Dr. Clark spoke about the condition of the school buildings. Each building requires repair, renovation and expansion in order to maintain a safe and productive learning environment. She noted that expanded classroom space will reduce the average class size and enable the District to provide a full day kindergarten program.

Also noted in the presentation, the State will pay nearly half the costs of the bond. Because the additional aid is temporary, such a high rate of reimbursement may not be available in the future. The anticipated interest rate is between 4 and 4.5%. The School District would pay back the bond over the next 20 years at a low rate.

She reported that the Governor's proposed budget includes a \$1.2 Billion cut in state aid that will shift more costs to the local property taxpayer. The proposed budget includes the elimination of Universal Pre-K which funds the current Westbury program at the Dryden Street School. Special Education aid is frozen at the 2002-2003 level and Class Size Reduction aid will be lost. Dr. Clark noted the Operational Increases (Retirement Systems, Health Insurance Premiums and Operations and Maintenance).

In her presentation, Dr. Clark reported on the capital improvement projects, programs and services implemented during the 2002-2003 school year. She noted the total amount of \$7,038,544 received in grant funding for the 2002-2003 school year and spoke about what is not in the 2003-2004 proposed budget due to State Aid cuts. The 2003-2004 budget priorities based on District goals and objectives are full day Kindergarten/part time Pre-K (limited based on State Aid), maintain current programs and services in all areas and provide programs for Special Needs students.

Mrs. Mary Lagnado, Assistant Superintendent for Business & Management Services, presented an overview of the proposed 2003-2004 budget (\$61,440,542) – a 6.38% increase in the amount of \$3,919,675. Mrs. Lagnado noted the difference in the proposed vs. contingent budget is \$11 per year.


