- f. <u>SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS</u> Dr. Charles Swensen

Dr. Swensen advised that the 1992/93 budget revote will be held on August 5, 1992 and that the increase had been reduced from \$1.73 per hundred dollars assessed evaluation to \$.90 per hundred dollars. The revised budget includes transportation, athletics, extracurricular activities and educational programs at their present level. Items deleted from the budget include \$300,000 for capital projects, \$100.000 in maintenance costs and \$200,000 in equipment.

Dr. Swensen announced that on June 16th, the Howard Hughes Medical Institute awarded grants to 24 museums throughout the country for Pre-College Science Education Initiative. The Long Island Science Museum was one of the recipients and in consortium with the Black History Museum in Hempstead, the Westbury School District will receive science equipment and direct services to the children four days a week by specialists.

In addition, a grant will be developed for the re-education of elementary and science teachers and its objectives are

to improve credibility for both advanced students and under-motivated students,

to increase the basic knowledge of natural science of elementary school teachers and improve the teaching of science at the elementary level,

to develop a knowledge of research methods to improve laboratory teaching by incorporating on the secondary level the latest techniques in biochemical, cell and molecular biology, and make science relevant by incorporating environmental issues and field research,

to provide mechanisms for the exchange of information in methodology with fellow teachers in similar districts,

and to promote the self-esteem of teachers by giving them recognition and knowledge.

In response to questions raised last month about site-based management, Dr. Swensen reviewed State regulations which will give teachers and parents a greater role in planning and decision making for the purpose of improving instruction. Plans toward this goal are to be developed by February 1, 1994 by the Board of Education in collaboration with a committee consisting of the Superintendent, Administrators, teachers and parents. Some of the areas the plan would address would be to specify the issues that are subject to cooperative planning, the expected level of involvement, the means and standards by which the level of achievement would be evaluated, and the means of coordinating groups between the schools. The Board's role will be to consult with the different groups, adopt a plan by the deadline, and make the plan available to the public. Following its adoption, the district committee will be dissolved and school-based committees will begin to operate. The State will set up further timelines and training sessions for Board members and participants.

With regard to Westbury's status in this direction, Dr. Swensen pointed out that on September 20, 1989, a committee was convened consisting of administrators and teachers for the purpose of determining general parameters for the establishment of building advisory committees. Its function was to formulate procedures and policies regarding building management, and results have been reported regularly at faculty meetings. In conclusion, Dr. Swensen stated that committees were expanded last year to include parents, and this year the district-wide committee will be formulated in conjunction with the Board of Education.

f. SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS - Dr. Charles Swensen

Dr. Swensen reported on the opening of school which, he said, from an educational/learning point of view, began crisply and effectively, with instruction being engaged in from the first day. However, he pointed out that there were problems as a result of begining the year without busing. Regarding arrivals and dismissals, progress has been made, but Dr. Swensen stressed that there is no perfect way to dismiss students when burdened by a heavy flow of traffic.

With regard to attendance, Dr. Swensen said that while 3,000 pupils are enrolled, 2,744 are actually in attendance. Although some discrepancy usually exists in September due to students transferring during the summer, this year's difference appears heavier at Park and Dryden.

Dr. Swensen said that there are problems caused by students arriving more than an hour before the scheduled time, and said that a teacher will be on duty for supervision of these students one hour before and after the closing of the school day. He encouraged parents not to deliver or pick up students before, or after, the designated times.

Dr. Swensen additionally reported that because of the lack of transportation, enrollment for zero period at the Middle School has also dropped.

Measures to ensure students' safety are being addressed with the assistance of the Old Westbury Police Force who oversee the use of the foot bridge at the High School, and additional safety measures are provided by crossing guards supplied by the Third Precinct.

Due to the lack of transportation, some scheduling problems have been experienced at the High School largely the effect of utilizing a new program, but this situation should be rectified by September 18th.

OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PUBLIC TO BE HEARD:

At 8:45 p.m., Mr. Zaino announced that the meeting would be open so that the public would have an opportunity to be heard. He asked that residents and staff limit their remarks to three minutes and stated that this portion of the meeting would be limited to a maximum of one hour. Because the tax levy is fixed in the month of April, the only way to obtain the money to pay for this is to appropriate our reserve unappropriated fund balance which is \$660,000. Normally, a Board of Education uses this as the base to support the budget of the following year. What would normally happen is that the money would stay there for an emergency, and if there was none, that \$660,000 would support the 1993/94 budget. If the money is used, \$660,000 translates to a one dollar increase in the tax rate and, therefore, if this is approved by the Board and the voters, it is guaranteed that the tax rate for next year will go up just less than one dollar.

Regarding the timeline, there are legal requirements for advertising the vote. Therefore, the vote will probably take place the week of October 15. If approved, the starting times of every building will have to be rescheduled. Trans-

portation schedules will them have to be set up for 3,000 students. This preparation and organization will take approximately five weeks.

Dr. Swensen reported that Mr. Robert Gosden, Ass't. Superintendent, Business/Management Services, had resigned. The position has been advertised and many applications have been received. Preliminary interviews will be conducted until November 24th, after which a committee will be formed and interviews held between December 1 and December 10, 1992. The committee will consist of members from the Administrators, Teachers, and Secretarial Units, the PTA, Finance Committee, and a representative from the Business Office, Mr. Neville Mullings. The Chairperson will be Mrs. Van Buren. The committee will recommend three candidates to be interviewed by the Board of Education. Dr. Swensen hopes that a selection and appointment will be made before the Christmas Holidays.

Dr. Swensen also reported on the Communications Workshop which was held on November 6, 7 and 8, 1992, and attended by fifty-one people consisting of parents, administrators and teachers. The workshop was designed to enhance one's power to communicate as an individual and as a member of the team, and one purpose was to develop teams that will be able to function as site-based management teams in the future. An evaluation indicated that 96% of the population in attendance felt that it made a very significant impact on their capacity to communicate.

CALL TO ORDER:

At 8:08 p.m., Mr. Zaino, President, called the meeting to order. He asked the audience to rise to salute the flag and observe a moment of silent meditation.

Mr. Zaino moved the agenda to Commendations.

COMMENDATIONS:

This month the Board honored Josef and Marsy Mittlemann for their efforts and commitment in enhancing the power of communication for the teachers and parents of Westbury.

The Board also honored Mrs. Patricia Gordon and Mrs. Adelaide Brinson, former members of the Board of Education, who, unfortunately, could not be present, for their dedicated service to the children of Westbury.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING:

A motion was made by Mr. DeCiutiis, seconded by Mr. Pascarella, and carried unanimously that the Board approve the minutes of the November 18, 1992 regular meeting of the Board of Education.

INFORMATION:

Committee reports were presented as follows:

Finance Committee - Mr. Robert Troiano, Jr.

Mr. Troiano recalled that at last month's meeting it was suggested that the possibility of District-owned buses be explored. As a result, a sub-committee of the Finance Committee was formed headed by Mr. Frank Maroney.

Mr. Maroney advised that members of the sub-committee are Charlene Berry, Tom Gilmore, Beverly Lucas, and Leonard Pogensky. Other members of the committee are Susan Serlin, Robert Troiano, Jr. and Jan Tegge. Mr. Maroney explained that the committee would do a cost comparison. Options include contracting, as the District presently does, buying and operating our own buses, and buying and hiring an operator. The goal is to achieve cost reduction, and to develop the ability to provide buses even when the budget is defeated. At this time, teams have been formed to meet with three districts whose transportation operations are (a) contracted, (b) district-owned, and (c) a combination of the two. They will also meet with districts that went from school-owned vehicles to a contract operation, or from a contract operation to purchasing its own vehicles. Mr. Maroney invited interested individuals to participate in this study.

Legislative Committee - Mr. Hugo DeCiutiis

Mr. DeCiutiis said that the committee met on Monday with eight or nine members in attendance as well as a representative from Senator Tully's office. The Senator is co-sponsor of a bill which would remove the funding of education from a property tax and base it upon an income tax on a statewide level. A copy of the bill and potential problems was distributed to members of the committee.

