Southern Westchester BOCES AM classes are in session today, but PM classes are CANCELLED.

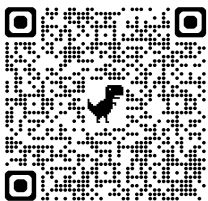
