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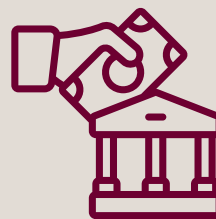

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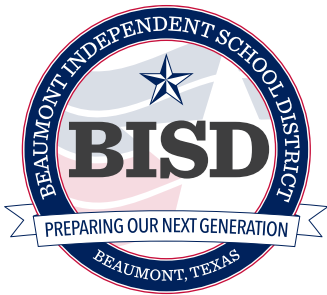

Beaumont ISD offers the convenience of online registration to our families for the 2024-25 school year.

Through the online registration process, parents have the opportunity of verifying and updating all student information in a matter of minutes. This can be done from home using most electronic devices.

Before beginning the online registration process, families are encouraged to have the required paperwork available to reference or

upload into the registration portal.

Visit the district website at www.bmtisd.com and click the online registration link on the homepage. Once on the site, you will click the appropriate icon on the page to begin enrollment/registration for your student(s).

Attendance Matters

The academic success of every student enrolled in Beaumont ISD is important. Daily school attendance and on time arrival are critical to this success. By attending school each day, students receive the benefit of teacher-led instruction, peer discussion, building each day's learning on the previous day's instruction, participating in a variety of school activities, and the opportunity to grow as individuals.

The state of Texas requires that a child who is at least six (6) years of age, or younger than six years of age and has previously been enrolled in first grade, and who has not yet reached the 19th birthday shall attend school, as well as any applicable accelerated instruction program, extended year program, or district-required tutorial session, unless the student is otherwise excused from attendance or legally exempt. Once enrolled in pre-kindergarten or kindergarten, even if under the age of six, the student is required to attend and is subject to all compulsory attendance laws. A student who attends or enrolls after his or her 19th birthday

is also required to attend each school day for the entire period instruction is offered until the end of the school year. If a student 19 or older has more than five verified unexcused absences in a semester, BISD may enact proceedings to revoke the student's enrollment for the remainder of the school year as permitted by state law. If enrollment is revoked, the student's presence on school property is thereafter unauthorized and may be considered trespassing.

The Beaumont Independent School District is deeply committed to partnering with parents to ensure the success of our students. The BISD administration sincerely hopes that attendance does not become an issue for any student or parent. To participate in the YMBL-BISD Fair Day, students

- must be in 3rd-12th grade
- have less than 4 days of in-school suspension
- cannot have any days out-of-school suspension or days of assignment to alternative centers for discipline purposes as of early March
- must have passing scores in all courses during the first semester
- must have passing scores in the third nine-week grading period
- must have 94% attendance



Campus Visitor/ Safety Update

While school layouts may slightly differ, the following visitor procedures will be consistent across the District and implemented on all elementary campuses.

- All visitors will enter the school through the front entrance vestibule.
- No visitors are allowed to enter the building with students upon arrival unless they check-in and receive a visitor's pass from the front office. A staff member will be located in the entry area vestibule to ensure compliance.
- All visits to the school will be made by appointment. Exceptions must be approved by campus administration.
- All visitors will enter the vestibule and access the intercom button, state their name, purpose of their visit and specify with whom they have an appointment.
- Visitors will be required to show photo identification to check-in utilizing the visitor management system. Acceptable forms of identification include: driver's license, Military I.D., passport or other state or government issued photo I.D.
- The visitor will be issued a visitor's pass to be affixed to their clothing on the upper chest/shoulder area clearly visible while inside the building. Failure to wear the visitor's pass may result in the visitor being asked to leave the campus.

- Visitors are prohibited from holding the door open for others behind them. Each visitor must be acknowledged individually through the intercom push button system.
- Parents/Guardians picking up their children early must notify the office in writing prior to dismissal. If it is an emergency, please contact the front office.
- Parent/Guardians dropping off items to their children will be required to attach their child's name, teacher's name, and grade level to the item and leave it with a staff member or in an area designated by the campus.
- Parents/Guardians that request to see students to give them items must enter the vestibule and show photo identification to check-in using the visitor's management system. All exchanges should be done in the school building in the presence of campus staff. Students should not be allowed to enter the vestibule to meet with any visitor.
- Front office staff are required to contact BISD Police and also notify campus administrators if a visitor is uncooperative, threatening or does not adhere to the procedures.