In addition, the problems of a disproportionate number of ESL and Special Education students and the financial impact on the District was discussed with the Senator's representative, who was sympathetic.

Facilities Committee - Mrs. Susan Serlin

Mrs. Serlin asked Mrs. Ann Sweat to report on behalf of the Facilities Committee.

Mrs. Sweat said that three members of the committee had inspected the senior high school roof and concluded that it is in need of replacement or repair. The committee also feels that it is essential to have the architectural and engineering study done so that all buildings can be restored to good condition. A member of the committee has suggested that some maintenance be performed by volunteers from the community and student body.

Parents Committee - Dr. Sheila Mayers-Johnson

Dr. Mayers-Johnson reported that the recently held communications workshop was well attended by parents, teachers and administrators. Many ideas were forthcoming from the evaluations and would lend themselves to future workshops. Dr. Mayers-Johnson said that one problem the Parents Committee is wrestling with is coordination with the PTA's and there is some question regarding the respective roles of the Board sponsored Parents Committee and the PTA. This concern will continue to be discussed and clarified, but it is clear that there should be co-sponsorship of activities, according to Dr. Mayers-Johnson.

f. <u>SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS</u> - Dr. Charles Swensen

Dr. Swensen reviewed the problems which occurred due to last Friday's storm. He said that three schools were without light, or heat, or both. Drexel Ave. lost power from approximately 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. due to a tree being struck by lightning. The Middle School lost power at 12:20 p.m. Trees were lost and a garage door was blown out. At the Senior High School, there was a power shutdown at 12:45 p.m. Four trees were lost. Dryden Street maintained power throughout the day, however, two cars belonging to staff members were damaged by a fallen tree. Powell's Lane had power throughout the day. Dr. Swensen said that the major concern was for the safe dismissal of the students, and the decision was made not to dismiss early because of dangerous winds and downed power lines which caused an unsafe environment. Children whose parents work would have returned to an empty house possibly without light and heat. Arrangements were made for children who ordinarily walk home to be bused, and school principals took responsibility for routing children close to their homes. Dr. Swensen thanked and congratulated all staff members for coming together in response to an emergency situation.

Dr. Swensen also reported on three events involving possible leaks at the Middle School. The first was on November 17th after school hours when a gas leak odor was noticed in the art suite on the north side of the building, and LILCO found two small leaks on a gauge outside the building. The fittings were tightened and LILCO determined that there were no other leaks. The second event occurred on November 19th when a strong gas odor was perceived in the same area. School was in session and the building was evacuated, and the Fire Department and LILCO were summoned. LILCO discovered a faulty regulator outside the building which was bypassed and later replaced. When the gas odor dissipated, the Fire Chief permitted the children to return to the building. The third incident occurred on November 25th, and involved the odor of oil in the same area of the building. Again, the Fire Department was called and the building was evacuated. The Fire Department checked the system, found that the odor had dissipated and the children were allowed to re-enter the building. A laboratory determined that the air quality was good, and Bain Industrial Services found no faults in the heating system or lines leading to it. The Board of Health also found the building to be safe.

Dr. Swensen congratulated the Select Choir and Mr. Barrett on their participation in the Kenny Rogers Show at the Westbury Music Fair.





 - Dr. Swensen reported that a recommendation was made at the Facilities meeting to enter into a contract with Honeywell Corp. who analyzed the ventilation system and air controls in the middle school. In December air testing was done at the school by the Nassau County Dept. of Health and Pedneault Associates. Their assessment was that the air quality was safe. However, there was a problem with air quality at the school in the past week and the ventilation system and air quality within the building were tested again. An outside firm was engaged to review and identify any areas of noncompliance with State, Federal, and State Education Department regulations. They will coordinate and review any data from the testings and present a formal report at a public meeting. This past week air quality testing was again conducted by Nassau County Health Dept. and a certified testing lab. A verbal report was received indicating they could find no contaminants within the air. A written report should be submitted in about two weeks. LILCO was called in to pressure test for all natural gas systems and approve all natural gas installations. The middle school is presently using gas only for cooking. The school district is waiting for a final report before gas is utilized again. School staff conducted an internal distribution study which was submitted to the engineers. As soon as all reports are completed the engineering firm will present its findings.
 - Dr. Swensen also reported that a special referendum will take place on April 21, 1993 for approval of an expenditure of \$705,000 to replace the high school roof. The sum will be taken from a roof reserve fund which was established in 1988 as a result of a settlement. This money can only be used for roof repairs or replacement.
 - Dr. Swensen congratulated Mary Fritz, Pre-Kindergarten Director, on being awarded her doctorate degree.

