Mr. Betts reported on the work being done in the Westbury Schools during the summer. This includes the roof at the high school. Bids were awarded on June 23 and a second bid was awarded on July 14. On March 24 the Board authorized an expenditure up to \$600,000. Inspectors were doing a building inspection for structural safety at Powell's Lane School when a problem with the gymnasium wall was detected. On July 14 the Board of Education declared that item a contingent expense and bids were awarded on August 4.

Mr. John Grillo, Architect, and Mr. Louis Costa, Clerk of the Works, reported on the status of the repairs at the middle school, high school and Powell's Lane. The heating and ventilation work is being done at the middle school. The most destructive part is the duct work and that will be done before the start of school. The other work will be started after school starts. Installation of equipment will be done after school hours. The company is making every effort to do the destructive part of the roof work at the high school before school starts and expects to have it done by Friday. The actual roofing will be done within two to three weeks. If everything goes as scheduled it should be done by the end of September or beginning of October. The schedule will be reviewed with administration on a weekly basis. The middle school repairs might have to begin after school starts.

Gary Betts spoke about the considerable delay on the library construction. Problems were developing with contractors. One company went bankrupt. Another company is willing to help Mr. Betts believes that things will begin to happen within the next three weeks. The landscaping has been awarded and a completion date of early September is expected. The construction part is within the two million dollars approved by the taxpayers and that is all that is permitted to be expended from the taxpayers fund. If the library expends additional funds they will have to use library dollars.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS - Dr. Robert D. Pinckney

Dr. Pinckney reported that Gary Betts, Assistant Superintendent for Business/Management Services, has resigned effective November 28, 1993. Resumes and credentials of candidates for this position have been received and Mrs. Van Buren will be setting up the committees, including groups from the community, to interview these candidates. He has promised to do what he can in the area of the pre-kindergarten program. We have approximately 40 students on a waiting list. Senator Tully indicated he will look into the area of mandated programs. Hopefully, the state will recognize the unfairness of mandating programs without attaching the necessary monies to fund them.

BOARD OF EDUCATION:

Dr. Pinckney added that Senator Tully asked us to write him with additional information regarding the pre-kindergarten program. This has been done. He also asked us to share with him our needs and concerns regarding computerization. A document has been prepared that will be reviewed tomorrow and forwarded to Senator Tully to see if the school district can get some other kinds of monies to assist us with the purchasing of technology. The committee received sincere concerns from Senator Tully and hopefully it will be successful.

Mr. DeCiutiis reported that the legislative committee which includes Mrs. Sweat, Mr. Credenza, Mrs. Henderson, and others met with Assemblyman Levine and Assemblywoman Ferrara's representative. The committee reviewed some of the things discussed with Senator Tully including the funding operation. The major focus was on the basic formula and the disproportionate formula that hurts Westbury. Westbury has been the recipient of the second lowest aid percentage on Long Island.

BOARD OF EDUCATION:

Dr. Mayers-Johnson brought the community up to date regarding the activities of the Board 6 Education. The Board has been preoccupied with the various crises that occurred in the school district during the past school year. Over the last few weeks, the Board, in conjunction with the financial committee, has been receiving reports from the principals and administrators regarding their budget requests for the 1994-1995 school year. Recently a Board workshop was conducted by ER&M consulting firm. The Board is presently looking at ways it can formulate plans that will involve the community in order to see the direction in which the school district will go.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Mrs. Frances Van Buren reported the school district has been looking at what grant monies may be available to the district. Although the position of full time grant writer was eliminated, administration has continued to seek ways to get grant money for the district. They spoke about several grants they feel would be beneficial to the Westbury School District. Mr. Kikoler explained they have been writing federal grants for the last ten years and have successfully written many competitive programs. Over the last year they have written magnet school grants for New York City school districts. Although the magnet school grant would not be good for the Westbury School District, they

believe there are many grants that are. Of the seven grants awarded to New York City they were involved in five of them. Their firm has successfully written Bilingual and Even Start grants. Title 7, which is a transitional bilingual program, (children learn their subject matter in their native language and in English) is a good source of funds for the school district. The Even Start program is another good source of funds. This program has three parts - early childhood education, adult basic education for parents, and parenting education. When applying for these grants the school district must include an assurance that they are supplementing their programs; not supplanting their programs. If the school district is not awarded the grant, Mr. Kikoler said their firm will keep on writing the grant until they get it. The firm charges \$10,000 for each grant written. Many of the grants run from three to five years. There has not been a client that has not been awarded grant money for programs they have written.

Dr. Pinckney reported the district will be setting up an educational summit for late April or early May. Information will be circulated to the community. The purpose and intent of this educational summit is to bring a cross section of the community together to get a sense of what the community wants. The community speaks about change and transition. Dr. Pinckney hopes this summit will be the beginning of that change and direction. He said he is now ready to involve some radical changes for the school district. He will have more details at the April planning session.

Dr. Pinckney reported the proposed 1994-1995 budget is a bare bones budget which begins to address our children's needs that have not been met in many years. It is focused towards preparing our students for the challenges they will face in the 21st century. At this time the school district does not know how much state aid it will receive. It is known that it will be more than last year because the total state aid dollars throughout the state will be higher. There is more money in the treasury for school aid for 1994-1995. The government has increased monies for pre-kindergarten and transportation. There is additional aid for those children eligible for free and reduced lunch, and also for the Limited English Proficiency population.

Mr. Gerard Dougherty, Assistant Superintendent for Business & Management Services, reported there were additional state aid dollars for school districts for 1994-1995. Overall, the state is going to put more money back into education. The Westbury School District will receive a better share. Mr. Dougherty presented a breakdown of the proposed budget for 1994-1995 which included an overview of the difference between the 1993-1994 budget and this year's budget. Overall, there is a 3.89% increase. Mr. Dougherty spoke about the mandated costs and explained the school district had purchased equipment only on an emergency basis over the past two years since it was on austerity. The additional positions listed on the proposed budget represents positions that are very necessary, given the needs of today's children; e.g., a part-time social worker's and part-time psychologist's position has been increased to full time positions. A kindergarten teacher and an ESL teacher position has been added. It is anticipated there will be 100 additional students in the Westbury School District for the 1994-1995 school year. This increased number of students should trigger more aid to the district. The areas that account for the increases in the proposed budget are the contractual obligations, the small number of new teaching positions, equipment, and maintenance. Mr. Dougherty also presented an overview of the tax rate and a revenue estimate for 1994-1995.

BOARD OF EDUCATION:

Dr. Sheila Mayers-Johnson congratulated Dr. Pinckney for the Educational Summit that was held on Saturday. She expressed some concerns as to the direction the school district is going. The Educational Summit was a positive beginning. This week the budget hearing was held and Dr. Mayers-Johnson thanked Mr. Dougherty for the presentation he made at the meeting. The community has been burdened with taxes and there are many issues the district is struggling with. Dr. Mayers-Johnson requested that Mr. Dougherty present to the Board at the next meeting an austerity budget based on mandated restrictions. It would be useful to look at what would be pulled out on an austerity budget. Dr. Mayers-Johnson discussed several concerns with the school district including the issues of guardianship and what is required to establish residency in the Westbury U.F.S.D. She also discussed the problem with the high school bleachers with regards to what may meet industry standards might not necessarily be up to standard for students. Another concern was the health and safety of the environment in the middle school. She feels we need to acknowledge the problems that exist in the school district and "roll up our sleeves".
