Implemented a pay band structure that competitively and fairly compensates faculty based on their education, length of service, and workload.

EXPANDING FINANCIAL AID ACCESS

Secured \$5 million toward financial aid, ensuring the best students can thrive here, regardless of means.

EXEMPLARY FACULTY

Established the Thomas R. King '60 Family Teaching Chair, awarded on a rotating basis every three years to an exemplary member of the School's faculty, with an immediate \$10,000 stipend renewed annually for the duration of their tenure.

TRANSFORMING OUR CAMPUS FOR THE FUTURE

STATE-OF-THE-ART FACILITIES

The Thomas S. Perakos Arts and Community Center (TPACC) and The Lizzie and Jonathan Tisch Center for Innovation & Active Citizenship (The Lizzie) have transformed the west side of campus, offering cutting-edge spaces for students to grow as risk takers, innovators, and changemakers.

PLACE-BASED LEARNING

The addition of the TPACC Terrace, Koven-Jones Glade, and The Peng Family Terrace provides outdoor spaces that enhance the student experience, connecting academic and residential areas to the historic Quad and revitalizing the west side of campus.



RESIDENTIAL LIFE

Gunn's ten dorms, 36 faculty apartments, and 13 on-campus houses highlight our commitment to a residential community where students and faculty live, learn, and thrive together.



AN INTEGRATED CAMPUS

We aim to provide a holistic experience by relocating all dorms and the Health Center to the west side of campus, allowing us to reimagine the east side of campus for athletics and recreation. The past eight years have been transformational, but in many ways *we've only just begun.*

HONORING OUTDOOR LEADERSHIP

First conferred on Prize Night in 2024, the Honors in Outdoor Leadership distinction recognizes students who have exhibited leadership on extended outdoor expeditions, completed specific academic coursework in science and the humanities, earned certifications, and completed a Gunn Outdoors-approved Civic Changemaker Project their senior year.

ADVANCING DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP

Students in the Citizenship and Just Democracy (CJD) program's digital citizenship class have revived the Washington Eagle, the town's local newspaper, publishing and distributing each edition in newspaper boxes across town.

CENTER FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The Center for Entrepreneurship was established to cultivate ingenuity by challenging students to think creatively, strategize, and solve problems. Through courses such as Entrepreneurship and Ethical Business, Sports Business, Sustainable Business, and more, students develop essential skills for entrepreneurial success.

BEYOND GUNN

A four-year college counseling program was implemented in partnership with CJD, designed to help students identify their personal values, encourage self-reflection, and craft a compelling narrative that distinguishes them in the college application process.
