- Universal Screener

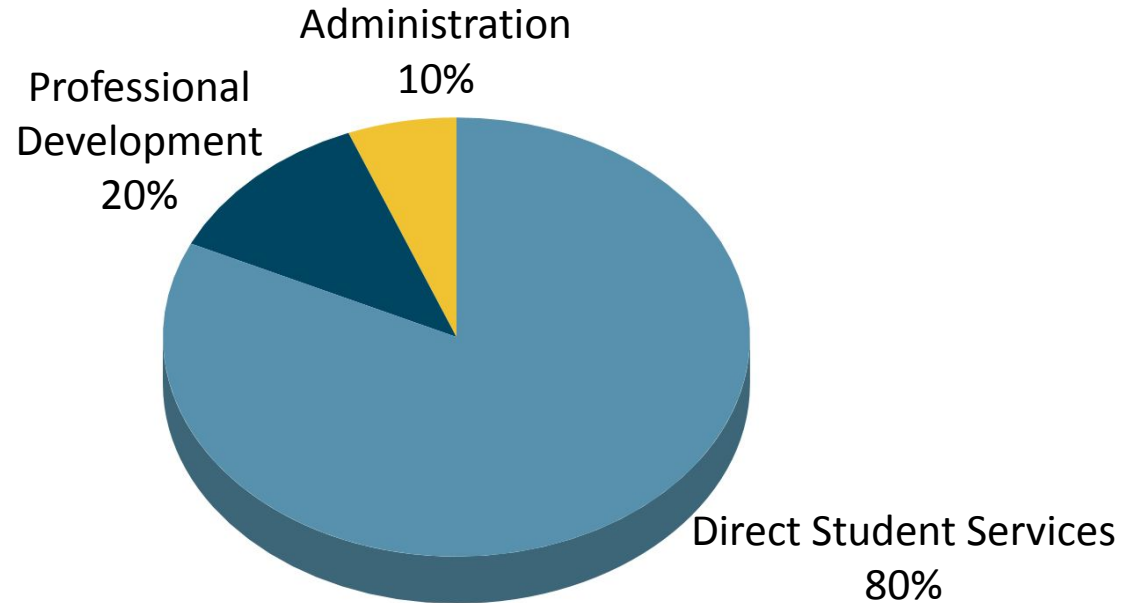

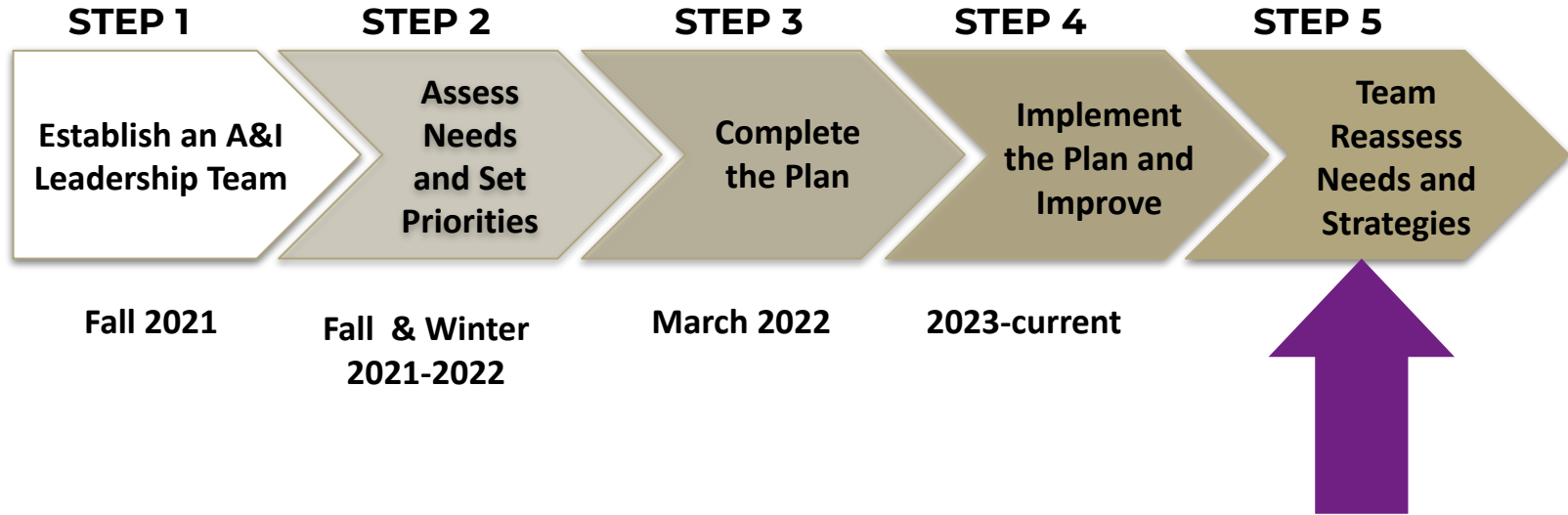

