SV ACADEMICALLY ADVANCED COURSES

Add-on weighted value for the following courses (no weighted divisor):

- 23 Advanced Placement (AP) - 0.08 for full year
- 39 College in High School (CHS) - 0.08 for full year
- 39 Honors - 0.04 for full year

Can take as many weighted classes for which you qualify, but the weight obtained each year will be capped: **9th Grade: 0.26 cap; 10th Grade: 0.34 cap; 11th Grade: 0.48 cap; 12th Grade: 0.48 cap**

Must obtain a "C" grade (70%) or better and must complete the course *to earn the weighted add-on* for the course
