 In light of this procedural determination, it is all the more important that the task force not act as a Star chamber and/or grand jury (as was recommended by another task force representative) which would preclude members from speaking publicly about discussions that take place during the course of this process, and sharing their stance on what should be the ultimate outcome.

The depth and breadth of experience of those serving, and our individual and collective commitment to assuring that a sound decision is made with respect to the future of William Penn, requires that our efforts be transparent, in actuality, and incorporate the continuing concerns and opinions of non-task force members so that the best, and most inclusive proposal for beneficial, adaptive reuse of the site may be brought forth. One that the community as a whole will be comfortable in supporting. In order to accomplish this, task force members, who so choose, must be free to communicate with the community and deliver their concerns to the group for review and consideration.
