The regular public meeting of the Board of Education of the Vocational Schools in the County of Middlesex was held 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, October 10, 2018 at the East Brunswick School.

MCVTS OUTSTANDING ACTIVITIES – HIGHLIGHTS

The Superintendent is reporting highlights of recent district-wide school/student activities that have occurred since the last Board of Education Meeting. These activities involve career, college, community, and business collaboration with various partners to enhance the students' educational programs.

Academy for Allied Health and Biomedical Sciences

- The homerooms were challenged to create the best mini Public Service Announcement for the Academy. The students put their all into the challenge and approximately 10 3-to-5-minute videos were submitted. The top three videos are being loaded on the school's website.
- The Career Choices program students of the month for September are John Bakos for Construction Technology AM, Luis Velasco for Digital Media Technology AM, and Omar Rojas for Food and Health Technology AM. In the afternoon, the students recognized are Isabella Marquez for Construction Technology PM, Naseem McCleod for Digital Media Technology PM, and Ryan Ferraro for Food and Health Technology PM. Mr. Sullivan and the Career Choices teachers were very proud of the attitude and work ethic demonstrated by these students.
- Club Day clubs were formed and focus on Arts Integration and Stress Relief Activities. Students will be given 1 hour, once a month to meet in these clubs with teachers who proposed the clubs and will oversee the activities.
- Parent Night was held on Thursday, September 27, 2018. We had approximately 600 guests in attendance, including approximately 30 guests in Career Choices. We had our annual college fair, which featured approximately 20 college representative and military reps, several club information tables, including HOSA accepting memberships and selling Woodbridge Academy lab coats, Red Cross Club, raising money for Hurricane Relief, class councils selling refreshments, PTA membership and information, and teacher presentations. Everything flowed exceedingly well and the administration had to usher the final guests out of the building well past 9:30 p.m.
- HOSA Future Health Professionals launched its membership drive and collected dues from 200 students. The importance of belonging to a Career Technical Student Organization linked to the Academy's themes is not lost on the students. They hope to send leadership to the Fall Leadership Conference and then prepare for regionals, state, and national competitions and conference.
- Woodbridge Academy was proud to announce that 19 students received recognition in the 2019 National Merit Scholarship Program. Five students were named Semi Finalists and 14 were selected as Commended Scholars. Approximately 1.6 million juniors take the PSAT and undergo an initial screening. The recognized students stand out among the slightly more than 30,000 top scoring students. About 16,000 students become Semi-Finalists and have a lengthy screening process involving character, grades, leadership and essay writing. There are about 7,500 scholarships available for the Finalists. The Semi Finalists are Aashna Mehta, Sanjit Menon, Anisha Patel, Yash Patel, and Lakshay Sood.

- The 2018 Woodbridge Academy soccer team is experiencing its best start to a season that they have ever had, according to Coach Scott Modzelewski. The Hornets are currently 4-1 and first place in the GMC Silver Division! One sophomore, Shivam Patel, is dominating offensively with 8 goals in 5 games, while Sophomore Goalkeeper, Anish Batta, has over 40 saves in his first year at the Varsity level. The team is extremely motivated and focused, with the leadership of Captains Darshan Patel and Sathya Rameshkumar, and strong performances from Chloe Jacques, Sanjit Menon, Shraven Subramanian, and Nikhil Azhagiri. The Junior Varsity program continues to compete at a high level and is planning on competing in the County JV Tournament for the second year in a row. "Our student-athletes are excited and working together great thus far. We are optimistic for the remainder of the season." Coach Modzelewski said.

Academy for Science, Mathematics and Engineering Technologies

- From September 1st to 8th, Akhil Maheshwary travelled to the Russian Federation to take part in the 3rd International Olympiad of Metropolises in Moscow. HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

The Superintendent is reporting that the district is celebrating Hispanic Heritage month from September 15, 2018 – October 15, 2018. The following activities are taking place in our schools:

Academy for Science, Mathematics and Engineering Technologies

During this month, the Spanish Honor Society hosted a ceremony honoring Richard Rodriguez, a Port Authority police officer and alumnus of the East Brunswick campus, who died on September 11th, evacuating people from the Twin Towers. Sophomores, led by the Social Studies teacher, Mr. Price, will make daily announcements about contributions made by famous Hispanic Americans.

Academy for Allied Health and Biomedical Sciences

In honor of Hispanic Heritage Month, Ms. Cohen's classes are working on a project about Latino America countries. Each group have chosen a country to search all the information about culture, history, location, tradition, celebration, and any other information could be useful for the presentation. The second week of October the students will celebrate with food, drink, and music the end of the Hispanic Heritage month. Mr. Nava's Spanish II students will research Hispanic dances and will create videos which will teach the history of Hispanic dances and they will demonstrate the dance moves. Mr. Nava's Spanish III and AP classes will work in groups to research typical food from different Hispanic countries. They will research the origin of one dish, how it is made, the ingredients used, and on what occasions they would serve it. The students will make oral presentations in Spanish describing and presenting the dish. At the end of the week, students will write a review.

East Brunswick Campus

Ms. Carcamo-Zeidman reports that in her Spanish III students began Hispanic Heritage Month by celebrating the independence of 5 Central American Countries. In Spanish II and Spanish I students will read about the population of Palenque, an Afro-Caribbean community in Colombia which was the first community of free former slaves in the Americas. While learning about Palenque, the students will read about the techniques used by the women in the community to create braids that serves as maps for slaves freeing into Palenque. They will watch a music video of Kombalisa Mi, a group that uses Palenque language and a mix of Colombian and African sounds. Ms. Vega's students will read two folk tales: "El Dia que Nevo Tortillas" (Spanish I) and "Pedro y el Diablo" (Spanish II). Students read an article called: A Thank You letter to Abuela Isabel which shows the importance and acknowledgement of heritage. Students will pick a Hispanic city to adopt. They will research that city and bring in articles, fun facts, and pictures to create a collage or an album of that city. In Spanish II Puerto Rico's history, the people and their contributions to the Hispanic community in America will be discussed.

Perth Amboy Campus

Ms. DiVincenzo will collaborate with Ms. Forsman in the Library to strengthen the students' research skills as they find information on key figures in the Hispanic community. Students will have to access credible sources, such as databases accessed through EBSCO host. Students will provide citations for their work in APA or MLA format. In order to celebrate Hispanic Heritage, all classes will be researching typical foods served in various Spanish-speaking countries. Students will be placed in groups and each group will create a poster that represents typical foods in a specific Spanish-speaking country.

Piscataway Campus

Ms. Tencio reports that her Spanish 2 students are researching countries and creating a "Travel Guide". They are working in groups and the groups are competing against each other. They need to be persuasive and convince the class to travel to their assigned country.


