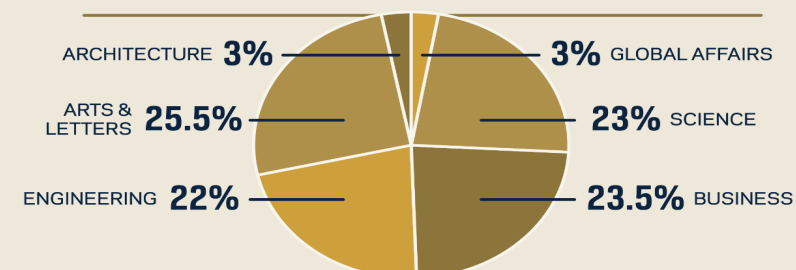

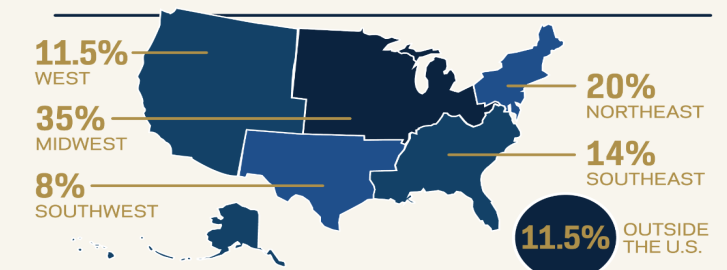

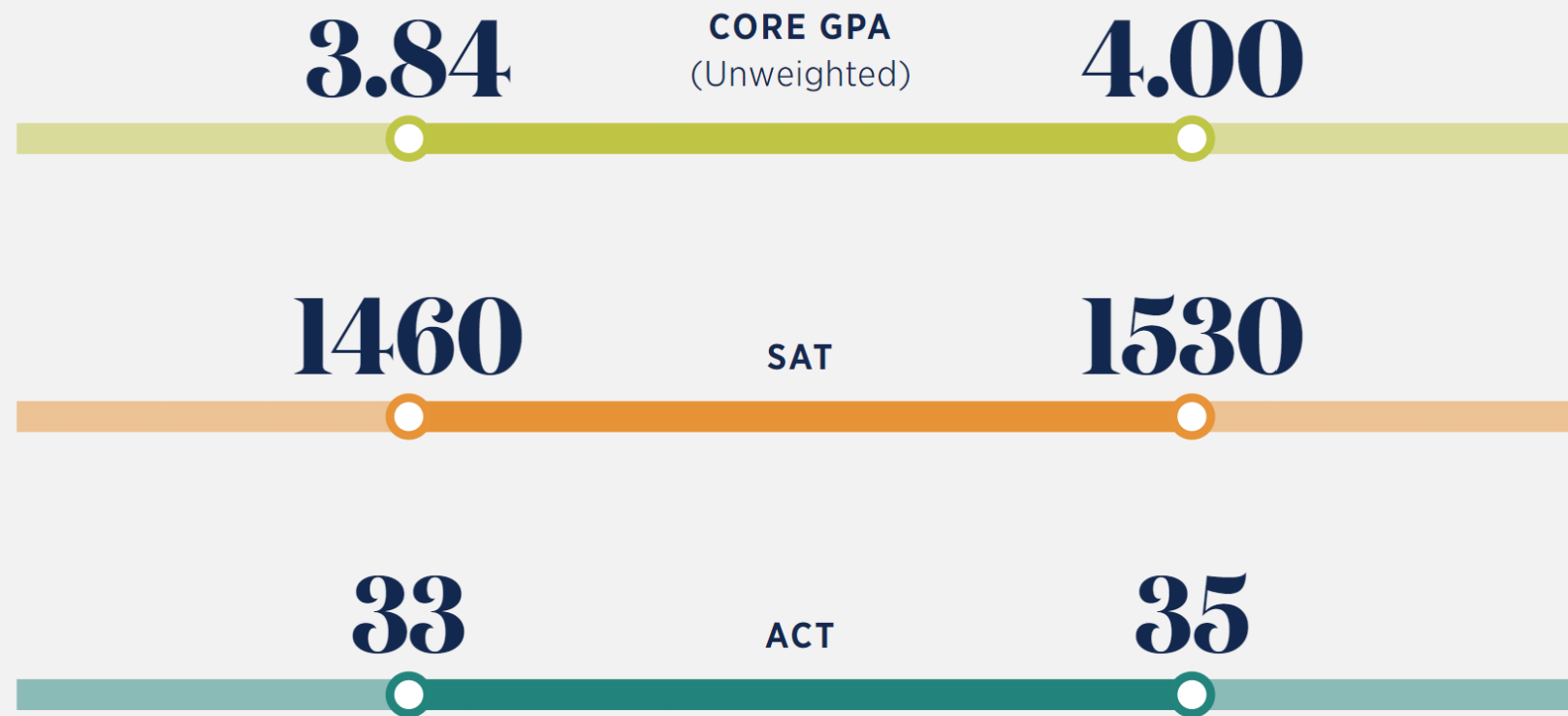

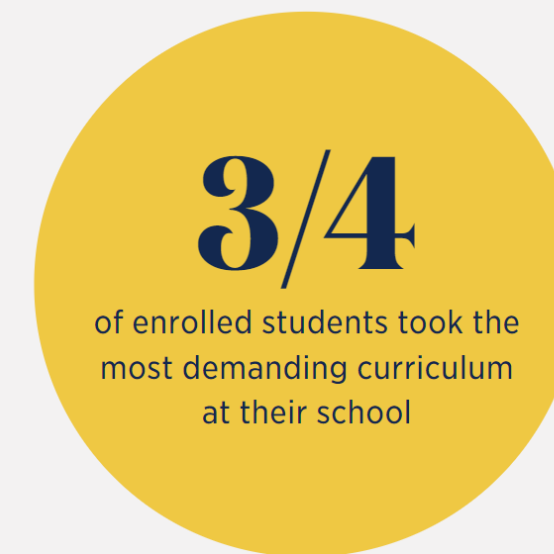

11th grade: Schedule postsecondary planning meeting
9th and 10th grade: School Counselor meetings

Use your PSAT results to help finalize a testing plan and prep if needed.

Begin crafting a list of colleges that fit with your priorities. Use Scoir to stay organized.

Work hard in school to earn the best grades you can this year!

Choose a schedule for next year that reflects an appropriately challenging courseload and your academic interests.

Visit college campuses, if you are able. If not, look for virtual tour opportunities, and/or attend local college fairs.

Check Schoology, Instagram, and the Radnor Reader for resources, announcements and updates.

Practical Tips: Students

- Create an email account specifically for college purposes (and check it often!).
- Opt in for Student Search Service when registering for tests like SAT and ACT. Colleges spend tens of thousands of \$\$ on buying these lists for a reason.
- Your future, your experience. Shut out the noise.
- Remember, all the parental nagging is actually love.

Practical Tips: Parents

- Limit the college conversations at home to once a week, for example. Pick a time that works best to have “the talk”.
- Center your child and who they are. Shut out the noise.
- Help your child focus on FIT, instead of name, as they research colleges.
- Remember: college admissions has changed since our time. We cannot solely rely on our experience to guide our students.
