


CLASS SIZE


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.


ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parent engagement is a priority at Eastwood. We believe that all families should have a voice in our school and partner with us. We have dedicated parent groups - PAC (Parent Advisory Committee) and PTA (Parent Teacher Association) - that work together to support our students. Some of the opportunities we have for parents to engage in the school are: Parent/Teacher Conferences; parent newsletter, website and social media; monthly Coffee with the Principal; PTA and PAC monthly meetings; family evening events sponsored by our parent groups; Night at The Museum Celebration; Celebration of Learning Nights; and volunteerism.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Eastwood partners with a variety of businesses and community organizations to support the needs of our families and students. With community support, we are able to provide these programs: Weekly Food Pantry Program; school supply donations from various businesses and parents; on-site counseling with Life Stance; clothing drive; snack donation; and partnership with Just Create Community, which provides our Community Greeters Program and support for evening events. We will also create a Beautification Committee to engage in upkeep activities in and around our school building and garden.
