Agriscience Happenings By Eve McCorkle

In the agriscience class, the students were learning about how to make mozzarella.

The steps to this recipe are to start with mixing ¼ cup water and 1½ tsp salt into a small bowl. Then, pour 1 gallon of milk into a large pot place it on a stove or hot plate on med-high heat, and attach a thermometer. Add the citric acid and stir well. Continue heating the milk mixture until it reaches 90 degrees Fahrenheit. Once the milk reaches 90 degrees remove from heat, add rennet, and stir for 30 seconds. Cover the pot with a lid and let set for 10 minutes. Use a knife to cut curd. If the curd separates from the whey, cut the curd into a 1" checkerboard pattern. Then, place the

- 1 gallon milk
- ½ cup water (split)
- 1 ½ tsp citric acid
- Rennet
- 1-3 tsp salt

pot back on the stove and heat to 105 degrees while slowly stirring the curds. reaches Once it temperature, take the pot off the burner and stir for 2-5 minutes. Place a colander inside a large bowl. Then,

with a slotted spoon, scoop the curds into the colander. Pout off any additional whey. Then enjoy!

Overall, this seems like a pretty simple thing for the students to make and it also seems like a lot of fun!



Interstate 81 Syracuse Project

The Interstate 81 Project has an interesting story behind it. It is a 12-mile long piece of highway that is crumbling, falling apart, and has become structurally unsafe. Interstate 81 is a major truck route that runs through the cities

of Watertown, Syracuse, and Binghamton in New York. Then it runs through Pennsylvania, Maryland, West Virginia, Virginia, and finally the highway ends in Tennessee. "Portions of I-81, which was built in the 1950s and 1960s, are deteriorating, do not meet current engineering standards, and have experienced high accident rates. This is especially true of the 1.4-mile elevated section of "viaduct," near downtown Syracuse. (NYSDOT)" According to NYSDOT, the project will improve the city by no longer dividing it in half and there will be easier access to everything the city has to offer such as the university and hospital.

I had the opportunity to interview some teachers about the project. I received varying responses from the teachers. One of them was more negative and the other one was more positive.

When asked how she felt about the project, Mrs. Cunningham responded that "...it's a nuisance to drive all the way around the city to get back onto Interstate 81." She thinks that it is inconvenient and also it's not worth it at all. "I don't think all the hassle that we're going through is worth the inconvenience."

I also interviewed Ms. Giddings. She had a much different perspective on the project than Mrs. Cunningham. Ms. Giddings thinks that it could be a good thing. She also feels that it will improve the appearance of the city because it's nice to have new roads to drive on. Ms. Giddings thinks it will be worth all the hassle. "As long as it makes it better in the future, I think it will be worth it. Construction can be a pain sometimes, but new roads will be worth it...I think the whole project will improve the city's infrastructure. It will also make it more attractive, and provide easier access to the city's sights and sounds and visual appeal."

The other big plus will be that it will make the roads safer and also it will improve the infrastructure of the whole city of Syracuse. This reporter believes that this is a good project for the city of Syracuse.

Israeli strike on Hezbollah spokesperson

On November 17th, 2024 Israel sent a strike at Hezbollah spokesperson of the Lebanese militant group. The strike was sent at

Stuffing Recipe!!

Thanksgiving is right around the corner! There are so many dishes that can be made for this holiday! But one of my favorites is stuffing! So here's a stuffing recipe!

Ingredients:

- small yellow onions diced
- 4 ribs celery diced
- ²/₃ cup butter
- 1 ½ teaspoons poultry seasoning or ½ teaspoon ground sage
- black pepper to taste
- salt to taste
- 12 cups dry bread cubes

- 2 to 4 cups chicken broth see notes
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley or 2 teaspoons dried parsley
- 1 tablespoon fresh herbs any combination of sage, thyme, or rosemary, or 1 teaspoon dry herbs

Directions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- 2. In a large skillet, melt the butter over medium heat. Add the onion, celery and poultry seasoning (and rosemary if using). Reduce the temperature to medium low and cook until tender, about 10-12 minutes. Cool slightly.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine the bread cubes, onion mixture, parsley and fresh herbs.
- 4. Pour 1 cup of broth overtop and toss the cubes. Add the remaining broth, a little bit at a time until cubes are moist (but not soggy) and gently toss. You may not need all of the broth. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 5. Place the bread mixture in a baking dish, dot with additional butter if desired, and cover.
- 6. Bake for 35 minutes, uncover, and bake an additional 10 minutes.

