Third Grade Thoughts...

The hustle and bustle of December is upon us! Our third graders have completed their first trimester here at Laddie A. Decker Sound Beach School. We have a lot to help keep their focus during this exciting time of year!

In Math, we are beginning Module 3. In this module our third graders will be expanding their knowledge of multiplication and division focusing on units of 0, 1, 6 through 9 and multiples of

10. Practicing multiplication and division at home will help third grade math concepts become easier to grasp all year long!

Throughout the second trimester, our third graders will be learning the geography and culture of our country. In Science, we will be beginning our study of forces and motion.

In English Language Arts, we will continue to read stories in our HMH series, looking at a variety of new texts and genres. Students are encouraged to read every night to help build up their reading stamina.

We are very proud of how hard our students work every day. We wish all the third grade families a very happy and healthy holiday season and look forward to seeing them in 2025!





How exciting it is that the winter holiday season has arrived! As we step into the colder months, we look forward to creating more special memories in our classrooms. During November, the fourth grade classes focused on the theme of gratitude, reflecting on the many people and things we are thankful for this year. In honor of Veterans Day, some of our fourth graders wrote letters to Veterans thanking them for their service. Ms. Abbriano and Ms. Runfola both invited military family members to visit their classrooms to share more about their responsibilities and duties as service members.

Academically, November was a bustling month filled with growth and achievement. In ELA, students enjoyed reading a variety of different texts and genres as we continued to work through

the *HMH Into Reading* program. We explored skills such as monitoring and clarifying while reading, identifying the central idea vs. the theme of a text, analyzing text features, understanding literary elements, and more. In math, we are working our way through Module 3, focusing on multi-digit multiplication and division. Students practiced using numerous methods to solve these problems, while also discussing ways we could apply these skills to real-world situations. In social studies, we dove into the geography of New York by learning about different cities, landforms, and bodies of water located in our state.

Looking ahead, December promises to be an exciting and busy month! In ELA, we will begin reading a new novel, while in math, we will begin practicing long division. We will transition back to science for a unit called, "Powering Thru The Fair." Students will take a virtual field trip to the NYS Fair in order to investigate the energy used there. We will follow a map to visit a roller coaster, ball toss, bumper cars, and more, all the while exploring ideas such as speed, collisions, and energy conversions. Your fourth graders will even make their own circuits using batteries, wires, light bulbs, buzzers, and a few other materials. Their goal will be to make a closed circuit, so the light bulb and buzzer will work.

The fourth grade teachers are looking forward to speaking with everyone on Parent-Teacher Conference Day (December 10th). Our fourth grade team wishes all our families a holiday season filled with health and happiness. Your support, encouragement, and involvement make all the difference in your child's success, and we deeply appreciate your partnership. Thank you for being such an integral part of our school community!




We began our Athletes Helping Athletes program where Miller Place High School athletes came into each of our fifth grade classrooms to share their experiences. They have become wonderful role models for our fifth graders, and we look forward to their visit again in February.



Academically, November was in full swing, and your children thrived! In ELA, we began our first novel study, <u>Esperanza Rising</u>. This historical fiction novel takes place in the midst of the Great Depression. The story follows the life of a young girl, Esperanza, as her world is turned upside down after tragedy strikes her family. In math, we have

been working with multi-digit whole number and decimal fraction operations. Students have been applying their knowledge of patterns of the base ten system to mental strategies and the multiplication and division algorithms. In social studies, we are just finishing with unit one on Ancient Civilizations, and in science, we are ending our wonderful "hands-on" experience from the "Toys Matter" unit.



With help from Mrs. Healy, Mrs. Casazza, Ms. Warren and Ms. Stringer's fifth grade classes used their STEM and collaboration skills to create Thanksgiving Day Parade balloons, which will be attached to Indi Cars and paraded along a collaboratively designed route. First, students

learned to use the color sensors on the Indi Cars to program a path. Then, the class read *Balloons Over Broadway* before beginning to design their balloons. Using engineering skills, their floats are going to be "Parade Ready." Finally, the class worked together

to map out a parade route for their Indi Car "floats." We were so excited to bring this Thanksgiving STEM project to life!





Mrs. Tremblay's fifth grade class had a very special guest last month, Mr. Laddie A. Decker! During this very special visit, Mr. Decker taught the kids about the special history of LADSBS including the thought that went into the planning of the building's layout. He went on to share some important life lessons where he used a wood carving of his that contained four pillars: *family, friends, health* and *values*. In addition, Mr. Decker read The Kissing Hand which highlighted the idea that it's okay to feel scared sometimes but also encourages them to be brave and open to new experiences. Mr. Decker will return in the spring to visit all the children for "Laddie Day." Details will be provided.

Looking ahead, our December is going to be busy! We have our music concerts on December 4th, and we have our Holiday Spirit Week before the Winter Break begins. Thank you to all of our students and family for continuing to participate in our "Battle of the Grades" food drive collection. The competition among grade levels to collect the most items has begun!