f. <u>SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS</u> - Dr. Charles Swensen

Dr. Swensen thanked Mr. Batkiewicz, the maintenance personnel and custodians for the extraordinary job they did last weekend clearing the school parking lots and walkways, etc. of ice and making the grounds safe for the childrens' arrival.

Dr. Swensen pointed out that Resolution No. 8.1 which is part of the addendum will propose an Affirmative Action Policy and Plan. Dr. Swensen read the policy which states the Westbury Union Free School District is an equal opportunity/affirmative action employer and shall not discriminate against any person because of race, color, religion, sex, age, marital status, national origin, physical handicap, sexual preference, disabled veteran status, or Vietnam-era veterans, except as such conditions may constitute bona fide occupational or assignment qualifications. The District will state its position as an equal opportunity/affirmative action employer throughout all advertisements and job notices. Dr. Swensen reported the date for the annual budget vote will be changed to June 16; the annual budget meeting to June 1 and registration to June 9. These changes were made to give the Board of Education sufficient time to review the budget, review recommendations from administration and to get budget documents in the hands of the taxpayers.

Dr. Swensen also reported that after receiving the report from Lazardos Engineering Associates regarding the Middle School it was agreed that tests would be conducted while the children were in school. These tests were conducted and no excessive levels of carbon monoxide or carbon dioxide were found. In fact the levels were extremely low. The Board has authorized an expenditure of \$600,000 for the reparation, repair/replacement of the ventilation system in the Middle School and also for the development of a new roof on parts of the building. Minor work will begin during the school year as long as it doesn't interfere with the educational program. The major work will be undertaken during the summer.

Dr. Swensen reported the purpose of the referendum being voted on is to authorize the movement of \$705,000 from the reserve fund to the capital fund for the replacement of the high school roof. Also, there is a resolution for a contingent summer school with an expenditure of \$83,115. This will be a limited version of summer school with no provision for driver education and is limited to Westbury residents only. There will be five additional classes for ESL students.

Dr. Swensen reported on a facilities problem that occurred over the Passover/Easter recess in the science room in the high school. The room is being repaired and will be concluded on May 3. Dr. Swensen announced that the Select Choir attended a Disneyland Choral Competition in Orlando, Florida. The Mixed Choir took third place, the Mens Choir took second place and the Womens Choir took third place. Dr. Swensen announced that Michelle Kent has been selected a national merit winner which is a considerable accomplishment.

The proposed budget reflects an approximate \$652,000 increase in employee benefits which includes social security, health insurance, and retirement for school employees. Last year there was \$1,400,000 in the appropriated fund balance. The Board voted in October to spend \$605,000 for transportation and athletics for the 1992-1993 school year. Additionally, in order to make necessary renovations at the Middle School, the Board authorized the expenditure of \$600,000 for these repairs and renovations. The increase in employee benefits, the expenditures for transportation and athletics, and the funds needed to repair our facilities, plus a decrease in revenue, accounts for the 7.4% increase. (Dr. Swensen's statement on tape).

Mr. Gary Betts discussed a detailed overview of the proposed budget, emphasizing the loss of state aid revenue to the district. As far as the state is concerned Westbury School District is a wealthy district. Therefore, based on the state aid formula, Westbury receives less state aid. Mr. Betts explained that, in order to pay for last year's transportation and athletics, the school district had to use \$605,000 from the fund balance. (Mr. Betts' entire statement on tape).
