# Summary of District Parent Advisory Council (PAC) meeting, Nov. 7

- The Pittsburgh Good Food Coalition is working to ensure that large, publicly-funded institutions with spending power reflect community values through their food purchasing standards.

### Why Pittsburgh Public Schools

- Structures for student + parent engagement
- Relationship and support from PPS Food Service Department
- Regional impact of a large school district
- PPS Food Service generally operates on an \$18M budget, much of it generated by federal/state meal reimbursement

- The Good Food Purchasing Program is a commitment to these values:
- Equity, accountability, and transparency
  - Create a more equitable, accountable, and transparent food system
- Nutrition
  - Promote health and well-being by offering healthy foods (fruits and vegetables, using whole grains, reducing salt and added sugars)
- Environmental sustainability
  - Promote climate-friendly diets and incentivize sustainable practices that build healthy ecosystems
- Valued workforce
  - Provide safe and healthy working conditions for all food chain workers and producers
- Local economies
  - Support agricultural and process operators within the local area or region
- Animal welfare
  - Provide healthy and humane care for livestock

  - Board vote end of October 2021 GFPP passed!
- Obtain funding for assessment 2022/2023
  - o PFPC + PPS awarded USDA Regional Food Systems Partnership grant
- Baseline Assessment Kick-off June 2024
  - Center for Good Food Purchasing
  - o Public support for transparency and accountability
- Annual updates & goal setting 2024
  - o Community participation, public reports, relationship-building
