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

fortified by the lessons from our past history and by faith in the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the protection of Mary, through whom we offer all to Jesus.

We continue to improve and enhance the educational experience of our students as we prepare them for college and life. The addition of a **pep band**, **drum line** and **jazz band** this year has expanded our music program. The new **Digital Language Learning Lab** has increased the learning opportunities for our students to develop enhanced fluency in World Languages. **Two hundred and thirty-three students** are currently taking **Advanced Placement** courses and looking to build on the success of the 130 students who earned college credit last year through our **12 College Board accredited AP courses**. **New cardio-fitness equipment** supports the fitness component of the physical education classes. The library has expanded its holdings and now includes materials in support of a **new visual literacy program**. Students benefit uniquely from the insights of distinguished authors through the ongoing "**Authors in the Classroom**" **Series**, which was highlighted in the January edition of the *English Journal*, a national publication of the National Council of Teachers of English. We have continuously enhanced instructional technology to best serve our students. Nearly 70% of classrooms have **mounted LCD projectors**, and our **10 interactive "smart boards"** provide another cutting-edge educational tool to enhance teaching and learning.

A SOUND INVESTMENT


The Digital Language Learning Lab

A hrough the fundraising efforts of our students in CCHS Walk 9 and Walk 10, CCHS was able to design and install a digital language learning laboratory to enhance the acquisition of listening and speaking fluency in the target language. The lab is a sound-proof facility using laptop computers, headsets for listening and speaking, recording and monitoring software as well as a teacher-based server and control unit. The language teacher can easily listen to, monitor and assess individual students as they practice their response skills in the target language in ways that were impossible within the confines of a standard classroom setting. The laboratory also gives students the opportunity to progress at individualized rates based on their level of skill.

A Commitment to... FAITH AND SERVICE

Thank you for your support of Campus Ministry and the Christian Service Programs at CCHS!

Campus Ministry plays a leading role in fulfilling the mission of Saint Marcellin Champagnat at Central Catholic: to make Jesus known and loved among young people. Prayer services, liturgies, daily prayer, retreats, and Christian service programs all contribute to the spiritual growth of students, providing opportunities for them to practice and express their faith. Students actively take leadership roles in these programs through the Campus Ministry Team, the Retreat Team, and Marist Youth, which has adopted Sargodha Catholic High School, a Marist school in Sargodha, Pakistan. These experiences build on the lessons learned in the Religious Studies classroom, especially those on Catholic social teaching.

Christian Service is an integral part of life at Central Catholic High School.

ONE DAY is a nationally acclaimed model, school-wide Christian service learning program based on the mission of CCHS. It focuses on serving others, especially the least favored. Students volunteer through GUTS (Guys and Girls United to Serve) as well as over 100 long term service opportunities. In this school year through January, our present student body has given 4,844 hours in Christian Service. Students also donated over 3,000 food items to Lazarus House Food Pantry and raised nearly \$10,000 for families referred by Catholic Charities during the holidays.

Central Catholic's student activities program offers a wide range of opportunities (over 30 clubs and activities) to develop a passion or interest outside of the classroom setting. **Nearly eight hundred students**, almost two-thirds of the student body, participate in at least one of the activities, which range from Model United Nations and Mock Trial to the Ski Club, Math League to Bowling, and Student Council to Project Recycle.



Our programs continue to grow and flourish. This past fall, over **400 students** competed on our sports teams. Our coaches and student-athletes continue to make us proud, distinguishing themselves through their efforts and accomplishments. 

from the 17th and 18th centuries, **Michael J. Tangney** '63 has always demonstrated an appreciation for his place in the world. His life journey, which includes a distinguished career as one of Colgate's leading executives, has taken him from the Merrimack Valley to the far reaches of the globe.

Mike, excited by the prospect of studying the international and the foreign, attended the Georgetown University School of Foreign Service, partly on the advice of a Jesuit friend of the family and partly based on the experiences of a previous CCHS debate teammate who was attending the school. Several CCHS classmates also attended Georgetown, including Dr. M. Wayne Salo '63 and the Honorable Terence P. Flynn '63, who would serve as Mike's best man at his wedding.

During his junior year, Mike's place was at the University of Madrid, where he met a fellow Georgetown exchange student, his future wife: Mary. While in Madrid, Mike also became fluent in Spanish. "Living with a Spanish family, I was either going to learn Spanish or go hungry, and I

didn't go hungry."

Mike joined the Navy after graduation with the goal of becoming a fighter pilot, but during a physical, a doctor discovered a sinus problem.

Mike was disappointed but undaunted. "I couldn't fly," acknowledges Mike, "but I could float." He served for two years on the Admiral's Staff in the Panama Canal Zone as a journalist. He also took business classes parttime at the Canal Zone College.


at the University of Chicago Graduate School of Business, pursuing an interest in economics and an MBA. While most of his classmates embarked on careers in finance or consulting, Mike followed his passion for marketing to Colgate-Palmolive, beginning a 37-year (and counting) professional relationship. Shortly after starting at Colgate, Mike married his college sweetheart, Mary, with whom he has shared 37 years (and counting) and raised two children.

The values-driven nature of Colgate, combined with the professional and travel opportunities the company offered, was a great fit.
