Dear Parents of Chesney Elementary School Champions,

Moreover, we believe that each and every child belongs to the CES family and that each and every child is endowed with unique gifts and talents. In addition, we believe that every single one of our champions can learn. This theme continues to further cement our pledge to ensuring that what happens each and every day in all classrooms results in student success. Our students' successes, big and small, are the essential keys that open pathways to a brighter future. At its heart, "Success for Each and Every Champion: The Year of Impact" is cemented in the collective talents, empathy, equity, will, passion, and dedication of all CES staff members. Regardless of our ages, backgrounds, or status, we are partners in the "Success for Each and Every Champion" and we (school and families) all are needed to bring it to life at Chesney Elementary School. Above all, we partner together for IMPACT!

We will continue our success in the 2024-2025 school year by providing each child with new challenges that result in rewarding school experiences. As we provide the best learning opportunities for your child this year, we ask for your support in reviewing the following information:

- Students should be dropped off in the car rider lane no earlier than 8:20 a.m. There is no adult supervision for students before this time. For the safety of all students, we kindly ask that all cell phone use be discontinued upon entering the car rider lane.
- Car riders may only be dropped off and picked up at the designated location, which is the side entrance to the school. Students arriving after 8:50 a.m. must be walked into the building by an adult.
- There will be no student check-outs after 2:50 p.m. in order to provide a safe and timely dismissal for all students.
- Changes in afternoon transportation should be made in advance. Telephone or email requests for changes in student transportation arrangements will not be honored. Please send a written note with a phone number from the parent or guardian. The note should be brought to the Front Office by the child to be signed and verified by a school official. If no note is received, the teacher will follow regular transportation procedures for the child. If a change must occur during the day, you will need to fax the school a written note indicating the change and include a picture copy of your picture ID in the fax. After you have faxed the note, please call the school to ensure that the fax was received.
- School dismissal is at 3:20 p.m. Car riders must be picked up before 3:50 p.m. After this time, car riders will be
 taken to the Front Office for parent contact. For the safety of all students, we kindly ask that all cell phone
 use be discontinued upon entering the car rider lane.
- The Gwinnett County Public Schools Transportation Department works with local schools to ensure bus safety for all students. To help your child have a successful experience, please review the following information:
 - 1. Make sure your child knows his/her bus stop location and time of pick-up.
 - Allow extra time during the first few weeks of school for your child to be dropped off at his/her bus stop. Bus drivers will carefully verify the names of all student bus riders and review bus safety rules.
 - 3. Gwinnett County Public Schools Transportation Procedure: For student safety, students can only have 1 transportation dismissal tag (bus rider, car rider or day care rider.) If a student has another form of transportation and does not ride the bus EVERY DAY, a written parent note must be provided for each day the student will ride the bus. The student will then receive a bus pass.

We are truly looking forward to a wonderful school year. To maximize instructional time with your child, teachers check their emails after student dismissal at 3:50 p.m. In the very near future, Chesney will be transitioning to ParentSquare and using it as its main form of communication. More information is forthcoming. On behalf of the Chesney Elementary School faculty and staff, I thank you for trusting us to provide your child with the best education possible. Let's have a CHAMPIONSHIP year TOGETHER!


- Los estudiantes deben ser dejados en el carril para automóviles no antes de las 8:20 am. No hay supervisión de un adulto

SCHOOL HOURS:

Students: 8:50 a.m. - 3:20 p.m.

ARRIVAL:

Students may enter the building at 8:20 a.m. A bell will ring signaling building entry. Car riders may be dropped off at the East side of the building when the 8:20 bell rings. Wait until the 8:20 bell before letting your children out of the car. There will be teachers on duty to supervise this arrival. For your child's protection, students may not arrive at school before 8:20 a.m. There is no adult supervision before this time.

Students should not be dropped off in front of the school OR the bus lane. All students arriving via car must use the car rider lane.

ATTENDANCE/TARDINESS:

Regular school attendance is essential to student achievement. Parents are responsible for notifying the school when their child is absent. A written note must be provided. Students arriving after 8:50 a.m. are tardy. All absences and tardies are recorded and annotated in student attendance. Students arriving after 8:50 a.m. must be accompanied by parents to the reception area and signed in for the day.

Students who arrive after 12:10 p.m. are counted as absent for the day. Parents of students who have excessive tardiness and absences will be contacted by a counselor to develop a plan designed to improve student attendance. Excessive tardiness and absences will result in a referral to the counselors, school social worker, and school administrators. If you move during the school year, please contact the Registrar.

MAKE UP WORK:

Assignments missed during a short or long-term absence must be made up upon return. Students have three (3) school days to make up all their work. If parents feel that the student can work at home, a message requesting make-up work must be received before 9:00 a.m. Make-up work requested before the aforementioned time can be picked up after 2:30 p.m. Requests for make-up work received later in the day (after 9:00 a.m.) will be honored the following day.