- **Cell phone use only allowed before or after school**

4-Year-Old Pre-Kindergarten Registration Information

To be eligible for Pre-K4 program, you must qualify in one of the following categories:

- Economically Disadvantaged
- Limited English Proficiency
- Homeless
- Foster Child
- Military

Register at your zoned Pre-K4 campus. Bring appropriate documentation:

- Child's birth certificate
- Child's Social Security Card
- Two proofs of parent/guardian's residency (recent utility bill, drivers license, etc.)
- Child's immunization records
- Proof of income: All pay check stubs for previous month
- Proof of SNAP or TANF
- Oral Language Proficiency Test if bilingual
- Proof of Military Status
- DFPS- Foster care letter

A child must be 4-years-old on or before September 1 to be eligible for the 4-Year-Old Pre-Kindergarten Program.

The District uses the Blackboard Connect messaging system that automatically calls the telephone number listed as the primary contact number for the student or their parents/guardians. Calls to nearly 17,000 students within 15 minutes are made to alert



our community about emergency closures and other important news.

As a parent/guardian, you are responsible for keeping your contact information current with your child's campus. Should you change a number, please make sure to update it promptly. BISD also uses the district's mobile app push notifications and Facebook pages to alert the community about emergencies.

Parents, students, and staff members are asked to also tune in to radio and television broadcasts in the event of inclement weather conditions or other emergencies that may necessitate the closing of schools. BISD partners with Southeast Texas media to share the District's decisions and procedures.

ALL Beaumont ISD Students

The safety and security of Beaumont ISD students and staff remains a top priority. Only clear or mesh backpacks are allowed for students in all grade levels, and no hooded garments are permitted. Failure to comply with the hooded garment policy may result in campus administration confiscating the clothing. Please refer to your child's campus policy regarding reobtaining confiscated items.



BISD Elementary Students

Red, white, or navy blue polo-style shirts with khaki or navy blue bottoms.



BISD Middle School Students

(includes Third Future Smith Middle School)

- **6th-grade:** White polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or navy uniform pants.
- **7th-grade:** Grey polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or navy uniform pants.
- **8th-grade:** School Color polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or navy uniform pants.



Pietzsch-MacArthur PK-8 Students

- **PK-5** will follow the BISD elementary uniform dress code.
- **6th-grade:** White polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or navy uniform pants.
- **7th-grade:** Grey polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or navy uniform pants.
- **8th-grade:** Dark green polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or navy uniform pants.



Third Future Smith Middle School

- **6th-grade:** Black polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or blue jeans (no holes or rips)
- **7th-grade:** Grey polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or blue jeans (no holes or rips)
- **8th-grade:** Maroon polo-style shirt with black, khaki, or blue jeans (no holes or rips)

Track Your Child’s Progress through Parent Self-Serve

Parent Self-Serve is a portal in which parents/guardians can access valuable information to help monitor their child’s success. Portal access allows for review of grades, attendance, classroom assignments and the ability to email teachers directly through your student’s schedule.

Parent Self-Serve access requires the student’s parent/guardian to apply online via the Parent Self-Serve link located on the District website while using the recommended Google Chrome internet browser. Only individuals identified in the student’s records as the parent or guardian may apply for access.

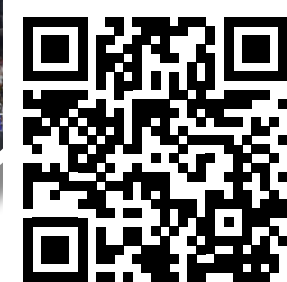
Parents/guardians will be held accountable for the proper use of the account. The District monitors the accounts and will suspend and/or revoke access if rules are violated. Inappropriate behavior includes:

- Using someone else’s account
- Accessing another individual’s records

- Gaining or attempting to gain unauthorized access to restricted information or resources
- Sharing passwords with anyone (including their child/children) or using Parent Self-Serve for any illegal activity (including violation of data privacy laws)

Maintaining the security of your child’s information is a priority for BISD. Setting up individual parent access involves several detailed steps that guarantee this security. Once these have been completed, the parent will only need to enter a username and password to access the information.

Parents/guardians in need of additional assistance with Parent Self-Serve should contact their child’s campus first and then Student Services.



