



In-Person & Online | Life Skills Program — For Adults with **Developmental Disabilities**

The Life Skills program is a unique educational program for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who are consumers of the Regional Center of the East Bay. The program offers a wide variety of classes to help students develop the skills necessary to achieve their life, work, and community goals. Instruction in independent living skills, social/ communication skills, job training, and community access are emphasized. Application required.



In-Person & Online | Transition Options Program (TOPS)

This program addresses the unique needs of adults with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) who have completed their high school diploma and are transitioning to higher education, independent living, and/or employment. The curriculum is comprehensive and specifically designed to meet the individual needs of participants. Application required.



In-Person & Online On Track — A Program for Adults with Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) or Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)

This program provides a structured environment that assists individuals with ABI/TBI to relearn old skills, develop new coping skills, increase independence, learn about community resources, build self-esteem, and improve cognitive skills. Emphasis is placed on understanding one's own injury, cognitive skill building, and personal goal setting. Application required.

Employment Training Internship Program

Preparing students for successful careers in partnership with local businesses



Workplace Essential Skills

This class is offered through a hospitality internship program and provides instruction in professionalism, workplace safety and vocabulary, communication skills, problem solving, and preemployment skills. In addition to classroom instruction, participants receive full workplace immersion training at a local hotel. This is a paid internship program. Participants must be a consumer of the Regional Center of the East Bay and have successfully completed the screening and interview process for the internship.

Vist Ability
