#### FAFSA

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is on track to be released by December 1, 2024.

Below are some updates to make navigating financial aid season as easy as possible!

#### **Financial Aid Information Sessions**

One of the best ways for students and families to get familiar with the financial aid process is to attend one of FAME's Financial Aid Information sessions. PLEASE consider signing you and your Parent/Guardian up for a Virtual FAFSA Help Session offered by FAME (Finance Authority of Maine).

#### FSA ID Creation-

Now is the time to create their Federal Student Aid accounts (FSA IDs) at StudentAid.gov. Individuals should create their FSA IDs before the release of the FAFSA so that their demographic information can be matched with the Social Security Administration. This is what allows federal tax information to be transferred from the IRS, making FAFSA completion much easier!

Federal Student Aid just released the "<u>parent wizard</u>" to help families determine which parents' information is required on the FAFSA and which parent(s) needs to log into the FAFSA with their FSA ID.

### **Mitchell Scholarship**

On December 1, we will open the Mitchell Scholarship application here: www.mitchellinstitute.org/scholarship/ . As some of you may know, that's a month earlier than usual – and you can learn more about the change on our update page.

Our hope is that students can now open the application while working on college applications, and perhaps even finish the application over winter break. We also have a new series of videos designed to help them work through



the application with ease and clarity.

A few key details for you and your students: The deadline to submit the online application is March 1.

The completed application, transcript, recommendation letter, and the FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) will be due by March 1. Copies of the college acceptance and financial aid information will be due, if available, by April 1. The Mitchell Scholarship is \$10,000.

We will award at least one scholarship at every public Maine high school – yes, your school may have more than one Mitchell Scholar!

Students are eligible to apply if they are planning to pursue a two-year or four-year degree program at an accredited college or university (in or out of Maine).

Mitchell Scholars also have access to additional funding, signature events, ongoing advising, and a community of over 600 fellow Scholars and 3,000 Alumni.



#### **College Speaker Series**

This is a Virtual Zoom presentation during our regularly scheduled advisory time at 1:00-1:50 provided by an admissions counselor from the respective school as a way to share more about majors, residential life, applications, and more. Students may join the session through the Zoom link (provided on their Brightspace calendar for the day). Any student that is not 12th grade advisory or is absent on that day will still receive recordings and follow up information after each session.

Are you a strong student looking for a challenge? Are you interested in taking a college class for FREE in the Spring 2025 semester? If so, please talk this over with your Learning Coach and Mrs. Tyler and read all the information below carefully.

- Students with at least a 2.7 GPA are eligible.
- Tuition is FREE and MEVA covers the cost of books!
- You get college credit and high school credit!
- These are college classes taught by college professors either online or in person at the college campus.
- You may register for courses at any Maine Community College or University of Maine College.
- Important note: Students taking college courses must access help independently and regularly check their grades. The college professors will typically offer help sessions and there is tutoring available. When you enroll in a college course all communication goes directly to you, not to MEVA or your parent/learning coach so it is important to be responsible and aware of this.
- Students typically begin with one course for their first college course experience.
- Do you have an IEP or 504? You will need to contact Disability Services at the college.
- You must apply at least two weeks before the course begins. No exceptions to this.
