We are thrilled to announce that four Academy of Arts, Science, and Technology students swept top honors in the ESRI's ArcGIS Online Competition for High School & Middle School Students.

In the state-level competition for South Carolina, AAST'S GIS students dominated the leaderboard. Bailey Baxter took home the top prize and earned the opportunity to represent our state in the national competition. Close behind were Brandon Bernal-Andrade, Nathan Miller, and Kevin Beni, who rounded out the top four placings.

South Carolina's entries were judged by members of the Naval Information Warfare Center (NIWC) Atlantic Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Outreach Program as well as the South Carolina Council on Competitiveness.

Organized annually by ESRI, the world's leading GIS software development company, and the National Council for Geographic Education (NCGE), this competition challenges students across the United States to conduct and share research projects about their home state using ArcGIS Online, a powerful geographic information systems (GIS) platform. Participants must gather, create, analyze, interpret, and present data via an ArcGIS StoryMap, a web-based application that allows users to combine maps, narrative text, images, and multimedia content.