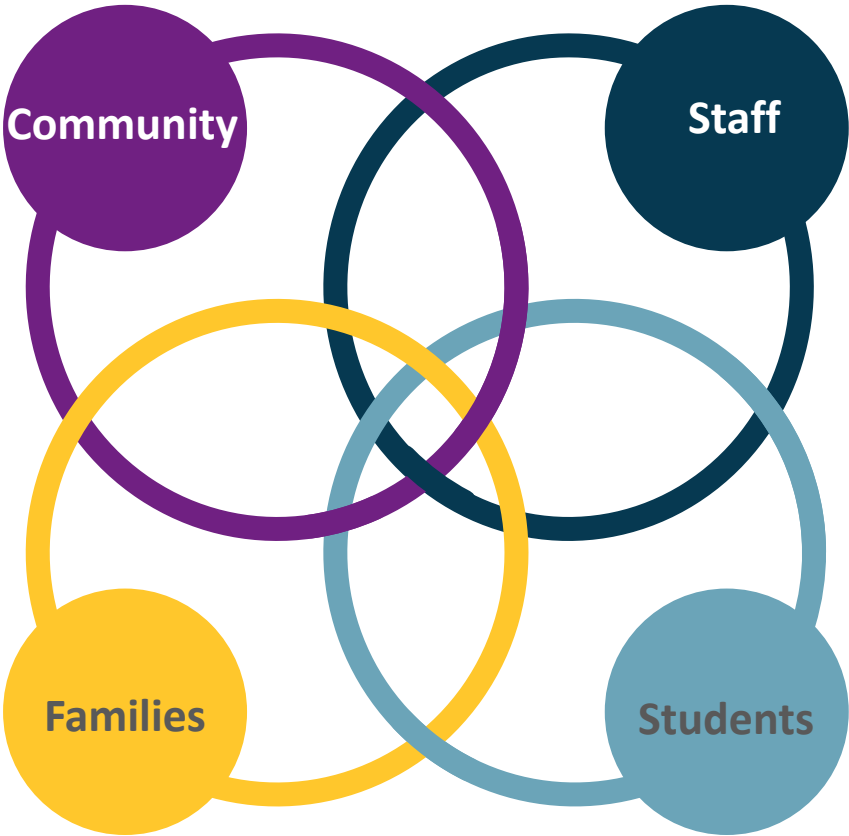
Achievement & Integration Spending by Category

