# Community Engagement Summary School Transformation

Minneapolis Public Schools values caregivers and considers them essential partners as we work together to support the educational journey of all students. As we consider our vision that all students - regardless of their background, zip code and personal needs, will receive an anti-racist, holistic education that builds essential knowledge to prepare students for future success, caregivers provide important feedback and information about students' lived experiences and needs. MPS is culturally and linguistically diverse and through our values: equity, representation and anti-racism, physical and emotional safety and wellbeing, relationships, trust and communication, shared decision-making and voice, transparency and accountability, and evidence-based strategies - we support our students as they pursue educational and personal growth and success.

In December 2023, the school board passed a resolution starting the process of school transformation. One of the key directives within that resolution was community engagement. As a first step, the Engagement Department decided to review the feedback we've received from parents over the past 10 years. Below is a summary of that feedback which included a review of 44 documents.

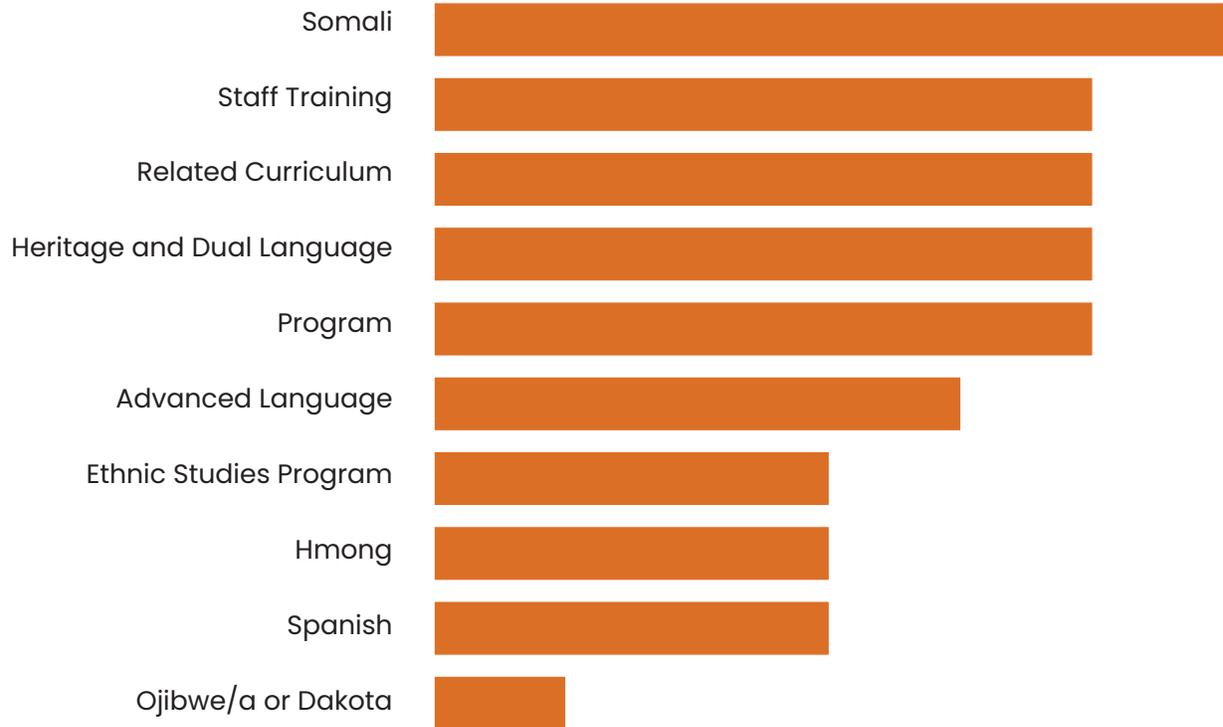

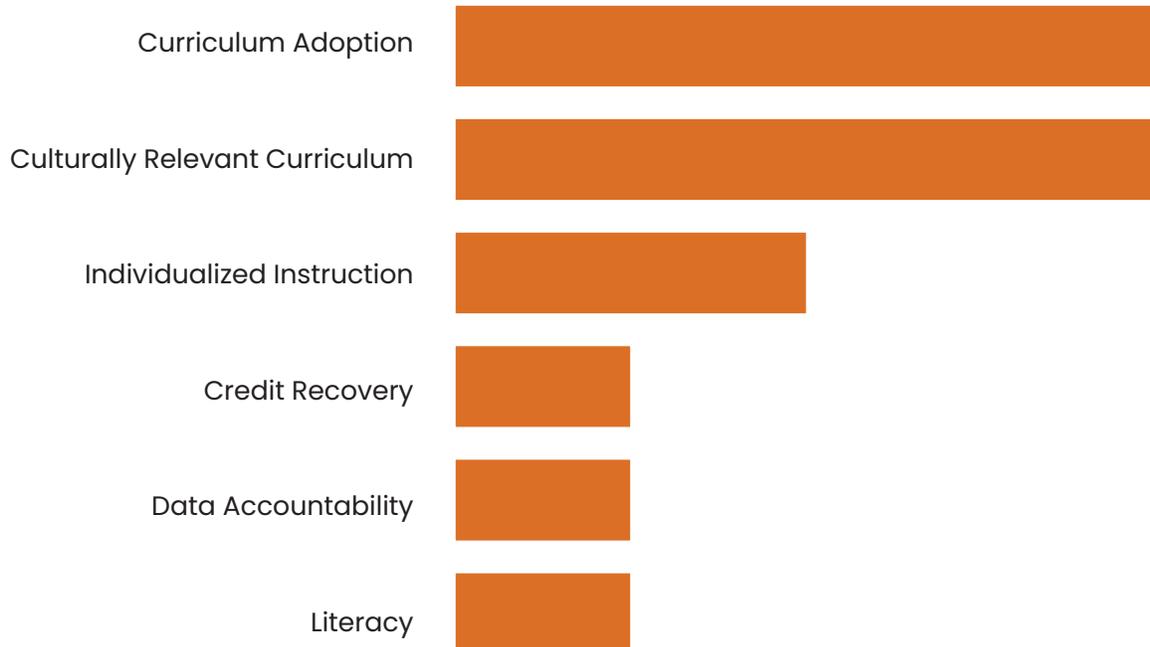
