


Double Bless BCS on Giving Tuesday December 3, 2024

Congratulations BCS Swim Team!

The 2024 Swimming Season was a tremendous success, with our team of 19 swimmers from 6th to 12th grade showing impressive improvement throughout the year. Each swimmer focused on shaving time off their events and worked tirelessly to become faster and stronger. This dedication paid off, as eight swimmers advanced to Regionals, and five made it to the State Championships. Notably, Jack Freed, Brandon McCarther, Riggs Klika, and Jack Sallee competed in the 200 Medley Relay and the 200 Free Relay, while Jack Freed swam the 100 Backstroke and Riggs Klika raced the 100 Breaststroke. The youngest competitor for the entire Florida State meet was our very own BCS 8th grader, Makayla Muneio, who swam the 100 Freestyle. The 200 Medley Relay and Jack Freed's 100 Backstroke both finished in the top 16 at the state finals. Additionally, several school records were broken this season. We are excited to continue building on this success and look forward to taking even more swimmers to State next year!

Concussion Information- Facts & Myths

Concussions can occur in any sport. They very common in football, and also common in soccer and even wrestling, both of which are in season at BCS.

What is a concussion? A concussion is a mild traumatic brain injury (mTBI) that is often caused by a bump or blow to the head, or by a hit to the body that causes the head and brain to move rapidly back and forth. It's possible to sustain a concussion without even hitting your head.

Concussions can affect how student athletes think, learn, feel, act, and sleep. Sometimes symptoms will exacerbate with cognitive function and athletic participation, which is what we want to avoid.

Below are some common symptoms, red flags of when to seek immediate medical attention, and even some myths related to concussions. If you are concerned that your child has a concussion, always reach out to our athletic trainer, or a physician ASAP.

Common Symptoms

Headache, dizziness, fatigue, difficulty concentrating, difficulty remembering, difficulty falling asleep, pressure in the head, nausea, feeling slowed down, sensitivity to light and noise, confusion, feeling more emotional, and even sadness, nervousness, and anxiousness.

Red Flags

Red flags are those signs we notice that warrant your child being seen my medical professionals immediately, typically in the ER.

- Neck pain (along the spine)
- Seizures or convulsions
- Double vision
- Loss of consciousness
- Major muscular weakness or tingling/burning in more than one arm or in either legs
- Deteriorating conscious state
- Vomiting
- Severe or rapidly increasing headache and pressure in the head
- Visible deformity of the skull (head impact)

Common Myths

- 1. MYTH: A concussion only happens with a direct hit to the head. REALITY: The brain can move inside the skull with body movement or head movement without getting directly hit in the head. The brain movement can cause the concussion as it may make contact with the inside of the skull.
- MYTH: A concussion only occurs when one loses consciousness. REALITY: 90% of diagnosed concussions do not result in a loss of consciousness.
- 3. MYTH: You need to wake up someone every few hours if they have a concussion. REALITY: Some rest is good for the brain after injury. Unless directly told by your treating physician or healthcare provider to wake them up due to other concerns, sleep is beneficial for healing.
- 4. MYTH: Concussions can be mild, moderate or severe. REALITY: Concussions are no longer diagnosed by "severity" as the presence of signs and symptoms, cognitive difficulty, balance struggles, etc, dictate the presence of a concussion.
