1. PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Welcome to our Academic Concentration Scholars!

Our first cohort has been established. We currently have 23 freshmen enrolled in STEM, Humanities and Civics.

STEM Workshop:

Our STEM students were invited to participate in either *Chemistry Chaos* or *GEARS*, presented by the Westchester STEM Alliance. Our chemists explored the role of catalysts on an exothermic reaction and the elements/chemical structures involved in the creation of Elephant Toothpaste. Our engineers designed robotics attachments like grabbers and wipers, following a structured process of designing, testing, and iterating on their creations. Students experimented with different gear sizes, spacing, ratios, and stabilization strategies, fostering a deeper understanding of gear mechanisms and enhancing their problem-solving skills in the realm of mechanical engineering.

Our Civics students attended a presentation by The Westchester Youth Alliance where they learned about identifying community issues, engaging decision makers, developing and spreading messages, creating meeting strategies, and monitoring and evaluating campaigns and advocacy efforts.


2. STUDENTS IN THE COMMUNITY
