

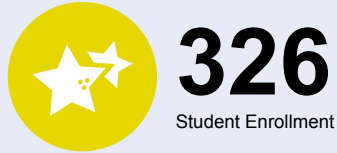

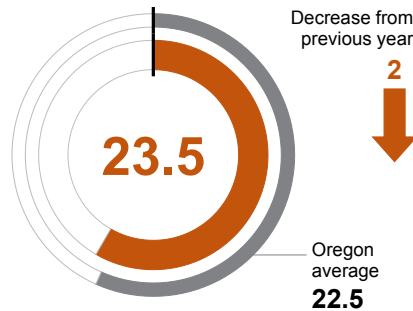

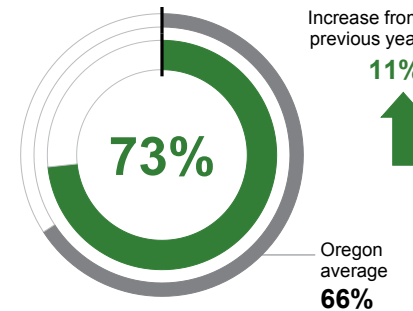

CLASS SIZE Median class size.



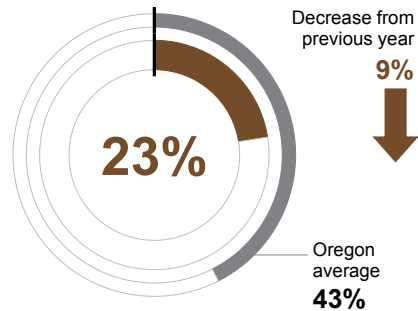
REGULAR ATTENDERS Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

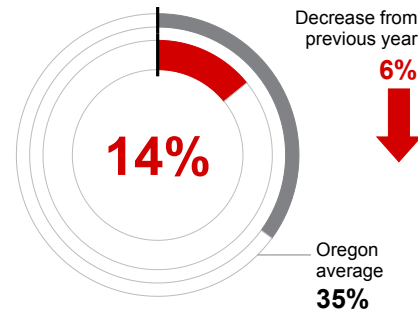
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



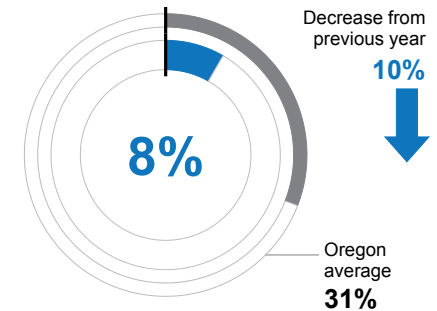
MATHEMATICS

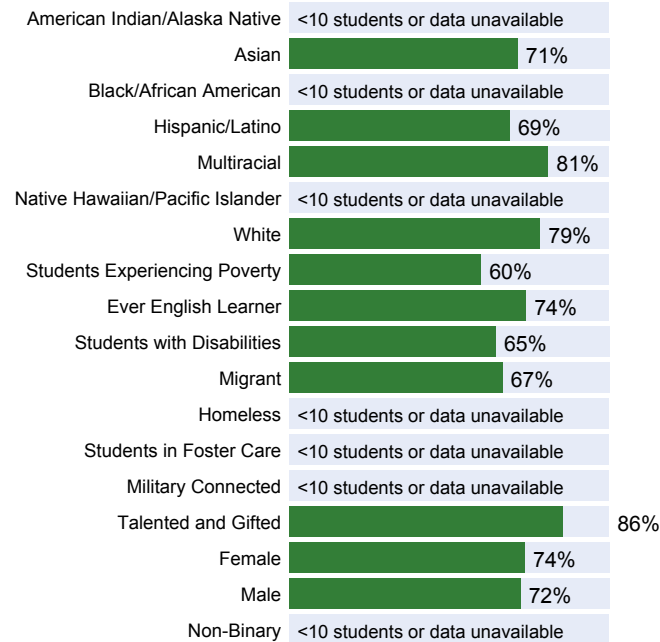

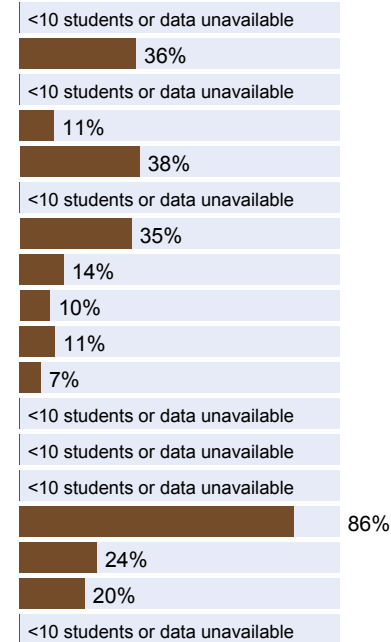

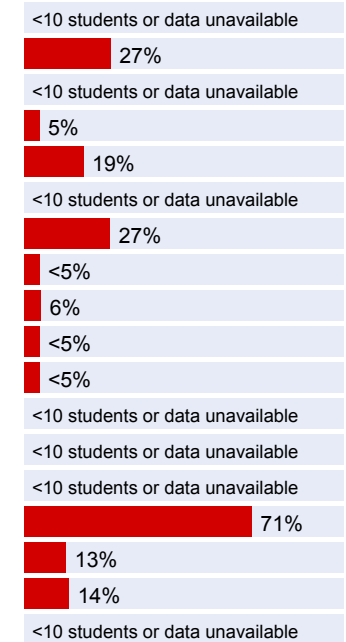
