**Cross-building collaborations strengthen** 

peer-to-peer connections





In February, 8th graders and their STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) teachers partnered with the Kindergarten team to host STEM stations for Kindergarten students!

The brainchild of 8th grade STEM teacher Kenji Mori and Todd Hall STEM teacher Chris Edman, the collaborative experience grew from a desire to offer students across grade levels more opportunities for connections and relationshipbuilding while keeping a focus on STEM at the forefront.

The stations were inspired by the seasons of the year to reinforce

topics the Kindergarteners had recently learned. They were: Spring - Building LEGO Flowers; Summer -Cardstock Slide Creations; and Winter - Making a Marshmallow Snowflake.

Both grade-level teams reported the overall feedback to be incredibly positive. To continue the momentum, a second collaboration is being planned before the end of the school year. Its focus will be on literacy, with 8th graders leading a "Readers' Theater," which will involve them reading books with their Kindergarten buddies and performing skits of their favorite scenes.





### SD74 hosts the Scripps Regional Spelling Bee

For the second consecutive year, the District hosted the North Cook ISC Scripps Spelling Bee Regional Qualifier Competition. Lincoln Hall 8th grader Tristen N. represented SD74 against 27 students in grades 2 through 8 from across the region.

After an exciting two-hour competition, a champion was named: Dev K., an 8th grader from Hoffman Estates!

Two finalists, Katie P. (7th grade, Park Ridge) and Paige T. (7th grade, Palatine), joined Dev and moved on to compete in the next round of the competition in hopes of advancing to the Scripps National Spelling Bee in Washington, D.C. in late May.

Lincoln Hall's auditorium continues to be an ideal venue for events such as the Bee, as it features a large stage and stadiumstyle seating. The space was renovated in 2018 as a part of a complete overhaul of the middle school building. Improvements at that time also included a new main entrance, state-of-the-art STEM labs, a library, a gymnasium, a fitness room, and more.

The District looks forward to being considered to host the Bee in the future and joins Scripps in thanking the following individuals and sponsors:



# **Rutledge Hall Construction Plans**

Exciting improvements to the District's learning spaces continue this summer! As a part of the SD74 Master Facilities Plan, Rutledge Hall – which houses third through fifth grades – will undergo major interior renovations of all classrooms and bathrooms. This comprehensive project will see everything from the lighting and the HVAC systems to the windows and the flooring get upgraded.

This plan builds on the updates to Rutledge Hall's gym, Multi-Purpose Room (MPR), and library, which were completed during Summer 2023.

The original timeline had the construction taking place throughout two summers, to be completed before the 2025-2026 school year. However, Stuckey Construction Company – the winning bidder of the project – proposed the work be completed over one summer instead. At the recommendation of the Administration, the Board of Education approved an accelerated timeline during its regular meeting in March.

Rutledge Hall Principal Aliaa Ibrahim is "absolutely thrilled about the upcoming transformative renovation," and predicts the upgrades will have a positive impact on teaching and learning.

"This project will significantly enhance the learning environment for generations of students and teachers to thrive within," she said.

Construction is scheduled to begin on June 10 and the work is expected to wrap up significantly by early August. The District looks forward to revealing an improved Rutledge Hall in the fall!



# **Community Connections**

### SD74 drafts new Strategic Plan

### WHY DO WE EXIST AS A SCHOOL DISTRICT? WHAT DO WE VALUE? WHERE ARE WE HEADED IN THE FUTURE?

These are some of the questions that a Core Stakeholder Group comprising SD74 Board members, administrators, teachers, support staff, parents, community members, representatives from community organizations, and students worked together to answer this winter. The goal? Use the answers to draft a new strategic plan that would guide the District's operations over the next five years, specifically across five primary areas of focus: Teaching and Learning; Communications and Community Relations; Facilities and Finances; Human Resources; and Technology.

The strategic planning process was highly collaborative; it began with a school and community perception survey distributed in January to SD74 families, employees, and community members. The Core Stakeholder Group then met for weekly sessions in February and March, during which facilitator Dr. Gary Zabilka, of Educational Leadership Solutions, led the group through outlining new mission and vision statements, determining the District's core values, and identifying new goals for the future.

With the District's current strategic plan expiring at the end of the school year, the new plan will be submitted to the Board of Education this summer for approval.

However, even with all its components defined, the plan itself is only the beginning. To ensure it comes to fruition at all levels of the District, the Administrative team will spend the summer preparing for its implementation by translating its objectives into actionable initiatives that can be executed day-to-day.


