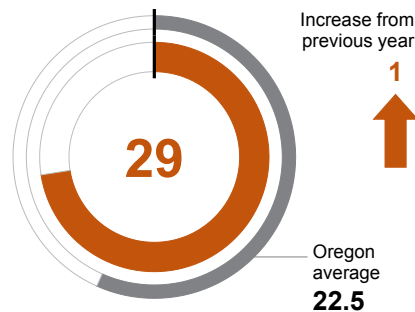

### School Environment

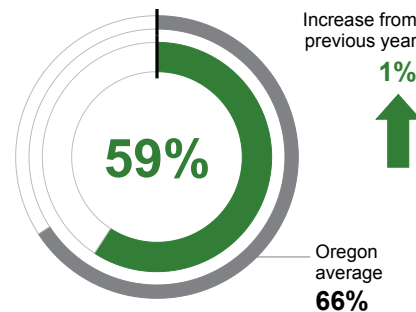
#### CLASS SIZE

#### REGULAR ATTENDERS

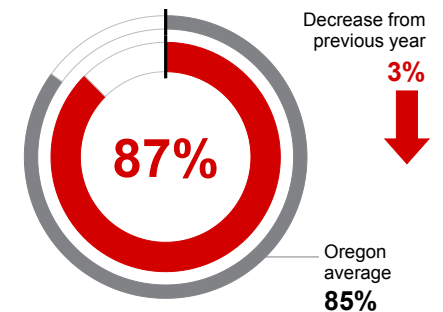
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

#### ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

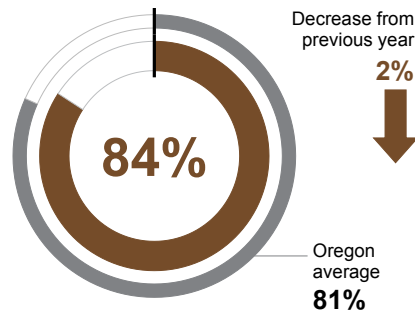
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



### Academic Success

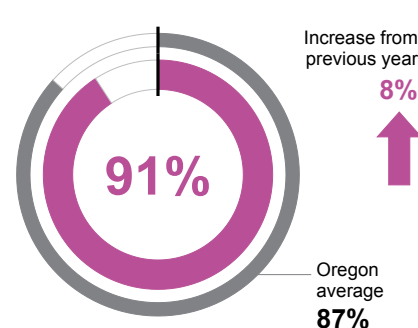
#### ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2019-20 graduating in 2022-23.



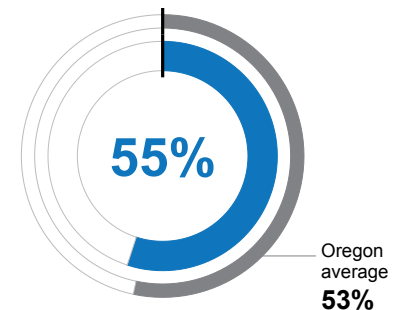
#### FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

### School Goals

Hillsboro High School's goals center on scaffolding support for all students to access academic rigor and graduate college and career ready. In order to know, value, and empower students to achieve their dreams, we use best teaching strategies, equitable assessment practices, engaging learning environments, positive classroom cultures, and focused academic language instruction. Additionally, we target our most vulnerable students and utilize a 9th grade on-track team to ensure students begin high school feeling seen and supported as they work toward graduation and postsecondary opportunities.

### State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is collaborating with school districts and communities across the state to achieve a 90% on-time graduation rate by 2027. Grounded in the pillars of Academic Excellence, Belonging and Wellness, and Reimagined Accountability, ODE prioritizes evidence-based practices to boost early literacy, attendance, and student engagement. We are committed to closing opportunity and achievement gaps for marginalized students and securing long-term success for all of Oregon's learners by investing in culturally responsive practices, fostering inclusive environments and always driving for continuous improvement.

### Safe & Welcoming Environment

Common expectations, social emotional support, and safety and security systems allow our students to feel safe, seen and welcome on our campus. Students are connected through an advisor and access academic and social support through our Spartan Academy weekly schedule. Many upgrades to school safety have been completed at Hilhi thanks to bond funding, including upgraded door locks and re-keying, card access on outside doors, upgraded fencing and gates, and security cameras.

