A PLUS Driving School

A PLUS Driving School: Age 14-18

This 30-hour program will be conducted by a certified instructor from A+ Driving School and will fulfill the state driver's education requirement. The course will address the "how to" and "whys" of safe driving. The format of the class will be lecture and active discussion. After completion of the program, students will be able to set up and participate in behind the wheel sessions to meet the six hour state requirement.

Students may start classroom driving lessons at age 14, take the Knowledge Test and obtain their Instruction Permit at age 15, and take the Road Test and obtain their Provisional License at age 16. To be eligible to take the Road Test, students must have had their Instruction Permit for a minimum of six months.

The Driver's Education Program is divided into two phases:

Classroom Phase - teleconference/in-person: This phase includes the required 30 hours of classroom instruction that prepares the student to take the Minnesota permit test and to take on the responsibility of driving. If a lesson is missed, a make-up lesson can be arranged with the office at either the next White Bear session or at another of A+'s locations.

Behind-the-Wheel Phase After students pass the permit test, they are required to complete six hours of driving lessons. The lessons are provided in three, two-hour lessons. The lessons are one-on-one instruction with instructors licensed through the MN Dept. of Public Safety. Students can be picked up from and dropped off at home, school or work. Detailed information about scheduling the behind-the-wheel lessons will be provided.

Parent Involvement: A+ Driving School is proud to offer a parent informational meeting in White Bear Lake. Attending this class will meet the requirement to REDUCE the number of hours that students need to drive with a parent from 50 to 40 hours.

Early Childhood

Our District offers a diverse range of early childhood education options from family education, vibrant preschool programming and nature-based learning experiences. We partner with our early childhood special education team to provide support and services for our preschool students with exceptional needs. We are recognized as a 4-star Parent Aware preschool program, the highest rating possible in Minnesota.

Elementary


Our elementary students are assessed regularly in reading, math, and science using a variety of grade-level appropriate tools. To measure their progress against state standards, we utilize MCA tests. Students who need additional support or an added challenge receive personalized instruction.

Middle School

Middle school teachers and counselors use the MCA test, along with other data, to guide students in course selection. Instruction is personalized to meet the individual needs of each student.

High School

High school teachers assess students regularly using common assessments in each subject. Students also take nationally-normed tests like the PreACT, PSAT, and ACT at various points in their high school career. Counselors and teachers utilize this data, combined with knowledge of individual student goals and motivation, to help students select from a wide range of course offerings, including more than 250 courses and nine career pathways.



In addition to MCA data, White Bear Lake Area Schools utilizes a variety of local academic measures, including academic and social-emotional screeners, PreACT, ACT, and academic grades and credits, to apprise student progress.



District Launches Elementary Spanish Dual Immersion Program

The White Bear Lake Area School Board recently approved an Elementary Spanish Dual Immersion program, set to launch in Fall 2025. This program will be offered at Otter Lake Elementary and Matoska International, with each school hosting up to three kindergarten immersion classrooms for a potential total of six classrooms district-wide. Transportation will be available to resident families throughout the district for students enrolled in this program.

The new immersion program is designed to serve both Spanish-speaking and non-Spanish-speaking students together in a bilingual environment that values the contributions of every student and family. Participants will learn in a mix of English and Spanish, experiencing unique benefits such as academic growth, enhanced language and cultural understanding, social and emotional development, and expanded future opportunities.

"This is forward-thinking education. When I look in the job market, almost all of the employers want you to have a second language," said School Board Vice-Chair Angela Thompson, "I think this is another asset for our students. I'm really excited to see what this program does in the district."

Families will be able to select this option during the kindergarten registration process. Enrollment information will be mailed to all incoming kindergarten

families in December 2024, with

the enrollment window for the 2025-26 school year opening on December 16, 2024. Priority placement will be given to district students, with open enrollment applications considered after January 15, 2025.

"This program addresses the needs of families seeking unique educational options, including immersion programs, and it supports multiple goals in our district's strategic plan," said Dr. Wayne Kazmierczak, Superintendent of White Bear Lake Area Schools. "We're committed to creating a safe, nurturing environment for all students, personalizing education, and helping each student recognize and develop their unique talents."

Once the administrative move is complete, School Board meetings will also transition to the new School Board Room at Sunrise Park. By Fall 2026, the building will also house the Early Childhood Center and Transition Education Center.