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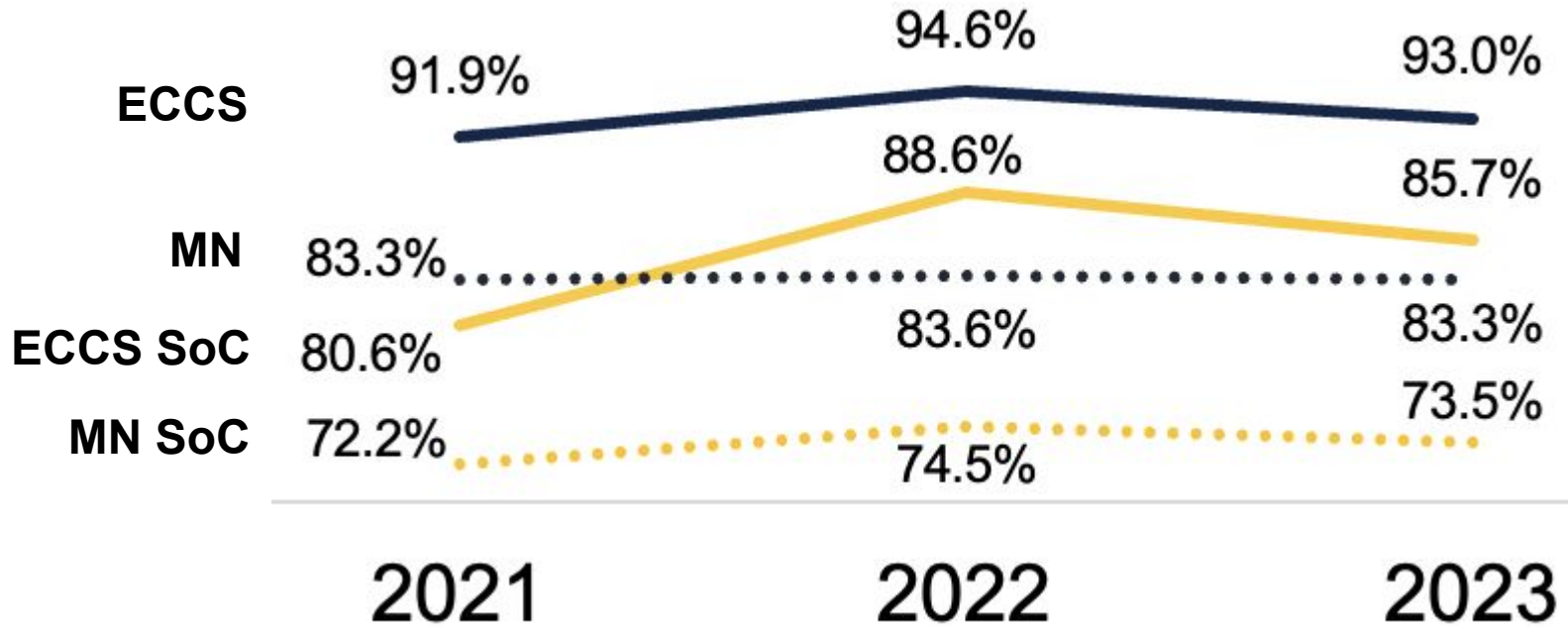
All Students Graduate

2026 Goal:

The 4-year graduation rate for Students of Color will increase by 3 percentage points from 80.6% in 2021 to 83.6% by 2026 while maintaining an overall average 4-year graduation rate of 90% or greater.

