What is FIRST?

- Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas
- Developed by Texas Education Agency in response to Senate Bill 875 of the 76th Texas Legislature in 1999
- 2023-2024 rating calculations based on data from **2022-2023**



Goal of School FIRST Ratings

The primary goal of School FIRST is to achieve quality performance in the management of school districts' financial resources, a goal made more significant due to the complexity of accounting associated with Texas' school finance system.

Argyle ISD has received the state's highest rating for 22 years.



FIRST Ratings

A = Superior Achievement	90-100
B = Above Standard Achievement	80-89
C = Meets Standard Achievement	70-79
F = Substandard Achievement	<70 Or fail any of the critical indicators



Criteria

- 21 total indicators
 - 4 - critical indicators pass/fail
 - 6 - ceiling indicators pass/fail
 - 11 - indicators are measured on a point scale

Indicator #1

Indicator - Was the complete annual financial report (AFR) and data submitted to the TEA within 30 days of the November 27 or January 28 deadline depending on the school district's fiscal year end date of June 30 or August 31 respectively?

Criteria - Pass/Fail

Indicator - Was there an unmodified opinion in the AFR on the financial statements as a whole?

Indicator #3

Indicator - Was the school district in compliance with the payment terms of all debt agreements at fiscal year end?

Criteria - Pass/Fail

Indicator #4

Indicator - Did the school district make timely payments to the Teachers Retirement System (TRS), Texas Workforce Commission (TWC), Internal Revenue Service (IRS), and other government agencies?

Criteria - Pass/Fail

Indicator #5

Indicator - Was the total net position balance in the governmental activities column in the Statement of Net Position (net of accretion of interest for capital appreciation bonds, net pension liability, and other post-employment benefits) greater than zero?

Criteria - Pass/Fail - *If a district fails this indicator, the highest possible rating the district may receive is a C = 79, unless the school district has an increase of students in membership over 5 years of 7% or more or 1,000 or more students in membership. If the school district has such an increase, the maximum points and highest rating the school district may receive is B = 89.*

Score - Passed



Indicator #6

Indicator - Was the average change in (assigned and unassigned) fund balance over 3 years less than a 25% decrease or did the current year's assigned and unassigned fund balance exceed 75 days of operational expenditures.

Criteria - Pass/Fail - *If a district fails this indicator, the highest possible rating the district may receive is a B = 89 points*

Score - Passed



Indicator #7

Indicator - Was the number of days of cash on hand and current investments in the general fund for the school district sufficient to cover operating expenditures (excluding facilities acquisition and construction)?

Criteria - scoring range 0 - 10

Score - 10



Indicator #8

Indicator - Was the measure of current assets to current liabilities ratio for the school district sufficient to cover short-term debt?

Criteria - scoring range 0 - 10

Score - 10



Indicator #9

Indicator - Did the school district's general fund revenues equal or exceed expenditures (excluding facilities acquisition and construction)? If not, was the school district's number of days of cash on hand greater than or equal to 60 days?

Criteria - scoring 0 or 10

Score - 10



Indicator #10

Indicator - Did the school district average less than a 10 percent variance (90% to 110%) when comparing budgeted revenues to actual revenues for the last 3 fiscal years?

Criteria - all districts receive 10 points. This indicator is currently not being scored.

Score - 10



Indicator #11

Indicator - Was the ratio of long-term liabilities to total assets for the school district sufficient to support long-term solvency? If the school district's increase of students in membership over 5 years was 7% or more or 1,000 or more students in membership, then the school district passes this indicator.

Criteria - scoring range 0 - 10

Score - 10



Indicator #12

Indicator - What is the correlation between future debt requirements and the district's assessed property value?

Criteria - scoring range 0 - 10

Score - 4



Indicator #13

Indicator - Was the school district's administrative cost ratio equal to or less than the threshold ratio?

Criteria -scoring range 0 - 10

Score - 10



Indicator #14

Indicator - Did the school district not have a 15 percent decline in the students to staff ratio over 3 years (total enrollment to total staff)? If the student enrollment did not decrease, the school district will automatically pass this indicator.

Criteria - all districts receive 10 points. This indicator is currently not being scored.

Score - 10



Indicator #15

Indicator - Was the school district's ADA within the allotted range of the district's biennial pupil projection(s) submitted to TEA?

Criteria - all districts receive 5 points. This indicator is currently not being scored.

Score - 5



Indicator #16

Indicator - Did the comparison of Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) data to like information in the school district's AFR result in a total variance of less than 3 percent of all expenditures by function?

Criteria - Pass/Fail - *If a district fails this indicator, the highest possible rating the district may receive is a B = 89 points*

Score - Passed



Indicator #17

Indicator - Did the external independent auditor report that the AFR was free of any instance(s) of material weaknesses in internal controls over financial reporting and compliance for local, state, or federal funds and free from substantial doubt about the school district's ability to continue as a going concern?

Criteria - Pass/Fail - *If a district fails this indicator, the highest possible rating the district may receive is a C = 79 points*

Score - Passed



Indicator #18

Indicator - Did the external independent auditor indicate the AFR was free of any instance(s) of material noncompliance for grants, contracts, and laws related to local, state, or federal funds?

Criteria - 0 or 10

Score - 10



Indicator #19

Indicator - Did the school district post the required financial information on its website in accordance with Government Code, Local Government Code, Texas Education Code, Texas Administrative Code, and other statutes, laws, and rules that were in effect at the school district's fiscal year end?

Criteria - 0 or 5

Score - 5



Indicator #20

Indicator - Did the school district's administration and school board members discuss any changes and/or impact to local, state, and federal funding at a board meeting within 120 days before the district adopted its budget?

Criteria - Pass/Fail - *If a district fails this indicator, the highest possible rating the district may receive is a B = 89 points*

Score - Passed



Indicator 21 (new)

Indicator - Did the school district receive an adjusted repayment schedule for more than one fiscal year for an over-allocation of Foundation School Program (FSP) funds because of a financial hardship?

Criteria - Pass/Fail - *If the school district fails this indicator, the maximum points and highest rating the school district may receive is C = 70.*
