Tidelands Waccamaw Field Trip


On Thursday and Friday, Mrs. Watson's Pharmacology for Medical Careers Honors students toured Tidelands Waccamaw Hospital and interacted with medical professionals who described what is involved in radiology, medical laboratory, the operating room (including a demonstration of laparoscopic surgical procedures), and inpatient care. Students also learned about current and future career opportunities, the qualities and knowledge necessary for a successful career in healthcare (especially pharmacology knowledge!), and opportunities for professional growth within the Tidelands network.



Guest Speaker: Dr. Kenneth Sembach, Director of the Space Telescope Institute

On Thursday, AAST Students had the honor to meet with Dr. Kenneth Sembach, renowned astronomer and former Director of the Space Telescope Science Institute (STScl), an 800-person multi-mission operations center for NASA's flagship astronomical observatories and a world-class astronomical research center. Dr. Sembach has been deeply involved with the James Webb Space Telescope and the Hubble Telescope operations. Dr. Sembach is a passionate advocate for inspiring the next generation of scientists and explorers. We are grateful to Dr. Sembach for sharing his enthusiasm for the mysteries of space and the joy of exploration.

Dr. Sembach presented to a larger group and then visited classrooms where he engaged with Aerospace Engineering, Advanced Art, and Digital Communications students. Lindsey Beam, Advanced Art student, said, "It was great to learn about the fusion between art and science and how it can be integrated into all walks of life." Ms. Franklin, Advanced Art teacher, added, "When Dr. Sembach came into the art room, he wasn't just a scientist; he was an artist."
