoint.
- The Fall Career Choices program wrapped up January 31<sup>st</sup>. All eighth-grade students received certificates from their teachers and Michael Sullivan, assistant principal, and watched a slideshow of the highlights of their time exploring Construction Technology, Culinary Arts, and Digital Media. Approximately 180 students participated in the fall morning and afternoon shared-time learning program, rotating through the three shops.
- On January 17<sup>th</sup>, Mike Sullivan hosted the annual Career Choices Counselor Day. There were approximately 30 CST members, guidance counselors, and others from multiple sending districts in attendance. In addition, we were joined by three in-district CST members from East Brunswick and Piscataway. Among the districts that attended were New Brunswick, Perth Amboy, Monroe, Woodbridge, Edison, North Brunswick, South River, South Amboy, Sayreville, and Old Bridge. Students from all shops participated by providing shop tours, delivering presentations, preparing refreshments and serving attendees.
- Philip Krotenok, senior, has been awarded a prestigious Horatio Alger Scholarship. The Horatio Alger Association assists students "who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives." It seeks to recognize "academic achievement or leadership potential" among students "who have exhibited determination, integrity, and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need." As a Horatio Alger National Scholar, Philip will be awarded a \$25,000 scholarship and a number of other benefits.

Academy for Science, Mathematics, and Engineering Technologies

- MCA Cybersecurity invited Mizba Tawa from the Information Systems Audit and Control Association (ISACA), Ms. Niloufer Tamboly and Mr. Sanjeev Dayal from the International Information Systems Security Certification Consortium (ISC<sup>2</sup>) New Jersey board to share with our juniors and seniors how to establish a secure online profile in business, on various public platforms such as social media and while gaming. Our presenters shared case studies, incidents from their own experiences and discussed careers in cybersecurity. The guest speakers highlighted how all cybercrime relates back to the basics – strong passwords and secure webpages.

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MCVTS OUTSTANDING ACTIVITIES – HIGHLIGHTS (continued)

- Congressman Frank Pallone Jr. of the 6th Congressional District presented Adhya Khare and Serena Zeng with the Congressional App Challenge Award. Their app tracks the location of school buses and is intended for use by students, parents, school districts and bus companies. Congressman Pallone spoke about the importance of STEM education in the United States and engineering jobs in politics, and answered various student questions about his initiatives in Congress.
- Sruthi Suresh and Dhyanashri Ramen received the Presidential Volunteer Service Award. Dhyanashri and Sruthi received a certificate, a letter from the president and a Gold Medal for their countless hours of community service.
- Adrija Kundu, Shreya Jangada, Varija Mehta, Parth Harish, Dhyanashri Raman and Shivam Syal were selected as members of Congressman Frank Pallone Jr.'s Youth Advisory Council for the 6th Congressional District. Section 2. The Board of Education hereby authorizes, approves and/or ratifies, as the case may be, the publication of the notice of the Request for Bids in accordance with the requirements of the Public School Contracts Law in order to prepare for the proposed transaction.

Section 3. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary is authorized to award the bid and the Lease to the lowest bidder in accordance with the Request for Bids and the bid proposals submitted to the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, which winning bid proposal will be retained on file in the Business Administrator/Board Secretary's office. The Purchaser's interest rate will be held fixed for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of the bid or such other time frame recommended by the Financial Advisor and set forth in the Request for Bids. If the closing does not occur within the fixed time frame from the date of the bid, the interest rate will be calculated in accordance with the index rate established by the Financial Advisor and set forth in the Request for Bids.

Section 4. The Board President, the Superintendent and/or the Business Administrator/Board Secretary are hereby authorized to negotiate, execute and deliver, subject to the review of Special Counsel, the Lease, an agent or an escrow agreement, an assignment agreement, if necessary, and such other documents as may be necessary to consummate the transaction. The Board of Education authorizes the Business Administrator/Board Secretary to establish an escrow account for the deposit of the lease proceeds and to direct the deposit and investment of the lease proceeds in the escrow for the construction period in accordance with the requirements of law. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary is also authorized to pay any agreed upon fees of the escrow agent and others necessary for the financing. The Board President and/or the Business Administrator/Board Secretary are also authorized and directed to take on behalf of the Board of Education such other actions as shall be necessary and appropriate to accomplish the lease purchase financing for the Energy Conservation Measures and the Equipment in accordance with the terms of the Lease and this resolution and pursuant to the terms of the agreements and instruments authorized to be prepared hereby and to accomplish the performance of the obligations of the Board of Education in respect thereto. The obligations of the School District shall not constitute indebtedness of the School District, the County of Middlesex or of any department, agency or political subdivision thereof. The Lease shall set forth the term of the Lease, the rental payments to be paid by the Board of Education in respect thereof, the dates on which such rent shall be due and payable and all other terms and conditions thereof.

The Board of Education hereby reaffirms and ratifies its determination that the energy savings generated from reduced energy use from the Energy Conservation Measures set for in the Energy Savings Plan will be sufficient to cover the cost of the program's Energy Conservation Measures, that it is in the best interest of the School District to implement the Energy Savings plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.6 and that it reaffirms and ratifies its approval of the Energy Savings Plan in the form submitted to and approved by the BPU.

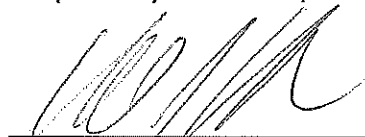
