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MESSAGE FROM SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Big Red Community,

As we approach the end of the first six-week grading period of the new school year, I'd like to take a moment to reflect on the incredible journey we've undertaken together and express my gratitude for your hard work and dedication. I want to extend my heartfelt appreciation to our students for their commitment to learning. Your curiosity, enthusiasm, and dedication is inspiring.

BISD plans for improvement on an annual basis. The 2023-24 campus objectives were adopted by the Board of Trustees during their September 18 meeting. The campus objectives align to BISD's goals and key progress measures. Identifying critical action steps that support the district goals – and holding ourselves accountable to them – keeps our district focused and striving for continuous improvement.



I want to let you know, last week our Board approved a resolution indicating our intention to join a lawsuit directed at the Texas Education Agency (TEA). We are joining this lawsuit because the TEA and Education Commissioner Mike Morath violated state law when they missed key deadlines in changing the state accountability system.

The Board of Trustees has been advocating for accountability reform since last October when they approved our Legislative Priorities. Trustees and staff met with lawmakers throughout the Legislative Session and specifically asked local representatives to address the TEA's lack of transparency and thoughtful leadership in the accountability system changes. BISD also sent a letter to our representatives and senator in March outlining our concern on this topic and proposed solutions. No solutions were reached during the legislative session and TEA took no action to address their inadequate plan. Our decision to join the lawsuit continues our advocacy efforts on this topic.

Regardless of the actions of the TEA, Belton ISD remains focused on providing exceptional learning experiences for each and every student. This commitment was exemplified last week when Lake Belton High School student Shrey Gupta was named a National Merit Semifinalist. Principal Steele Hantgin and I were there to congratulate him when he found out he was receiving this tremendous achievement. Shrey is among 16,000 high school students nationwide to be named a 2024 National Merit Semifinalist. The Big Red Community is incredibly proud of him.

One of the best things about BISD is our supportive community. I thank our parents and guardians, because your involvement in your child's education is so meaningful to ensure their success.