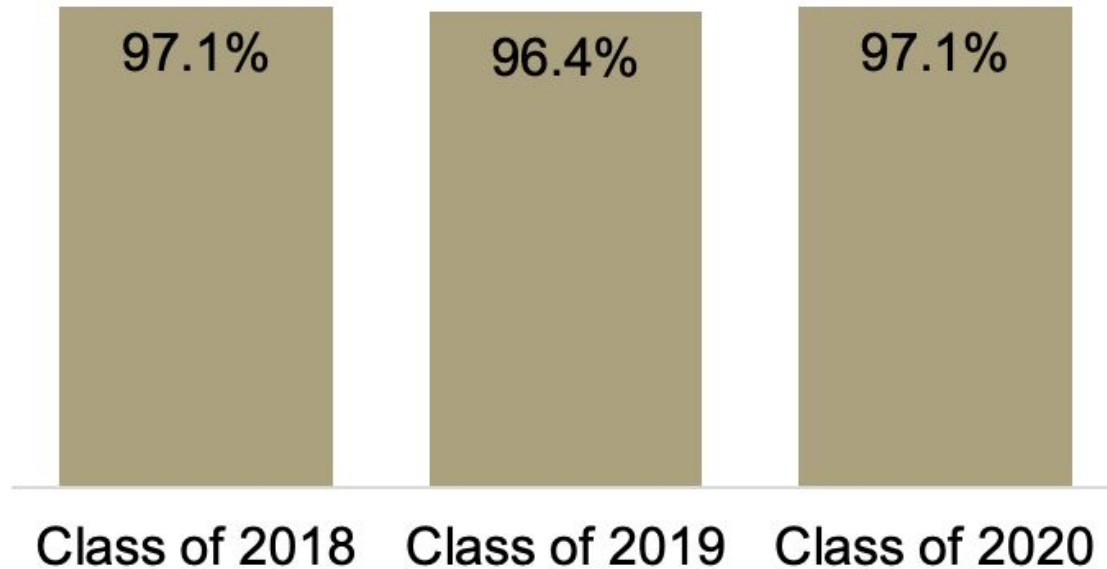


All Students Graduate

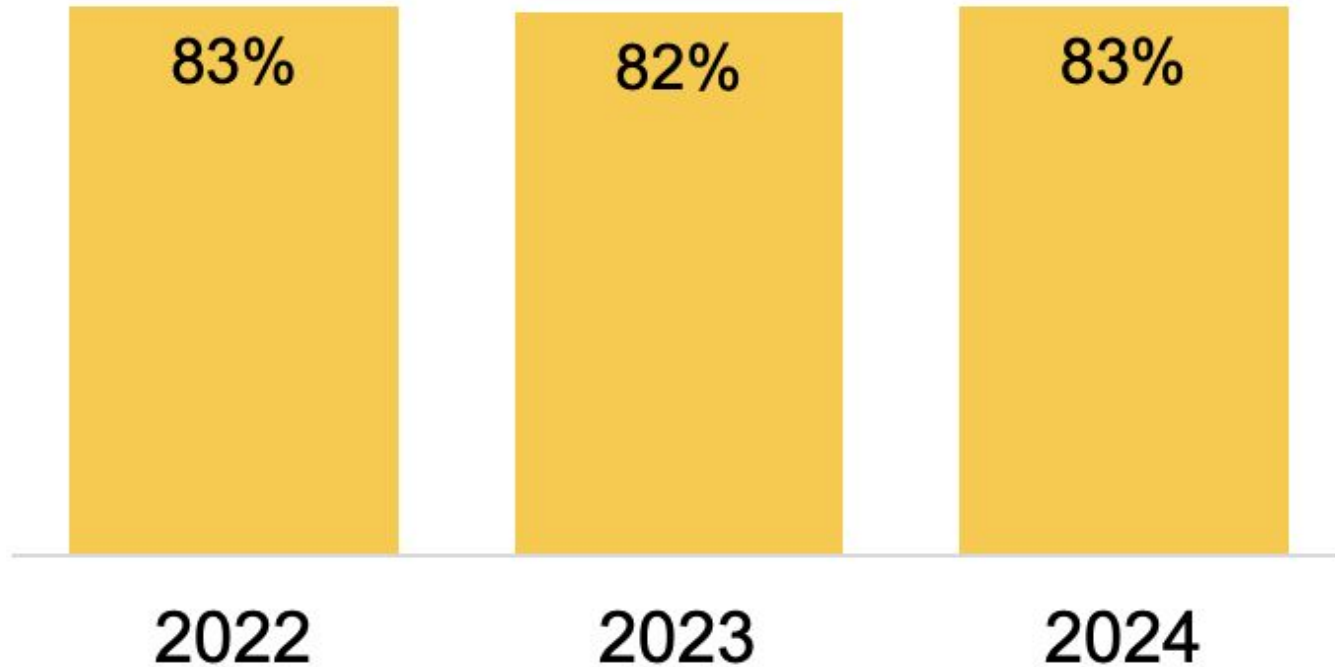


2024-2026 Goal:

The percentage of students on track for graduation at end of 9th grade will increase by 3 percentage points from 83% in 2022 to 86% in 2025.

- Teaching & Learning walkthroughs with feedback (support from district to building)

2026 Goal:

The failure rate of first semester for economically disadvantaged students and students of color in grade 9 will decrease from 14% in school year 2023-2024 to 10% or less in the first semester of school year 2025-2026.

