Careers Fair

Last week we held our annual careers fair, a chance for local employers and educators to visit our students and share their insights to the world of work and further education.

We had a wide range of visitors from local colleges-Hastings and Bexhill, to apprenticeship schemes, to local employers such as Herringtons Solicitors and local charities.







We even had our own pupils sharing their own weekend-jobs, with Ami Y9, who helps out at a Kickboxing school, showing Ms MacMillian her moves.

Every year group got a chance to attend the event and students left feeling inspired about the wide range of options they will have when they leave the academy

This week was Anti-Bullying Week, where we celebrated diversity and inclusion and raised awareness of the harms of bullying. On Tuesday we celebrated Odd-Socks day, with many students and staff coming in to school in mismatched pairs of socks to raise awareness and start discussions on what it means to be different. It was fantastic to see so many students taking part, with a wide range of crazy socks on display.

On Thursday we also held a special Anti Bullying workshop for local children from Sandown Primary. In these workshops the students discussed who bullying affects, from the bully to the victim to onlookers. They then created freeze-frames with the children. The workshop was a great success, a big well done to all the students who took charge and led our visitors.



BBB CHILDREN IN NEED

Last Friday 15th was our annual Children in Need fundraising day.
Our senior students pulled out all the stops, getting very creative in their fundraising events.

Over the course of the day they raised a whooping £784!!

There was the classic Dunk the Teacher, with dark-horse Mr Addison getting the ceremonial dunking (and then having to go to his afternoon meetings with green sludge still in his hair).

Y10 organised a car wash, with teachers paying the students to scrub their muddy cars during lunch. Y9 organised a three legged obstacle course race, where pairs of teachers battled it out, and students paid to buy dodgeballs which could then be pelted at the three-legged racers.





Y8 turned west hill into a fairground with their games, with some great prizes on offer such as lunch queue skip passes. Finally, Y7 broke bake sale records, raising just under £300 from their cakes! A huge number of Y7s bought in bakes for the sale, from some amazing cookie-monster cupcakes to delicious banana bread. Peer Mentor Scheme

At the beginning of the academic year, we launched a new Peer Mentor Scheme. Our Peer Mentors, from years 9 and 10, underwent specialised training from Anti-Bullying Quality Mark-UK to equip them with skills in safeguarding, confidentiality and effective communication. This training ensures they can provide safe, respectful support whilst recognising when to refer more serious concerns to a member of staff. They provide guidance and assistance, helping students with every day school concerns and offering a friendly face to whom other students can turn. The programme empowers students to share their experiences and tackle challenges together, from navigating school routines and building friendships to addressing issues such as bullying proactively. By creating an environment of mutual respect and empathy, the programme plays a vital role in promoting positive relationships. It also helps younger students feel more connected and supported whilst Peer Mentors gain valuable skills in leadership, empathy and communication. We are proud of our students' commitment to looking out for one another and are excited to see the positive impact of this programme on our school community.

Students are encouraged to visit East Hill at break and lunch times. This dedicated space provides a comfortable and welcoming environment where students can connect with a mentor for advice, guidance or simply a friendly chat.
