## It's Time to Reenroll

Reenrollment season has begun and its never been more critical than it is this year. With JPII currently near capacity, and new student applications already running well ahead of last year, we will not have room for all those who wish to attend next year. Current  $6^{th} - 11^{th}$  graders must reenroll by February 1 to secure their spot. To date, 50 students out of 352 eligible have already reenrolled (14%). News student applications are already at 43 in process as compared to 27 at this point last year. Once February 1<sup>st</sup> rolls around these new students will be accepted. At that point, it will be first deposit first enrolled until the school is full. Don't delay, enroll today. A reenrollment was sent out earlier this month with instructions. A \$500 non-refundable deposit is required. 
#### How You Can Share the Good News:

Quinn Doran won 3 games and had a fourth end in a draw while his brother Gavin won 2 games and had a third end in a draw.
