Membership Guidelines

 parents or guardians of students with disabilities currently enrolled in Clayton County Public Schools

or

Individuals acting in the roles below are not eligible to be P.A.C.E.S member or participant due:

- Lawyers
- Advocates
- Community Officers
- Vendors
- District Employees (may be invited as a guest speaker)



Standard Operating Procedures



Meeting Norms



- Respectful Communication: Listen actively and speak respectfully to each other.
- *Confidentiality*: Respect the privacy of members, students, and families.
- **Stay Focused on Mission and Goals**: Keep individual input and discussions relevant to the group's purpose and designated topics.
- Constructive Feedback: Offer feedback in a supportive, respectful and constructive manner.
- **Equitable Participation:** Encourage all members to participate and share their perspectives.
- Preparedness: Come to meetings prepared.
- **Punctuality and Time Management:** Join meetings on time.
- **Be Solution-Oriented**: Focus on working together *Follow-Up on Actions*: Commit to following through on assigned tasks



Family Liaison Role and Responsibilities

The DES Family Liaisons...

- Are representatives of the Georgia Department of Education's
 Parent Mentor Partnership program and parents/guardians of children with disabilities
- Bridge any gaps between families and the school district
- Facilitate communication and collaboration
- Promote parent engagement
- Provide training and resources
- Lead P.A.C.E. meetings



Parent Advisor Leader (PAL) Role and Responsibilities

PALs will:

- Lead groups, facilitate open communication, promote parent engagement, and maintain a collegial environment.
- Support productive dialogue and champions positive changes that promote inclusion, equity, and success for all students with disabilities.
- May be asked to serve on department or district committees, representing P.A.C.E.S and the perspectives of a parent of a student with a disability.



- Parent members interested in serving as a PAL should share their interest with the school administrator
- PALs are required to complete a comprehensive 4-hour training course conducted by the Clayton County Public Schools' Department of Exceptional Students' representatives or designees
- All candidates who complete the PAL's training will be assigned as a PAL
 for the school year during which they completed the training course
- If/when the number of PALs exceeds the number needed to lead P.A.C.E.S groups, PAL duties will be rotated monthly