EARLY CHECK-OUT OF STUDENTS:

If you need to check your child out early, please park and come directly to the front office. Your child will be called to the office to meet you as you sign him/her out. For security reasons, please do not go to your child's classroom. The office will need to see proof of identification. If you do not have picture Identification students will not be released to you.

To maximize classroom instruction, there will be no checkout after 2:50 p.m.

DISMISSAL:

Cars are not permitted in the bus lanes between 8:10 - 8:50 a.m. and 3:00 - 3:50 p.m.

Walkers are dismissed at 3:15 p.m. Car riders are dismissed beginning at 3:20 p.m. In the afternoon, drive into the car rider lane on the east side of the school and wait in your car. Parents should not wait for the dismissal of children by classroom doors but are asked to remain in their cars outside the building to alleviate congestion in the hallways. As the students are dismissed, they are to wait inside the building. The adults on duty will supervise the loading of each vehicle. If you do not have a car rider number assigned to you, please pick up your card from the front office.

Buses and daycare vans are dismissed beginning at 3:20 p.m. The call for the second load of buses will occur as the buses arrive. Buses will be loaded from the front of the building. Daycare vans will load on the north side of the building.

Please Note: It is very confusing to young children to alternate between daycare, parent pick-up, and buses. Your child is more confident with a dependable routine. Should you need to change directions, write a note with a phone number indicating the change in your child's transportation home on the morning of the change. The child should bring this note to the front office by 9:00 a.m. to be signed and verified by phone by a school official. In the event of an emergency, a parent or guardian may FAX [(678) 542-2304] a note to the office before 2:45 p.m. No changes can be made by phone after 2:45 p.m. and/or on a day-to-day basis.

Students are expected to ride the bus to which they have been assigned and to get off at their assigned bus stop. ONLY in the event of an emergency, as determined by the principal or their representative, will a student be allowed to ride a different bus. Notification of this emergency must be sent to the school in a written note signed by the parent/guardian. The school administrator may provide a bus pass granting permission.

TRANSPORTATION:

County Transportation Phone Number is: (770) 338-4800 All students are encouraged to ride the bus. Riding the school bus is a privilege and improper conduct on the bus, especially fighting, will result in that privilege being denied.

CELEBRATIONS:

Chesney Elementary students will have two parties each school year – a Winter party and an End of Year party. Parties should remain in the classroom and should not include outside vendors.

For student birthdays, parents may purchase ice cream for the class at \$1 per student. This ensures that the

school can protect students with allergies. Please communicate with your child's teacher in advance if you intend to purchase ice cream for a birthday. Our students' safety comes first. In addition, birthday parties are not allowed at school, and invitations may not be given out at school. Balloons, flowers, etc. may not be delivered to children at school or taken home on the bus.

ICE CREAM PURCHASES

Ice Cream is purchased from the school for \$1.00 on Fridays and not to be included with meal payments. This is a separate function from the cafeteria and monies are collected by school personnel.

SCHOOL VISITATION: SCHOOL CLINIC:

ALL visitors are required to go to the reception area to sign in and receive a visitor's badge. Anyone not wearing a visitor's badge will be asked to go to the reception desk. As a courtesy to the teacher, please notify your child's teacher 24 hours in advance when you would like to make a classroom visit. Requests for classroom observations must be approved by the principal and if approved will be limited to no more than 45 minutes under the supervision of an administrator. It is important that teachers maximize the use of instructional time with students. Parents are not permitted to conference with teachers when students are in the classrooms. At the discretion of the principal, visitation may be limited throughout the school year.

MESSAGES TO TEACHERS:

Calls will be received by the school between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Instructional times cannot be interrupted for incoming calls. A message will be given to a teacher upon your request. In an emergency, the office staff will take information during regular office hours. ParentSquare is a school-wide parent communication tool. Messages can be sent directly to teachers. A response can be expected within 24 to 48 hours.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES:

Our school system provides student/parent conferences twice annually. In addition to these two planned conference times, parents, teachers, students, and administrators may initiate additional conferences.

EARLY RELEASE DAYS:

- October 23 & 24, 2024
- March 5 & 6, 2025

The students will be dismissed at 12:50 p.m. on both days. Please make certain that all transportation & child-care arrangements PRIOR to these days, and that your student knows what that arrangement is. Please contact the teacher by email or ParentSquare so they are aware of how your child will go home on these days.

MESSAGES TO STUDENTS:

Office staff will accept messages for students only in the event of an emergency. Students are not permitted to use telephones. If an emergency exists, a school official will call the student's home.

SPIRIT DAY:

The clinic is provided for school-related illnesses or injuries. It is not meant to take the place of your personal physician. If your child becomes sick or injured while at school, the school clinic worker will contact the parent.

