



GOAL AREA	Family & Community
STRATEGY	Increase engagement with families and community at large, including those without school-aged children and non-English speakers
RATIONALE	Family engagement is critical to student success and to feelings of belonging and inclusion in the school system; when families (including students) have critical information related to student needs, student opportunities for success are maximized
ACTION PLAN TITLE	Student Services Family Engagement
ACTION PLAN STEPS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Develop a library of resources related to topics relevant to student success to expand the Family Resource Center; example topics include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Safety (i.e., social media safety, healthy relationships, community safety topics) ○ Supporting student social-emotional/behavioral needs (i.e., supporting student behavior at home, understanding development, building resilience) ○ Understanding community resources related to various student needs ● Conduct workshops related to various topics in multiple formats (i.e., in person, via Zoom); example topics include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Attendance Matters (i.e., connection with academic success, understanding attendance policies/procedures in District 95) ○ Building Resilience in Students (i.e., how to help students persevere through difficult situations) ○ Safe Technology Use ● Increase communication overall related to attendance matters for both students and families (i.e., refined attendance concern notification process, newsletter information, direct teaching for students, “cheat sheets” or FAQ documents for families)
TIMELINE	The anticipated date of completion for this action plan is Spring/Summer 2025.
