Alumni Spotlight: Mary-Clare Brophy, Class of 2015



After completing her time as an Entertainment Technology major at AAST, Mary-Clare Brophy attended the University of Alabama. There, she began creating videos for Alabama Athletics and the SEC Network. In 2018, she made history as the first woman and student to win a College Sports Media Award. Her academic journey led her to pursue a major in advertising, which eventually led her to Capstone Agency, an in-house student-led Advertising and PR Agency where she founded the creative media department, focusing on photography and videography for local clients.

During this time, she interned at Slingshot LLC, a small advertising agency in Dallas, TX, where she won her first Addy Award. In 2019, she graduated with a bachelor's degree in Arts and began working with South Carolina Athletics, creating sponsored social media content and in-game promotional videos. In late 2021, she relocated to Charlotte, where she created social media content for Movement Mortgage, a small mortgage company that also had a significant impact as a non-profit organization, where she won a Gold Telly Award for her work.

Currently, she is in a new role, creating content for Lowe's Home Improvement.

The above lesson focused on selecting the appropriate tube based on the patient's size and injury, as well as practicing the correct insertion, monitoring, and removal techniques. The students were actively engaged in learning and applying these vital steps for maintaining a stabilized airway.