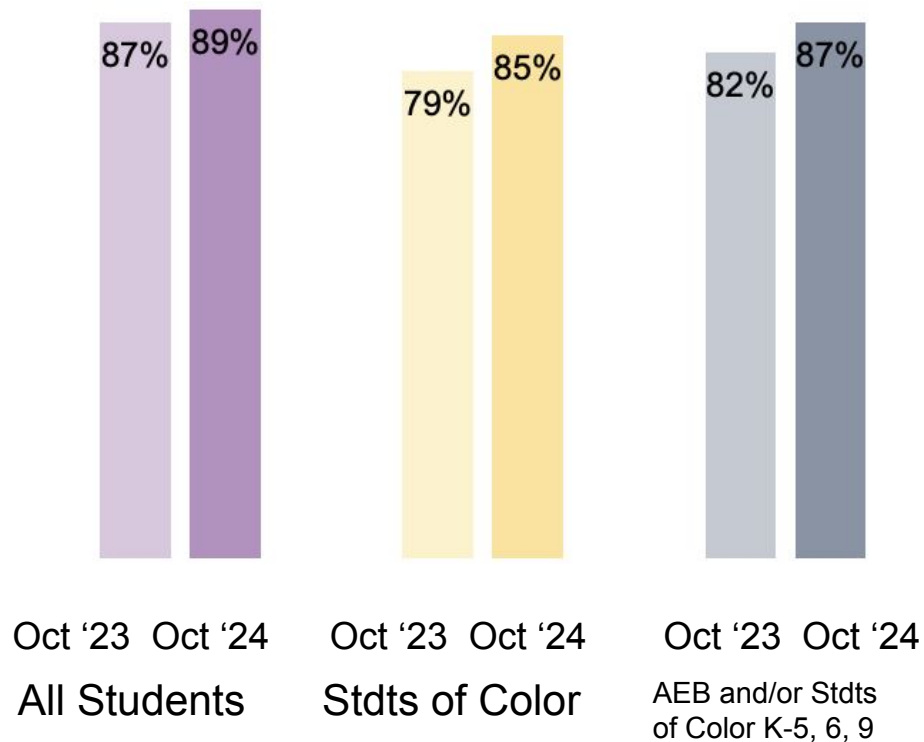
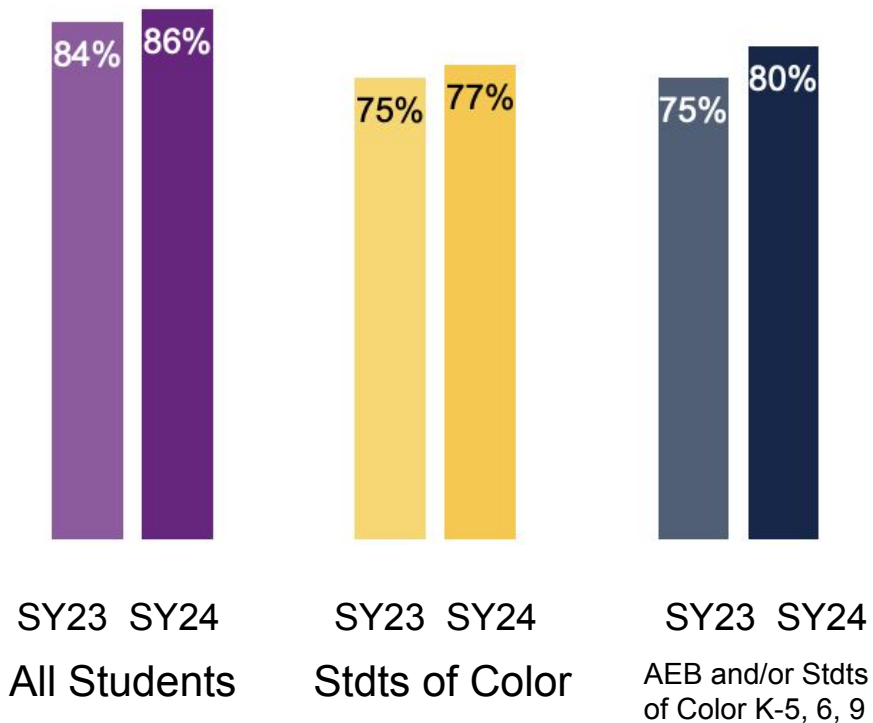
2024-2026 Goal:

The percentage of economically disadvantaged students and/or students of color in kindergarten through grade 5, grade 6 and grade 9 with a consistent attendance rate of more than 90% will increase from 75% at the end of school year 2023 to 80% at the end of school year 2025 as measured by the SIS attendance rate in eduClimber.