Please note that accurate and current information is critical in case of emergencies. Please ensure that the office and your child's teacher always have accurate, current work, home, and emergency telephone numbers.

No child is to carry medication on his/her person. All medication must be housed in the clinic. Parents need to obtain a medication form for any medicine dispensed over an extended period. Please do not send your child to school sick or with a note requesting that the teacher send the child to the clinic to be checked.

It is the responsibility of the parents to see that children receive medical care.

STUDENT DRESS CODE:

Students and school visitors are expected to dress in a manner appropriate for school.

- Shoes are to be worn at all times. Shoes with wheels are not permitted.
- Bare midriffs, halter tops, tube tops, fishnet football jerseys (alone), and spaghetti straps (less than 2 inches wide) are not permitted.
- The length of shorts and skirts should be below the fingertips.
- Clothing with inappropriate language and/or pictures is not permitted.
- Hair color or haircuts that distract from the learning of other students are not permitted.
- ◆ Hats, bandanas, sunglasses, visors, etc are not to be worn unless a specific day is set aside for this purpose. Students who do not meet the dress code will change into clothing kept in the clinic. For repeated violations, the student will be asked to call home so that parents may bring clothing to school.

CLOSING OF SCHOOL DUE TO WEATHER:

If inclement weather causes the delay or closing of school, it will be announced on the radio on station WSB 750 AM, the district's website:

as well as local television stations.

Spirit Days are held on Fridays. On these days, students and staff members may wear Chesney spirit wear.

TEXTBOOKS:

The school district provides textbooks for all students. Every student is responsible for his / her textbooks. Textbooks and other school materials must be paid for if lost, stolen, or damaged. Students may also access their textbooks online via "My eClass."

FRIDAY FOLDERS:

Each Friday, every student at Chesney brings home a "Friday Folder." This folder will be of great value to you as a parent. Located inside will be: graded papers completed by your child, school letters and announcements of upcoming events and your child's conduct report for the week, and for Grades K — 5: Agenda Books. Please go over the papers with your child. Sign the folder and return it to school each Monday.

COUNSELING:

We have professional school counselors. These counselors work with all children at every grade level. Counselors support the academic environment by providing classroom lessons in areas such as problem-solving, study skills, decision-making, and drug awareness. Our school counselors also work with students in small groups as well as individually at the request of the student, the teacher, or the parent. Counselors are available for consultation with all Chesney parents on topics such as family changes and crisis, academic achievement, and social issues. Please ask your child which counselor works with his / her class and call the front office to speak to the correct counselor.

CAFETERIA PROCEDURES:

Breakfast is served in our cafeteria from 8:20 a.m. to 8:50 a.m. There is no charge for student breakfast. Absolutely no charges are allowed for breakfast meals. To encourage good nutrition, a well-balanced lunch is offered daily for \$2.50 and adult lunches for \$4.00 You may send cash or a check (with a phone number on it) to cover the cost of meals. You may also pay on ParentVue with a check, debit, or credit card.

When a student forgets or loses money, he/she may charge lunch for that day. Payment is expected the next day. Charge letters are sent home and emailed several times weekly.

Eligible students receive meals free or at a reduced price. Applications should be completed each year and are available in the front office or in the cafeteria.

- No "fast food" or carbonated drinks are to be brought into our school.
- Students are not allowed to use microwaves.
- Staff cannot heat items for students.

Chesney is closed if it is announced that "Gwinnett County Schools" are closed. Please do not call the school. These stations will have the most up-to-date information by 6:00 a.m..

WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE:

It is especially helpful to have at least a 24-hour notice when a student withdraws. This gives the teacher time to average grades and determine if all textbooks and library books have been turned in and fees have been paid. If such notice is not provided, we may be unable to give the parent the withdrawal information necessary for entrance into another school.

GIFTED EDUCATION:

The Gwinnett County Public Schools gifted education program serves students in grades K-12 by providing academic challenges for those who are intellectually advanced. Chesney Elementary School provides gifted and enrichment services via the gifted clustered and enrichment classroom model.

The classes offer accelerated learning and enriched academic curriculum experiences that focus on and extend Gwinnett County Public Schools' Academic Knowledge and Skills.

Students are identified and placed in gifted education based on criteria established by the Georgia General Assembly and the Georgia State Board of Education. Students who transfer from gifted education programs within the state of Georgia have reciprocity into the Gwinnett program providing the original placement was correctly completed. Students who transfer from out-of-state must meet Georgia requirements. Parents should notify the school when registering their child that he/she was identified as a gifted education student in their previous school.

STUDENT RECOGNITION PROGRAMS: PERFECT ATTENDANCE:

Students with no absences or tardies during the school year will be recognized by their classroom teacher at the end of each semester and the end of the school year. Any tardies or absences, excused or unexcused will eliminate the student from earning a perfect attendance award.

