# Marine Science and Clean Energy Visit the Aquarium

AAST's Marine Science and Clean Energy classes visited the Charleston Aguarium. Students made external and internal observations and analyzed tissue samples of two stranded dolphins to determine their cause of death. They also learned ways to help mitigate harmful effects. They visited Clemson's **Dominion Energy Innovation Center** where wind turbines from all over the world are tested. Electrical and mechanical engineers, machinists, and various technicians from all education levels work together with power companies, universities, and government organizations to improve wind turbines and ensure they function efficiently in all

weather conditions and grid types.
