Potential Pitfalls

While AI offers valuable learning opportunities, it also presents challenges, particularly with plagiarism. With AI-generated content easily accessible, students may be tempted to use it as their own work, bypassing critical thinking. AI can quickly generate essays or solve math problems, which risks undermining students' intellectual growth and academic integrity.

Reading, writing, and speaking with purpose fosters critical thinking, problem-solving, and intellectual growth. Students and staff enjoyed a day full of Halloween fun including a costume parade, class parties, activities, and many great costumes!




Congratulations to our boys tennis team on advancing to the MHSAA Division 3 State Finals.

THE WITCHES


















FROM THE CLASS OF 1974...