SEMESTER STUDENT RECOGNITION PROGRAM:

Our goal is to recognize every Chesney student sometime during the school year. Students receive recognition awards for:

- Principal's Honor Roll Good Citizenship
- Honor Roll
 Perfect Attendance
 - Most Improved Student

GRADING PROCEDURES:

Curriculum Night is scheduled during the first full month of school. At this time, the teachers will explain specific grading policies and procedures. Progress reports are sent out at the end of the four grading periods (every 9 weeks).

The Gwinnett County curriculum is called the Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS). The AKS can be found on

No parent lunch visitation during August, during weeks of testing, and as designated by the school.

STUDENT REPORT CARDS & AKS:

Parents will receive formal progress reports on student progress each semester. These report cards will reflect the student's proficiency in their grade level Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS).

Students who are experiencing difficulty with their grade levels' AKS could be considered for retention in the spring and will be placed on an Academic Contract signed by the parent or guardian. A child can be placed on a contract at any time throughout the school year.

OUR CURRENT GRADING SCALE FOR GRADES 2 – 5 IS AS FOLLOWS:

Unsatisfactory Progress = U Below 70

Satisfactory Progress = C 70 - 79

Above Average Progress = B 80 - 89

Excellent Progress = A 90 or above

Kindergarten and first-grade students' progress is reported as:

E – Excellent

S - Satisfactory

N - Needs to improve

U – Unsatisfactory

Students are promoted to a higher grade or retained based on academic achievement (grades), mastery of their grade level Academic Knowledge and Skills (AKS), grades and based on State assessment results. The school's Student Support Team (SST), with teacher input, will determine if the student possesses the Academic Knowledge and Skills necessary to be reasonably successful at the next grade level. The decision of the SST Committee will be final.

GRADES:

Each grade level will have the following:

- At least 2 grades per week in math
- At least 1 grade per week in reading
- At least 1 grade per week in writing
- At least 1 grade per week in science
- At least 1 grade per week in social studies
- At least 5 9 grades per quarter in health
- Classroom assignments: 50%
- Summative Assessments*: 50%
- *5% of District Assessments included in Summative Assessments.

CHESNEY BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Our faculty believes that self-discipline is the goal of every student. We know that every child can learn if a positive classroom climate is established that includes maintaining firm, fair, and consistent management practices. The Chesney family also believes that positive discipline results from personal relationships and building community rather than any one particular technique or system. Chesney is a school that utilizes Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). Students have the opportunity to be recognized for demonstrating expected behaviors. Our Chesney rules are:

- Be Ready to learn in all settings of the school
- Be Responsible for yourself and your materials
- Be Respectful of other people and property

weeks. Kindergarten students may have two books at a time and all other students may have four books at a time. Students will not be permitted to check out a new book until all overdue books have been returned. In the event a book is lost or damaged, students will be asked to pay for the book to be replaced.

HOMEWORK:

Home study is a necessary part of each pupil's educational program. Each student will be expected to spend some time in addition to scheduled class instruction to achieve satisfactory work. Some assignments are long-range in nature and require planned study time for their completion. A general rule for determining the amount of time your child should spend doing homework is 10 minutes multiplied by his / her grade level. Remember this is only a guide. Homework times may vary based on planned study time for projects. Your child's teacher can tell you if your child's homework study time needs to be adjusted.

EFFECTIVE STUDY HABITS:

Parent Support and Tips:

- Have students relax/ snack/ play after arriving home from school.
- Have a consistent time for the student to complete his or her homework.
- Have a consistent place that can be monitored by an adult where the student can complete his or her homework.
- Allow the student to work on his or her homework on their own (support once the student has worked on his or her own and has demonstrated effort).
- Work with the student once he or she feels like they have completed their work (Please note that the teacher uses the student's work to determine support and instruction).
- Encourage your child to read at least 20 minutes daily.
- Let your child know that he or she has done a great job!

The faculty and staff at Chesney are committed to providing students with a safe, secure, and enjoyable school. We purposefully teach how leaders behave and grow to become contributing citizens. Playground

Safety Plan. These plans detail each staff member's responsibility as well as specific evaluation routes, safe rooms in the event of dangerous weather, and how to hold safety drills each month. These plans are developed with the safety of all children in mind. The plans have been created with input from the school faculty and CES community. All faculty and staff members are required to review the plans to ensure that each person is aware of their duties during an emergency. As part of our school safety plan, fire drills, tornado drills, and lockdown drills are held at intervals throughout the school year.

USE OF THE INTERNET

Students at Chesney Elementary School have access to many instructional tools such as computers, video, audio, and the internet. Access to these tools is a privilege. Student Expectations for Technology Use