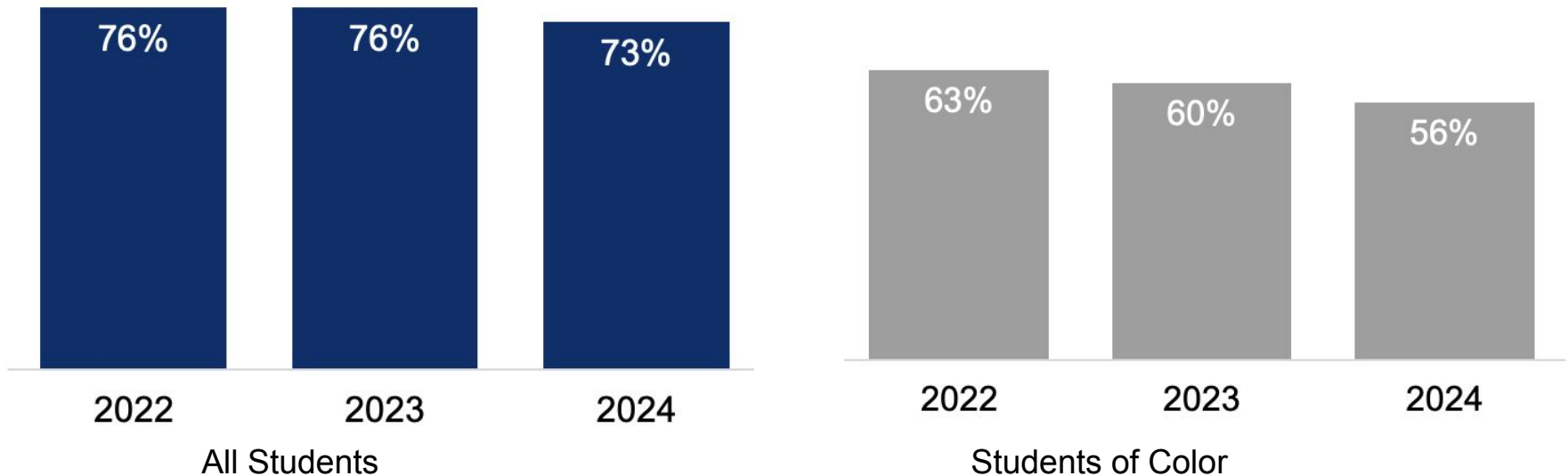
2025 Goal:

The percentage of Students of Color scoring in the proficient categories on the FastBridge aReading assessment at the end of grades 2-5 will increase by at least 3 percentage points from 63% in 2022 to 66% by 2025, while maintaining an overall proficiency rate of at least 75%.

