




National Hand Washing Awareness Week December 2nd-8th

About Handwashing

Key points

- Many diseases and conditions are spread by not washing hands with soap and clean, running water
- Handwashing with soap is one of the best ways to stay healthy.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol to clean your hands.



Why it's important

Washing hands can keep you healthy and prevent the spread of respiratory and diarrheal infections. Germs can spread from person to person or from surfaces to people when you:

- Touch your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- Prepare or eat food and drinks with unwashed hands
- Touch surfaces or objects that have germs on them
- Blow your nose, cough, or sneeze into hands and then touch other people's hands or common objects

Key times to wash hands

You can help yourself and your loved ones stay healthy by washing your hands often, especially during these key times when you are likely to get and spread germs:

- Before, during, and after preparing food
- Before and after eating food
- Before and after caring for someone at home who is sick with vomiting or diarrhea
- Before and after treating a cut or wound
- After using the toilet
- After changing diapers or cleaning up a child who has used the toilet
- After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
- After touching an animal, animal feed, or animal waste
- After handling pet food or pet treats
- After touching garbage

How it works

Washing your hands is easy, and it's one of the most effective ways to prevent the spread of germs. Follow these five steps every time.

- 1. **Wet** your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap.
- 2. **Lather** your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
- 3. **Scrub** your hands **for at least 20 seconds**. Need a timer? Hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice.
- 4. Rinse your hands well under clean, running water.
- 5. **Dry** your hands using a clean towel or an air dryer.

Use hand sanitizer when you can't use soap and water

Washing hands with soap and water is the best way to get rid of germs in most situations. If soap and water are not readily available, you can use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. You can tell if the sanitizer contains at least 60% alcohol by looking at the product label.







Administration report:

October 2nd - Custodian Appreciation Day. We thank R.J., Jack, and Matt for the work they do for our district. R.J. during the school day is quick to help out when needs arise, which is greatly appreciated. R.J. and Jack were selected as our September Employees of The Month for all of their hard work assisting teachers getting their rooms set up and furniture, etc. moved around.

Want to thank Mr. Tim Wolf and The Vault for assisting with our Employee of The Month Recognitions. We give a \$50 gift certificate this year with half of the amount coming from my principal's budget and Tim donating the other half.

Professional collaboration early release time on Friday, October 11 will have teachers focusing on team student learning objectives. The purpose of these SLO's is to collaborate on common instructional strategies and assessments to bring about student growth in academic achievement in either literacy or mathematics. We will also be looking at target groups of students who are not categorized as proficient on state standardized tests and discuss strategies to move them into proficiency.

Channel 27 will be down tomorrow to do a feature on our girl's flag football group.

I've reached out to Darlington to begin the talks of the wrestling coop renewal. We would like to continue but if that is not mutual, we'd like to look so that it can happen with another school in the area.

I have had a request from a couple of students to look into Cross Country. I will discuss that further with them and just do some looking to see what that might look like.