Trump's Cabinet Nominees

President-elect Donald Trump has already selected most of his cabinet for his upcoming presidency. Among them are some very controversial picks, from Robert F. Kennedy Jr. for Health and Human Services Secretary to Matt Gaetz for Attorney General to Pete Hegseth for Secretary of Defense. The controversy around these picks lies in how utterly unqualified they are for these jobs.

vaccine requirements for schools, potentially 1.9 putting lives of million immunocompromised children at risk. He has also stated that he will end what he calls the FDA's "aggressive suppression" of everything from certain drugs to raw milk. However, as anyone who has taken a class with Mrs. Bossard knows, there is a reason that the sale of raw milk is banned in many states. Pasteurization kills off bacteria in milk and extends its shelf life. As the current bird flu outbreak has spread to many dairy cattle farms, it's even more important to pasteurize our milk, since the Center for Disease Control has found evidence that bird flu can be contracted by drinking raw milk from infected cows.

Pete Hegseth by Alexi Rosenfeld via PBS

Pete Hegseth is primarily known for his past working as a FOX News anchor and the



sexual assault allegation brought against him in 2017. However, he was also an infantry officer in the Army National Guard fresh out of college, which supposedly qualifies him to serve as Trump's Secretary of Defense in spite of his many inadequacies. Hegseth believes that women do not belong in combat roles, and could, as Secretary of Defense, pull all women in the army off of active duty. This would mean that the US military would lose over 230,000 active duty members at once - nearly 20% of the force. That is not a weakness that the US can afford to show at a time when global superpowers like Russia are growing ever bolder. Hegseth also showed a

complete disregard for military disciplinary procedure in 2019 when he urged Trump to blindly grant pardons to 3 US service members either on trial for or already convicted of various war crimes, such as firing on Afghani civilians.

More important than his politics, Hegseth simply lacks the experience required of a Secretary of Defense. As a major, he only commanded a few hundred men in total at the end of his service with the National Guard. He does not have any experience leading large organizations that could prepare him to lead the entire US Armed Forces. In fact, when he was considered for under secretary roles at the DoD and Department of Veteran Affairs in 2016, during Trump's own first presidency, he was found to be underqualified for these junior positions, and he certainly hasn't gained more relevant experience while working for FOX for the past eight years.



Matt Gaetz by Nathan Howard via ABC News Up for Attorney General is Former Congressman for Florida.

Matt Gaetz. As AG, Gaetz would head the Department of Justice, represent the US government in legal matters, and give the President legal and ethical advice. However, Gaetz is not qualified to give either legal or ethical advice. While he is a licensed member of the Florida bar, Gaetz has no experience prosecuting on the federal level. importantly, until a few short days ago, Gaetz was under investigation by the House Ethics Committee on claims of drug use, "improper gifts," and sexual misconduct, including towards a minor. It's suspected, in fact, that he resigned from the House of Representatives early specifically to escape the Ethics Committee's jurisdiction and prevent this ethics report from being released. A man who would commit these

acts and then resign to avoid facing consequences for his actions should not be giving ethical advice to anyone, much less the President of the United States.

There is still a chance, though, that these nominees may not end up taking these posts. Before they can officially begin performing their duties, they must first be accepted by the Senate in their confirmation hearings. These hearings may begin at any time during the coming months.

To have my children see me stand toe to toe and finish 8 rounds with a talented fighter half my age in front of a packed Dallas Cowboy stadium is an experience that no man has the right to ask for. Thank You".

Jake Paul posted on X as well after the match saying "All respect to the Baddest ever. It was an honor to share the ring with him". Both fighters showed lots of respect for each other in the end. Many people thought the fight may have been scripted because Mike's training videos looked much stronger than his performance in the ring. I don't believe this at all, training is much different than the actual fight, during training, there isn't as much pressure, there isn't really anything on the line, and you can rest when needed. Before the fight, alleged scripts were leaked, but these were probably nothing more than predictions written by a fan.

Overall the fight was kind of disappointing; lots of people expected Mike to put on a better performance, but at the end of the day he hasn't fought professionally since 2005 and he is fighting someone half his age.