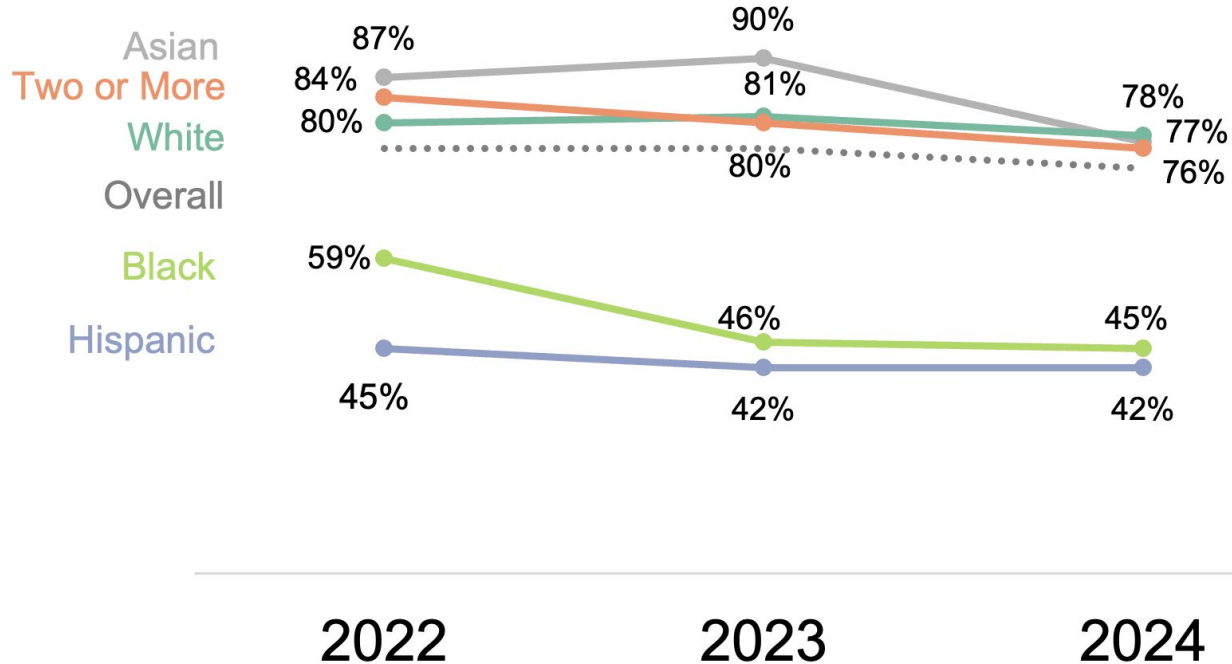

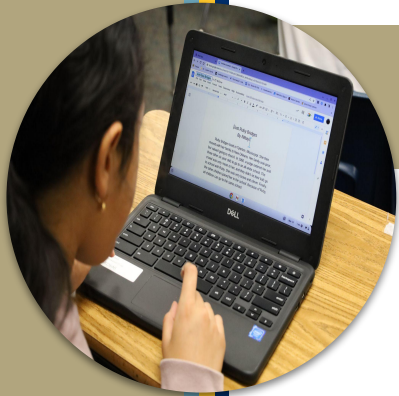
FastBridge Learning aReading Grades 2-5

All 3rd Graders Reading at Grade Level

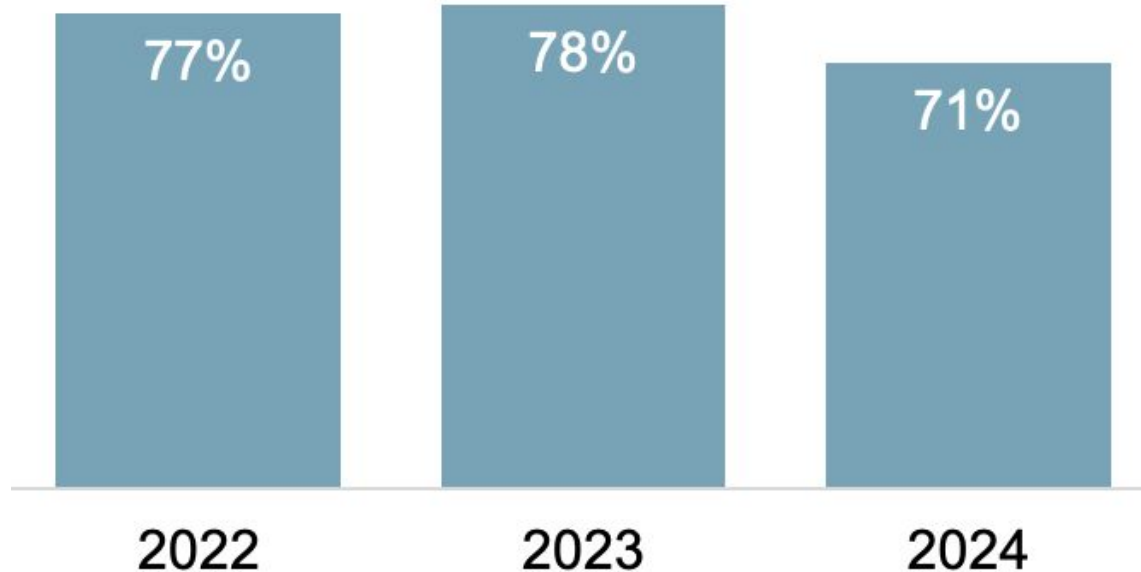
2025 Goal:

