Summer Brings Multiple Improvement Projects to SD74 Campus

Construction on several projects around the SD74 campus has begun this summer. The expansion of Todd Hall's parking lot is currently underway. With the addition of 35 more parking lot spaces, this expansion will help decrease the amount of street parking by staff, as well as alleviate congestion during pick-up and drop-off. The project also includes the addition of permeable pavers on the north side of the lot. The pavers will help with water runoff and retention. Additionally, new trees, landscaping and fencing will be installed.

While Todd Hall's parking lot is receiving a full makeover, Lincoln Hall and Rutledge Hall parking lots were recently updated with crack filling, seal coating and new striping.


Another project is the addition of a new walking/running track around campus. The new nine foot wide path follows the layout of the campus grounds between Todd Hall and Lincoln Hall. Students will enjoy the use of the pathway during school hours, while community members will have the opportunity to use it during off-school hours. The track includes three lined lanes and will include distance signage posted along the way. SD74 will officially inaugurate the completed path for students at this fall's Jaguar Jog event happening on September 16.

Rounding out our summer improvement projects are the additions and improvements to Rutledge Hall's playground. A new outdoor learning facility will be added to the playground. The new outdoor learning facility will include a climbing/fitness circuit that will have a ring pull, wobble & seat pods, a swiggleknots bridge, cycler pedals and handles. A new poured-in-place rubber playground surface will replace the current wood chips surrounding the playground equipment. The addition of the new equipment and surface will allow the playground to be more accessible and safer for all students. Renderings of the new equipment can be seen in the picture accompanying this article.

A majority of overall costs for these improvement projects have been paid for by the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) III grant funding that the District received. Annually, the District undertakes projects to maintain the physical plant or make improvements on campus following a multi-year Master Facilities Plan. Lincoln Hall Student Wins Statewide Literature Contest


Congratulations to 8th grade student, Ellie K. for winning the 2022 "Letters About Literature in Illinois" Contest. Ellie wrote to Illinois author Celia C. Pérez about her book, *The First Rule of Punk*. Ellie wrote about the influence that this



particular book has had on her life. Her letter was submitted by her teacher, Mrs. Ellis.

To participate in the annual competition, students in grades 4-12 are asked to read a book or poem and then write a personal letter to the author explaining how the book changed their personal view of themselves or the world. Students can read fiction or non-fiction works from living or deceased authors. Ellie was recognized at an awards ceremony in Springfield, Illinois in May.

Four SD 74 Students Earn Top Medals at Regional Science Fair, Qualify for State Fair



Four Lincoln Hall students took home the gold and silver for projects they submitted to the Illinois Junior Academy of Science (IJAS) North Suburban Regional Science Fair on March 5, 2022.

Rachel G. earned a gold medal in the category of Health Science for her project, "The Effects of Sodas on Calcium Compounds." Sarah P. earned a gold medal in Physics for her project, "The Effect of Temperature on Leyden Jar Spark Size." Sarah K. and Mila M. won a silver medal in the category of Health Science for their project, "Methods for Preserving Apple Freshness."

All three projects also qualified for the IJAS State Science Fair, which took place April 23, 2022 in Peoria, Illinois.

SD 74 Receives PLTW Distinguished District Award

For the fourth time, SD74 was named a "Distinguished District" by Project Lead the Way (PLTW). The District partners with PLTW on our Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) curriculum. The criteria is that at least 20 percent of students in each grade, K-8, participated in a PLTW program during the 2020-21 school year.

In this picture, a student at Rutledge Hall works on coding and engineering modules. Each module is a hands-on, problem-solving project with additional activities. Students at all grade levels get the opportunity to experience similar projects including robotics, computer-aided design and app creation and development.



Spanish Students Receive National Recognition



Several Lincoln Hall students attained national recognition for excellent performances on the 2022 National Spanish Examinations. Jonathan B., Lexi C., Mateo K., Raffaella F., Adrian G., and Mia L. V. all earned medals or honorable mentions. This particular exam is one of the largest in the United States with over 73,000 students participating in 2022. The National Spanish Examination is administered each year in grades 6-12.

Lincoln Hall's Track & Field Teams Bring Home Several Championships from End-of-Year Meet

Congratulations to all 58 Lincoln Hall student-athletes who participated in the Little 9 Track & Field Meet on May 17, 2022 at Niles North High School. All four SD 74 teams - JV Boys, JV Girls, Varsity Boys and Varsity Girls - took 1st place overall in the Little 9 Conference. The meet featured 32 track events that included hurdles, relays, 100 meter to 1600 meter races, and 20 field events that included shot put, discus throw, high jump, long jump and triple jump.




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