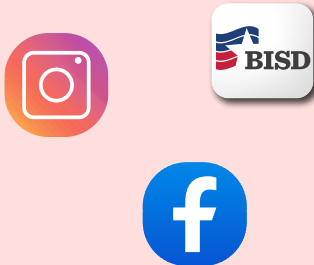

2024-25 Texas Minimum State Vaccine Requirements

Texas state law requires students in grades K-12 be up to date with all necessary immunizations or provide current exemption forms. Beaumont ISD understands the importance of making sure students are complying with all required vaccines and paperwork. Our school nurses continually monitor reports and contact

parents/guardians for those who are not meeting this requirement.

Parents, check your records or contact your school nurse to make sure your student is adhering to Texas state law. Starting September 11, 2023, students who are not up to date will be excluded from school.

Exclusion from school will take place during the year as students become delinquent. If you have questions about required immunizations, please reach out to your school nurse or BISD Health Service Coordinator Julie Nezat at 409-617-5879 or jnezat@bmtisd.com.

This chart summarizes the vaccine requirements incorporated in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Title 25 Health Services, §§97.61-97.72. This document is not intended as a substitute for the TAC, which has other provisions and details. The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is granted authority to set immunization requirements by the Texas Education Code, Chapter 38.

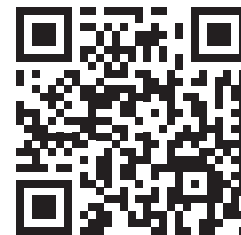

La Asistencia Importa

El éxito académico de cada estudiante matriculado en Beaumont ISD es importante. La asistencia diaria a la escuela y la puntualidad en la llegada son fundamentales para este éxito. Al asistir a la escuela todos los días, los estudiantes reciben el beneficio de la instrucción dirigida por el maestro, la discusión entre compañeros, la construcción del aprendizaje de cada día sobre la instrucción del día anterior, la participación en una variedad de actividades escolares y la oportunidad de crecer como individuos.

El estado de Texas requiere que un niño que tenga al menos seis (6) años de edad, o menos de seis años de edad y que haya estado inscrito previamente en primer grado, y que aún no haya cumplido los 19 años, asista a la escuela, como así como cualquier programa de instrucción acelerada aplicable, programa de año extendido o sesión de tutoría requerida por el distrito, a menos que el estudiante esté exento de asistencia o legalmente exento. Una vez inscrito en prekínder o kínder, incluso si es menor de seis años, el estudiante debe asistir y está sujeto a todas las leyes de asistencia obligatoria. Un estudiante que asiste o se inscribe después de cumplir 19 años también

debe asistir cada día escolar durante todo el período de instrucción que se ofrece hasta el final del año escolar. Si un estudiante de 19 años o más tiene más de cinco ausencias injustificadas verificadas en un semestre, BISD puede promulgar procedimientos para revocar la inscripción del estudiante por el resto del año escolar según lo permita la ley estatal. Si se revoca la inscripción, la presencia del estudiante en la propiedad de la escuela no está autorizada y puede considerarse como delito.

El Distrito Escolar Independiente de Beaumont está profundamente comprometido a asociarse con los padres para garantizar el éxito de nuestros estudiantes. La administración de BISD espera sinceramente que la asistencia no se convierta en un problema para ningún estudiante o padre. Procedimientos de manejo de visitantes

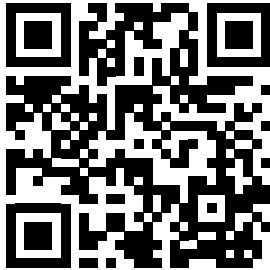

Requisitos mínimos de vacunas estatales de Texas para 2024-25

La ley del estado de Texas requiere que los estudiantes en los grados K-12 estén al día con todas las vacunas necesarias o proporcionen formularios de exención actuales. Beaumont ISD comprende la importancia de asegurarse de que los estudiantes cumplan con todas las vacunas y el papeleo requerido. Nuestras enfermeras escolares monitorean continuamente los informes y se comunican con los

padres/tutores de aquellos que no cumplen con este requisito.

Padres, verifiquen sus registros o comuníquense con la enfermera de la escuela para asegurarse de que su estudiante cumpla con la ley estatal de Texas. A partir del 11 de septiembre de 2023, los estudiantes que no estén al día serán excluidos de la escuela. La exclusión de la escuela tendrá lugar durante el año
