


School Environment




School Goals

REGULAR ATTENDERS


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.



Academic Progress



Students earning a high school diploma or GED within five years. Cohort Includes students who were firsttime ninth graders in 2018-19 finishing in 2022-23.




State Goals

Hillsboro Online Academy provides over 60 introductory Career and Technical Education (CTE) Courses to students attending HOA and to high school students attending other schools in the District (concurrent enrollment). Hillsboro Online offers Criminal Justice and Agriculture Career and College Pathway programs to high school students across the District. Our students can also enroll in specialized CTE programs taking place at other campuses, such as Fire Science at Liberty High School.

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
