Students Put Their STEM Knowledge and Commitment to Character on Parade


It was a remarkable afternoon in the Elementary Media Center as our MAC (multi-age community) students demonstrated their enthusiasm for the annual project, "Balloons Over Schumann: A Parade of Character." With vision and support from Bailey Nett, Instructional Technology Coach, students applied a complex set of skills to imagine, plan, build, and program their Dash robots—complete with colorful balloon characters—to move along a parade route of skyscrapers. Student teams…

- were assigned a unique number of base-10 blocks (flats, longs, cubes) to create a varied skyline for the parade route (mathematics)
- selected a book character and explained how that character demonstrated a Pillar of Character (literacy & Character Counts)
- planned, designed, and decorated a balloon to attach to their robot (design & engineering)
- used Blockly code to program Dash robot "floats" to follow the parade route (programming)

The students invited family members, guests and other students to enjoy the show. Thank you to our students, Ms. Nett, and all our teachers!