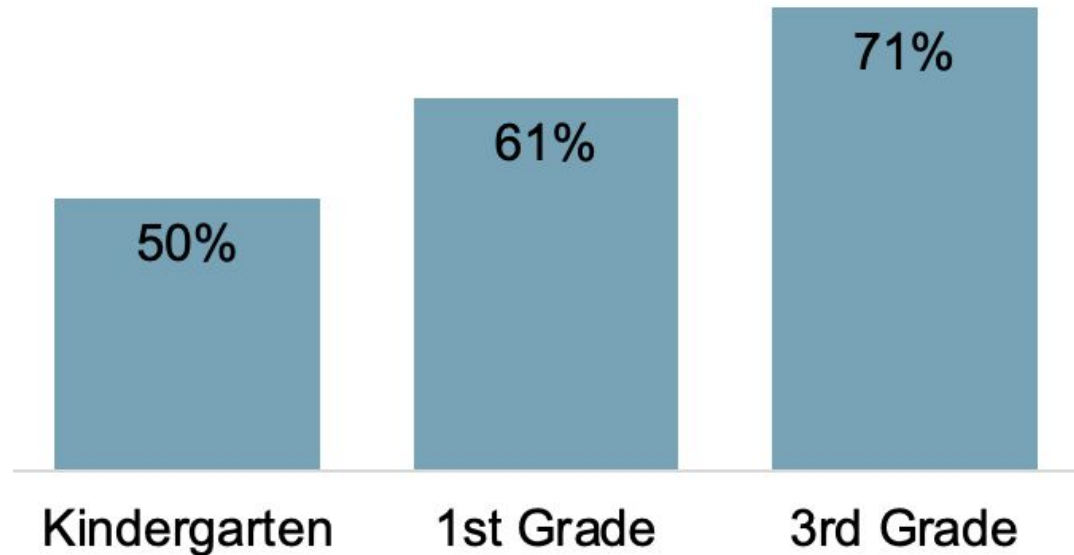
All 3rd Graders Reading at Grade Level

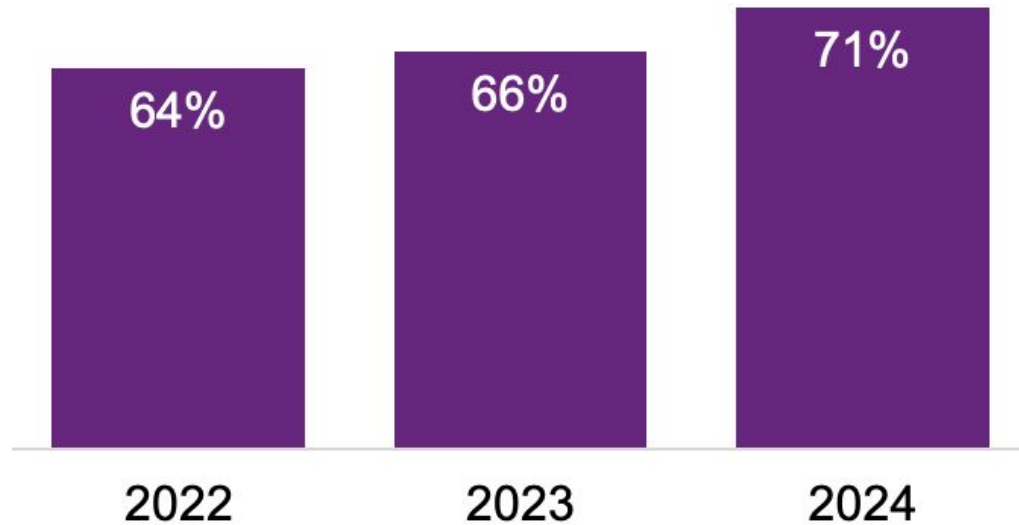
2025 Goal:

The percentage of students scoring in the proficient category at the end of Kindergarten on the FastBridge earlyReading assessment will increase by 3 percentage points from 64% in 2022 to 67% in 2025.

All Children Ready for School - Preschool



Action:

- Pyramid Model promotes the social, emotional, and behavioral development of young children. This is a comprehensive, multi-tiered framework
- Science of reading training for Preschool teachers
- *Sonday* phonics curriculum implementation Fall of 2025 rooted in science of reading
- End of year preschool assessment aligned to Kindergarten and shared with Kindergarten teachers



All Children Ready for School - SpEd

Action:

- Specialized training re: student disabilities
 - In-depth Science of Reading training
- Personalized, specialized curriculum and instruction
 - Diagnosis, assessment, intervention, progress monitoring
 - Prerequisite skills
 - Multidisciplinary teams
 - Collaboration across departments
- School-to-school transitions
- Advisory Council for Exceptional Staff (ACES)



All Children Ready for School and All 3rd Graders Reading at Grade Level



Action:

- Literacy resources *Being a Reader* and *Sunday*; rooted in science of reading
- Professional Learning:
 - Science of Reading course
 - Ongoing coaching from literacy coach and school leadership team
- Using data to drive instruction, progress monitor, and provide evidence-based support in fall, winter and spring
- District support for targeted grade levels and schools
