

# Lambert School's Re-opening Plan, 2020

Approved by LPS School Board on 7/27/20 & then adjusted & approved on 8/21/20, as well as 12/21/20, 3/23/21, 7/20/21, 11/22/21, 7/28/22, and 6/27/23

Update from RCHD (7/29/20): to clarify when a student or staff member should stay home or return to school – “Stay home until at least 24 hours after the person no longer has a fever (temp of 100.4 or higher) or signs of a fever (chills, feeling very warm, flushed appearance, or sweating) without the use of fever reducing medicine (e.g. Tylenol).”



# POSITIVE POINTS SINCE MARCH:

✓ All came together quickly, patiently, for common cause for our students. (thanks to School Board, staff, students, parents, community)

✓ 100% internet accessibility

✓ Support students educational needs, as well

## SOME CHALLENGES, HOWEVER:

- ✓ Virtual learning is not preferred by most of our constituents
- ✓ Technology is great, but best serving as a support tool
- ✓ Social-emotional need for connectedness/in-person learning exists for most
- ✓ Tough situation for working parents, as well as stay-at-home parents
- ✓ Educational needs for most include activities outside the “classroom”

- Same as the students

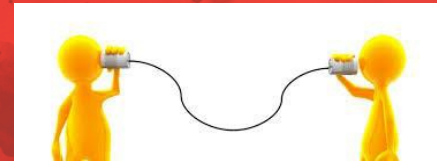
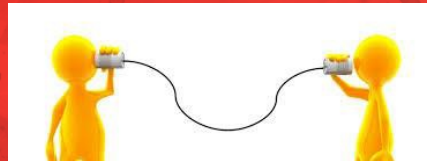
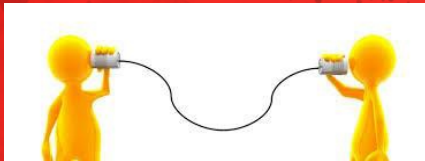
## ✓ Visitors to campus:

# FACE COVERINGS (masks or shields):



- ✓ — Upon the Governor's directive, face coverings will be worn by students 5 years old and above, depending on the active case count in the school's county. Face coverings are encouraged. Face coverings must be worn when the active case count is 4 or more. With the additional clarification from the Governor as of 8/20/20 face coverings may be removed in our class spaces, as we are able to social distance in those areas. Teachers teaching one-on-one must adhere to the face covering mandates, as well as their student.
- ⊖ — Admin will check the Health Dept report each day, to determine the next day's protocol. If there is a change, parents will be notified via Messenger, and students and staff will be notified over the inter-com. District will provide face coverings, if students/staff request them. They may bring their own from home, but must wash them each evening before wearing them the next day.
- ⊖ — Masks provided by the school are disposable and good for one day. Shields provided by school will be worn home and then back to school. Teachers will have all students sanitize their shield during announcements.

# Protocol for spring activities:

✓ Lambert Public School and the Board of Trustees has decided to allow fans to attend HS basketball games @ Lambert on a trial basis, and with the following VERY IMPORTANT COVID-19 protocol, in order to do our best to keep our athletes, fans, and communities safe: **Spring activities will resume as normal, but protocol by host must be adhered to, as is necessary (MCT, MHSAP protocol for spring sports, etc)**

1. Please be courteous and stay home if you are sick and/or showing any symptoms of illness.

~~2. Please wear a face covering at all times in the building.~~

~~3. Fans must sit in family pods and in the reserved section for your team (this will be marked off). Students/young people may attend but only in the care of their parent(s) or another adult family member.~~

~~4. Fans should stay in their pod if possible., unless they are grabbing something from the concession stand, or they need to use the restroom. Our concession area will be clear of traffic.~~



~~5. Handsanitizer will be available as fans enter the gym.~~

~~Please use this as you come in.~~

~~6. Grab and go concessions will be available, and fans are allowed to enjoy their concession items when they are back in their family pod area in the bleachers.~~

~~7. Our teams and coaches are under the MISA protocol, and must sit together in their team pod area with a face covering on at all times, unless individuals are playing in their game.~~

# SCENARIOS



# SCENARIO 1– PHASE 1– All students learning remotely

- ✓ Mandate by Government or Health Department
- ✓ May be long or short term
- ✓ Move into this in a fairly short amount of time
  - Staff and students will be prepared ahead of time, just in case; similar to last spring w/ some adjustments
  - IEP work and minutes will be met via Google Meet/Classroom, MSA will drive sports,
- ✓ Longer than a week? Additions to the regular lessons, classes



# SCENARIO 2— PHASE 2— LPS on campus

- ✓ ~~Temps @ home in the morning; students bring their own water bottles. Brian will explain the bus, as we have contracted this out to Ligon Buses.~~
- ✓ ~~No gym play before school; students may play outside or go to classroom~~
- ✓ ~~All classroom spaces will be arranged for social distancing to occur for students & staff. Group work will occur only if students wear masks.~~



~~\*7-12 social areas will be arranged and rotated for distancing; lockers spaced; avoid these as much as possible~~

~~\*Elem will stay in classrooms; move for PE and music~~



- ✓ All will have hand sanitizing available; teachers will sanitize desks and room between classes or groups
- ✓ Library will be coming to classroom; PE will be outside as much as possible; music will be in old gym for larger classes (band will involve more stringent sanitization); Vo-ag has an additional shop & more classroom space
- ✓ Lunch times will be staggered, students will eat in pods, overflow area in gym, can eat outside on nice days. Breakfast will be fairly regular, with students coming in & social distancing; eating in pods or outside/possibly in classrooms



- ✓ Outside classrooms available & encouraged
- ✓ Quarantine/Holding room will be in Mrs. Simonsen's office
- ✓ Temp checks once/week @ school to get some baseline data, possibly
- ✓ Lessons will be recorded & available for students absent
  - Proficiency-based grading system in place. Data will continue to assist in serving students' needs, as it has been in the past (K-12 MAPS testing, K-6 STAR reading & math, and teacher observation create our student data utilized in quarterly instruction team data meetings).
- ✓ Possible classroom visits for assemblies
- ✓ Room re-organization/assignments (for this year & long-term)

# Social/Emotional Needs Addressed:

## ✓ For students:

- PAWSteam in place for staff referrals in the event there is need for potential assistance from school & guidance.
- Adjustments made to PRIDE program, so those types of students interactions are still addressed, but in a more protective way (Thanksgiving BINGO/community service, Easter Egg hunt/activities, end-of-school PlayDay)

## ✓ For staff:

- Admin included time for social/emotional education, as well as activities to address stress and other issues arising throughout the year
  - — PIR Stress workshop @ 1<sup>st</sup> PIR
  - — Scheduled a workshop pertaining to this area
  - — Activities w/ staff to help strengthen relationships and bonding, but with COVID protocol in place (fall activities during PIR, Christmas sip and paint, Staff Appreciation Week)

# ADDITIONAL SANITIZATION ROUTINE:



- ✓ Daily cleaning w/ COVID-effective cleaning solutions
- ✓ Extra cleaning of high traffic areas 4 times throughout the day
- ✓ Deeper cleaning on Fridays or days prior to breaks
- ✓ Attempt to keep school empty or limited area on weekends
- ✓ Head Cook will develop her cleaning routine
  - Additional server added during lunch
- ✓ Playground disinfected daily
- ✓ Sporting events routines will be developed this week
