Dr. Dodson asked to make a statement. He said that when he agreed to seek election to the School Board there were a few things he thought he could do to make a difference. One was communication. He expressed his frustration as to what is evident in where we are educationally at this point. He has not seen the improvement he wanted. Dr. Dodson said he has not seen any improvement in the area of allocation of funds. He would like to see an effort made not to do business as usual relative to staffing and the educational curriculum. Dr. Dodson spoke about resolutions 9.7 and 9.8 - Approval of Handicapped Accessibility/Administration Building, Bid No. 95-11 and Approval of Handicapped Accessibility/Park Ave. School Bid No. 95-11. He questioned the urgency of these projects at this time when we are talking about the needs of the students. He doesn't know if you can make a case that the computers we want to purchase can come under health and safety. He believes if you have the experts look at the instruments that are twenty years old we might determine that there are some microwaves or other problems that are not in the best interest of the children and that they may eventually harm the children. Dr. Dodson said they have talked about building a new science facility. The present science facility was built in 1958 and, to Dr. Dodson's knowledge, nothing has been done to update it. He believes that we could make a case of health and safety for the instruments we have. He is trying to change the mind set of policymaking in this district. Dr. Dodson said that somebody may say no, you can't do that, but he feels we should not be satisfied until we make an effort. He remembers going through this before with another handicapped project. Everytime he goes to the Middle School auditorium he sees what amounts to wasted money. He questioned how often we have used the lift that is in the corner of the stage? Dr. Dodson said he doesn't have any problems with providing facilities for the handicapped person, but he would like the district to start thinking along priority lines. He asked what can we do with the money that would most benefit the students? Dr. Dodson said he is still smarting about taking apart what he thought were very functional bleachers and rebuilding them. That money could have been transferred somewhere else as far as he is concerned. He said we put up one set of bleachers, took that set down, and put them up again, and we still don't know actually the cost of that. He has not seen an itemized list. We have a statement from the person in charge that they were done according to industry standards, but we have not seen those specifications. Dr. Dodson asked to please think about what we are doing for the children and pointed out we are approaching a 40 million dollar budget. He said every time we get ready to do something for the children we go with our hands out and depend on whether we can get a grant or not. He doesn't know if a case can be made, but he thinks an effort should be advanced along those areas.