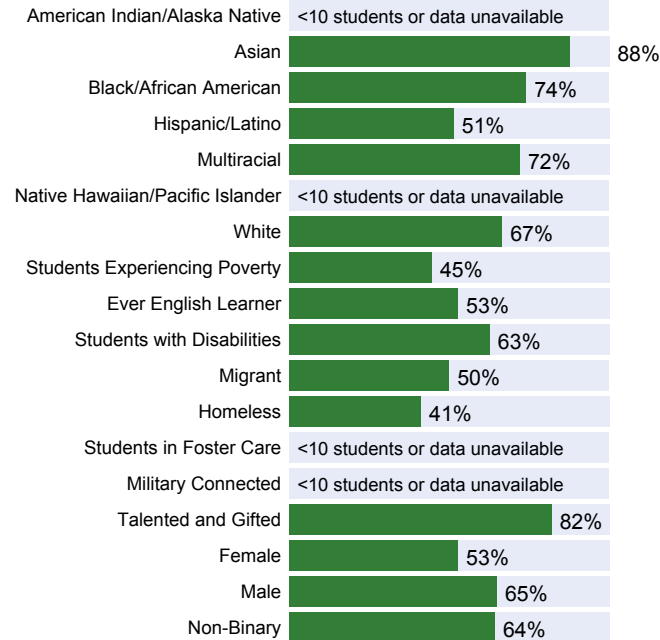

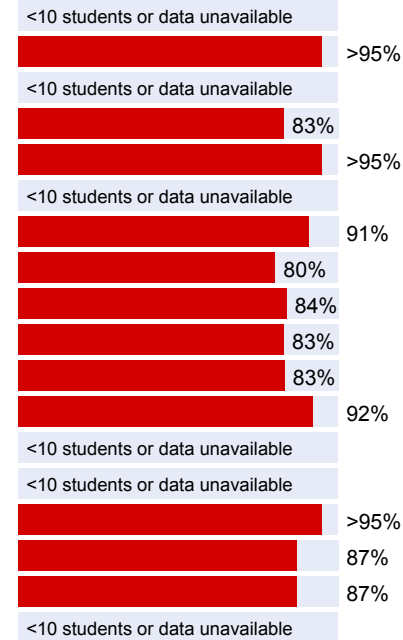

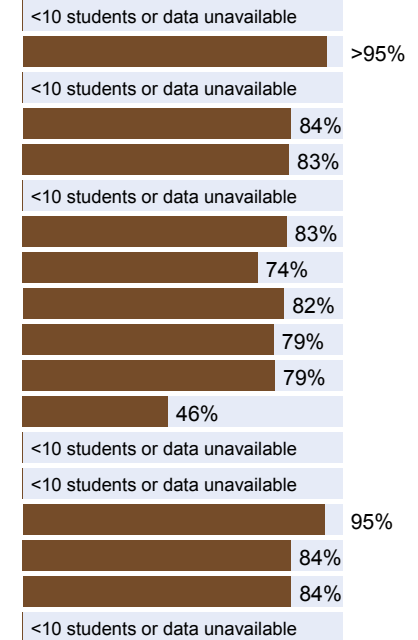

### About Our School

#### ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Hillsboro High School is proud to be an International Baccalaureate World School. Within the IB program, we offer courses in Language and Literature (both Spanish and English), Japanese, Spanish, Biology, Physics, Sports Exercise and Health Sciences, Math Analysis and Approaches, Math Applications and Interpretations, Business Management, Psychology, Global Politics, History of the World, Theory of Knowledge, and Theatre. Additionally, we are a dual language school, where students have the opportunity to earn a bilingual seal after completing core coursework at each grade level in both English and Spanish.

#### CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Hillsboro High School offers the following career-technical education programs: Industrial Technology and Engineering Systems, Graphic Design, Communication and Media, Automotive Technology, Business Education, Computer Technology, Biotechnology, Sports Medicine, Early Childhood Education, Diesel Mechanics, and Veterinary Science. Hills students can also access classes at neighboring schools for Fire Science, Aerospace, and Machine Welding. Sixteen Career & College Pathway programs support post-high school planning for all students.

#### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Hillsboro High School's extracurricular activities include OSAA Athletics, OSAA Activities, OSAA Arts (Band, Choir, Theater, and Marching Band), 31 Academic and Service Clubs, and 3+ Theatrical productions each year. We also offer a variety of STEAM activities, including Robotics (multiple teams), Computer Programming, and Si Se Puede STEAM camp. Affinity groups at our school include Black Student Union, GSA, MEChA, LYP, Chicas, and Asian American/Pacific Islander Club. Lunchtime club kickoff events each Fall and Spring encourage students to get involved and join a club or affinity group.

#### PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

At Hillsboro High School, we value the diversity of our students and families and plan for community outreach accordingly. We partner with our community, families, and students through a variety of evening events: bilingual parent nights, AVID family nights, Back-to-School night, Academic Planning night, IB Family Night, College and Career Center nights, and parent conferences. Additionally, we have targeted outreach through Connections Day, home visits, weekly newsletters, Principal Coffees, Juntos, Remind notifications, and our Family Outreach Liaison. Parent and community volunteers support a variety of programs throughout the school.
