MADDOX THREE-POINTER GIVES LADY CAVALIERS OVERTIME WIN OVER LEXINGTON

From the opening tip Friday night, it was apparent Crockett County's Lady Cavaliers might be in for a close scrape against Lexington.

That's mostly because - on that opening "tip" - Crockett's center jumper Jordyn Maddox got scraped across the face by her counterpart from Lexington, who had swung and missed the ball. For the rest of the game, the left eye of Maddox was reddening and darkening.

Fortunately, it never swelled shut, because Maddox needed both eyes to zero in on a top-of-the-key three pointer with just 59 seconds left in overtime to break a 49-49 tie and give Crockett the decisive points in a hard-fought 53-50 victory in its home opener.

Lexington's boys prevailed 55-45 in the nightcap of the doubleheader, but not before an undermanned Cavalier roster put up quite a fight, sparked by a 22-point, multi-rebound effort by Cade Freeman.

Coach Kayla Irvin's Lady Cavs, after overcoming an early deficit (10-8 with 3:12 left in the opening quarter), looked like they had righted the ship when sophomore point guard Gabby Bursey nailed back-to-back three-pointers to help the hosts acquire a 16-12 edge. That margin expanded to a relatively comfortable 29-21 advantage at halftime.

After that? "Wasn't very pretty, was it?" Irvin joked after the contest.

While Crockett maintained the lead for virtually the entire second half, Lexington got within a basket (37-35) at the 7:12 mark of the fourth quarter. From that point, the Lady Cavs never led by more than four points. The teams kept going back-and-forth.

Maddox hit a shot to make it 41-37 with 3:19 to play. The Lady Tigers answered with a couple of Holly Bartholomew free throws – the bulk of Lexington's second-half offense – until Maddox scored again on a perfect assist from Karlee Castellaw at the 2:10 mark for a 45-41 edge.

Bartholomew tallied again a minute later to make it 45-43, and Crockett went into keep-away mode with ball control until 20.5 seconds remained, when Castellaw was intentionally fouled – perhaps a little too enthusiastically – and the officials awarded the Lady Cavs two free throws and ensuing possession of the ball.

Castellaw - one of Crockett's better shooters normally - watched both of her efforts bounce off the back rim, leaving the score at 45-43. The Lady Cavs inbounded and managed to knock eight more seconds off the clock before Maddox - Crockett's best free throw shooter - was fouled with just 12.9 left to play.

Unbelievably, she also missed both of her free throws, giving Lexington a final chance. Guarding against a potential game-winning three-pointer, the Lady Cav defense allowed Lexy Cooper to sneak in close to the basket, receive a last-second pass, and toss up a hurried short shot. Cooper had not scored all night – but this one went in just before the buzzer sounded. 45-45. Overtime.

Four minutes went up on the clock. Six seconds into it, Crockett's Halle Holyfield made one of two free throws, and the Lady Cavs led again. Thirty seconds later, Bartholomew – who hit 15 of 18 free throws in the game, all but one after the half – swished a pair to give Lexington its first advantage since the opening quarter.

At the 3:08 mark, Crockett's Amaria Walker worked a power move inside, banked in the shot, and got fouled. She hit the free throw, and the Lady Cavs were back up 49-47. Bartholomew, relentlessly driving through defensive traffic, drew another foul and netted both shots to tie it up again with just 2:19 remaining.

Both teams committed turnover in the next minute, but with 59 seconds on the clock, Maddox got open at the top of the key and confidently drilled in a three-pointer for a 52-49 Crockett margin.

Naturally, Bartholomew got herself fouled on the ensuing possession and promptly nailed the first free throw. She missed the second - perhaps purposely in hopes of a Lexington rebound - but Crockett came away with it and Maddox was subsequently fouled again. She made one of two for a 53-50 lead with 33 seconds to go, and the visitors couldn't mount a successful scoring threat in the remaining time.

"I'm so proud of the way our girls fought and fought on a night when things weren't going well," Irvin said. "I have to remind myself that we still have a lot of players who are inexperienced in the roles they're in, and I have to be patient as they learn. But even with that, to see them step up and grind this one out when it looked like it might slip away – well, I can't ask more of them than that. We have a lot of stuff to clean up, but we'll learn and be better for it. I love the way these girls are willing to be coached."

Maddox led Crockett's scoring with 17 and also pulled down nine rebounds, while Walker posted a double-double with 14 points and 10 boards. Bursey, who hit four treys in the contest, scored 16 points and made five steals for the winners. Bartholomew finished with 23 points for Lexington.

In the second game of the doubleheader, Coach Rick Rudesill's Cavs – still with a roster in transition – jumped to a surprising 8-0 lead in the game's first three minutes, but it took less than three more for Lexington to move ahead 10-8 and slowly stretch the margin to 29-19 by the intermission.

Lexington then began to pull away early in the third period, but Freeman – playing an inspired, hustling game – kept the Cavs close long enough for Rudesill to go to his bench and insert recently arrived football players DK Woods, Squirt Pickens, and Amarion Hobson.

Working with Freeman – whose hustle was contagious – they helped fuel a rally that got Crockett back within eight (40-32) with 6:32 remaining in the game. Woods scored eight points in the final quarter alone, but in the end, the play of Lexington's Donoven Belew was too much to overcome.

Belew, who scored 37 points in the Tigers' previous game, added 24 in this one to pace the Lexington attack. Jakob Davis netted 10 in support.

Backing Freeman's 22 for Crockett were Woods with eight and Kevin Pledge with six.

Both Crockett teams will host Trenton Peabody Tuesday night in a 6:00 twin bill.


