What is a School Plan for Student Achievement?

Each year, the school community collaboratively develops a plan to increase student learning and wellbeing.

The SPSA is a living document that is continually updated to reflect students' needs.

The School Site Council approves the site's SPSA, which is then taken to the School Board for final approval.



What is a School Plan for Student Achievement?

The SPSA has four focus areas:

- 1) literacy
- 2) math
- 3) parent engagement
- 4) school culture/climate.

School funding and decisions must align with the goals and strategies found in the site's SPSA.

School Plan for Student Achievement

Part 1 Determine Student Need

SPSA goals are based on data analysis to determine student & school needs.

Data can include:

- Assessment & Classroom Data
 - Examples - iReady, State assessment, Dashboard, Classroom assessment
- Surveys
 - Examples - Student surveys & Parent surveys

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Part 2 Develop a Plan to Increase Student Achievement

Using the information from the data analysis, SPSA goals & strategies are developed to increase student success.

Focus Areas and Strategies:

- 1) Literacy
- 2) Math
- 3) Parent Engagement
- 4) School Culture & Climate

School spending & decisions are then aligned with these goals & strategies.

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Part 3 Implement and Monitor Plan

After the School Site Council approves the SPSA, it becomes the guiding document to support all school decisions and purchases.

The SSC meets throughout the year to:

- approve spending that aligns with the adopted SPSA goals and strategies
- continue to monitor student success through data and recommend changes as needed
- review student programs to ensure the various learning needs of all students are met

2023-24 SPSA Development

September - October

- School staff reviews student data and begins developing draft goals and strategies
- A draft SPSA is presented to the SSC for review and feedback

November - December

- Final SPSA draft presented to SSC/ELAC for approval and signatures

January

- Site SPSAs presented to OVSD School Board for approval
